SUMMARY—Directs the Legislative Commission to appoint an interim committee to study the behavioral health workforce in this State. (BDR R-105)

ASSEMBLY CONCURRENT RESOLUTION—Directing the Legislative Commission to appoint an interim committee to conduct a study concerning the behavioral health workforce in this State.

WHEREAS, This State is currently experiencing a shortage of behavioral health professionals; and

WHEREAS, This State currently ranks near the bottom in the United States for access to behavioral health care and has relatively high prevalence of mental illness; and

WHEREAS, The lack of treatment options for behavioral health conditions has a negative impact on patients, the communities in which they live and the quality of living in this State; and

WHEREAS, A thorough legislative study of issues relating to the development of the workforce for behavioral health professionals is needed in order to develop solutions to improve access to behavioral health care for the people of this State; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, THE SENATE CONCURRING, That the Legislative Commission is hereby directed to appoint a committee to conduct an interim study of strategies and policy options to address the shortage of behavioral health professionals in this State, which is composed of:

- 1. Two voting members nominated by the Majority Leader of the Senate, one of whom must be a member of the Senate Standing Committee on Health and Human Services;
- 2. Two voting members nominated by the Speaker of the Assembly, one of whom must be a member of the Assembly Standing Committee on Health and Human Services;
- 3. One voting member nominated by the Minority Leader of the Senate;
- 4. One voting member nominated by the Minority Leader of the Assembly;
- 5. One nonvoting member nominated by the Administrator of the Division of Public and Behavioral Health of the Department of Health and Human Services to represent the Division;
- 6. One nonvoting member nominated by the Nevada Counseling Association, or its successor organization, who is a school counselor with experience working in an elementary, middle, junior high or high school; and
- 7. One nonvoting member nominated by the Administrator of the Division of Public and Behavioral Health of the Department of Health and Human Services who is a behavioral health professional; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Legislative Commission shall designate two of the voting members appointed to the committee to serve as the Chair and Vice Chair, respectively, of the committee; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the committee shall consult with and solicit input and recommendations from persons, entities and organizations with expertise in matters relevant to behavioral health, including, without limitation:

- 1. The Office of Statewide Initiatives of the University of Nevada, Reno, School of Medicine, including, without limitation, the Nevada Office of Rural Health established by NRS 396.906 and the Area Health Education Center Program established by NRS 396.907;
 - 2. Institutions of higher education;
- 3. The Office of Science, Innovation and Technology in the Office of the Governor;
- 4. The Division of Public and Behavioral Health of the Department of Health and Human Services;
 - 5. Each regional behavioral health policy board in this State created by NRS 433.429;
 - 6. The Board of Psychological Examiners, the Board of Medical Examiners, the State Board of Osteopathic Medicine, the Board of Examiners for Marriage and Family Therapists and Clinical Professional Counselors, the Board of Examiners for Social





Workers, the Board of Examiners for Alcohol, Drug and Gambling Counselors and the Board of Applied Behavior Analysis;

- 7. Behavioral health professionals and facilities that provide behavioral health services, including, without limitation, certified community behavioral health clinics, entities that provide behavioral health services to persons with low incomes and hospitals;
- 8. Professional associations for behavioral health professionals, including, without limitation, the Nevada Chapter of the National Association of Social Workers;
- 9. Nonprofit organizations and other community-based organizations; and
- 10. Representatives of health insurers who have expertise in behavioral health; and be it further

RESOLVED, That in performing the study, the committee shall:

- 1. Collect and review data relating to behavioral health professionals currently practicing in this State, including, without limitation, demographics and geographic distribution of those behavioral health professionals;
- 2. Collect and review data relating to the provision of behavioral health services using telehealth in this State and consider methods to expand the use of telehealth to supplement current behavioral health services;
- 3. Identify gaps in access to behavioral health services and the types of behavioral health professionals for which the demand for services does not match the supply of those professionals;
- 4. Identify existing initiatives for and barriers to developing an adequate workforce for behavioral health care;
- 5. Evaluate the system of educating behavioral health professionals in this State;
- 6. Identify efforts and opportunities to introduce students in high school, college and graduate school to careers in behavioral health, connect students interested in such a career with resources and mentors and encourage such students to pursue careers in behavioral health, while focusing on students who reside in underserved areas of this State; and
- 7. Consider methods to attract students and professionals in behavioral health to this State and to train and retain those persons; and be it further

RESOLVED, That any recommended legislation proposed by the committee must be approved by a majority of the members of the Senate and a majority of the members of the Assembly appointed to the committee; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Legislative Commission submit a report of the results of the study and any ratified recommendations for legislation to the Legislative Committee on Health Care and the
