## SENATE BILL NO. 106–SENATOR KIECKHEFER

## PREFILED JANUARY 28, 2019

Referred to Committee on Finance

SUMMARY—Revises provisions relating to required expenditures by schools on certain school supplies. (BDR 34-243)

EXPLANATION - Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to education; authorizing a school district, charter school or university school for profoundly gifted pupils to request a reduction in the required minimum amount that the district or school is required to expend on certain supplies in certain circumstances; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

## Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law requires the Department of Education, in consultation with the 234567 Budget Division of the Office of Finance and the Fiscal Analysis Division of the Legislative Counsel Bureau, to develop or revise, as applicable, a formula for determining the minimum amount of money that each school district, charter school and university school for profoundly gifted pupils is required to expend each fiscal year for textbooks, instructional supplies, instructional software and instructional hardware. (NRS 387.206) Section 1 of this bill authorizes a school district, charter 8 school or university school for profoundly gifted pupils to request from the 9 Department a reduction of that required minimum amount when it obtains 10 textbooks, instructional supplies, instructional software or instructional hardware 11 that is available free of charge. If the amount of the request is reasonable, the 12 Department is required to provide the reduction. Section 2 of this bill requires the 13 Department to provide notice to a school district, charter school or university 14 school for which such a reduction in expenditures is approved of the revised 15 amount of money that the school district, charter school or university school is 16 required to expend for textbooks, instructional supplies, instructional software and 17 instructional hardware for the fiscal year.





## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 387 of NRS is hereby amended by adding 2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3 1. The board of trustees of a school district, the governing 4 body of a charter school or the governing body of a university school for profoundly gifted pupils that obtains textbooks, 5 instructional supplies, instructional software or instructional 6 7 hardware free of charge may submit to the Department a written 8 request on a form prescribed by the Department to reduce the 9 amount of money that the school district, charter school or 10 university school is required to expend for textbooks, instructional supplies, instructional software and instructional hardware 11 12 pursuant to NRS 387.206 for the fiscal year. The request must include, without limitation, the amount of the requested reduction 13 14 in expenditures as determined by the board of trustees or 15 governing body based on the amount that the school district, 16 charter school or university school would otherwise pay to 17 purchase comparable textbooks, instructional supplies, 18 instructional software or instructional hardware.

19 2. Upon receipt of a written request pursuant to subsection 1, 20 the Department shall determine whether the amount of the 21 reduced expenditure is reasonable. The Department may request 22 any additional information it deems necessary from the applicant 23 to determine whether the request is reasonable. If the Department 24 determines that the amount of the request:

(a) Is reasonable, the Department shall reduce the amount that
the school district or school is required to expend on textbooks,
instructional supplies, instructional software or instructional
hardware pursuant to NRS 387.2062 for the fiscal year by the
requested amount.

30 (b) Is not reasonable, the Department shall deny the request 31 and inform the board of trustees of the school district, the 32 governing body of the charter school or the governing body of the 33 university school for profoundly gifted pupils of its determination 34 as soon as practicable.

35 3. Any textbooks, instructional supplies, instructional 36 software or instructional hardware obtained free of charge that 37 are the subject of a request pursuant to subsection 1 must be:

(a) Aligned with any applicable standards of content and
performance established by the Council to Establish Academic
Standards for Public Schools pursuant to NRS 389.520; and

41 (b) Selected in accordance with any requirements of state law 42 or regulation, including, without limitation, NRS 389.850, if



1 applicable, and any policies established by the board of trustees of

2 the school district, the governing body of the charter school or the

Sec. 2. NRS 387.206 is hereby amended to read as follows:

6 387.206 1. On or before July 1 of each year, the Department, 7 in consultation with the Budget Division of the Office of Finance 8 and the Fiscal Analysis Division of the Legislative Counsel Bureau, 9 shall determine the combined minimum amount of money required to be expended during that fiscal year for textbooks, instructional 10 supplies, instructional software and instructional hardware by all 11 12 school districts, charter schools and university schools for 13 profoundly gifted pupils. The amount must be determined by 14 increasing the amount that was established for the Fiscal Year 2004-15 2005 by the percentage of the change in enrollment between Fiscal 16 Year 2004-2005 and the fiscal year for which the amount is being 17 established, plus any inflationary adjustment approved by the Legislature after Fiscal Year 2004-2005. 18

19 2. The Department, in consultation with the Budget Division of 20 the Office of Finance and the Fiscal Analysis Division of the 21 Legislative Counsel Bureau, shall develop or revise, as applicable, a 22 formula for determining the minimum amount of money that each 23 school district, charter school and university school for profoundly 24 gifted pupils is required to expend each fiscal year for textbooks, 25 instructional supplies, instructional software and instructional 26 hardware. The sum of all of the minimum amounts determined 27 pursuant to this subsection must be equal to the combined minimum 28 amount determined pursuant to subsection 1. The formula must be 29 used only to develop expenditure requirements and must not be used 30 to alter the distribution of money for basic support to school 31 districts, charter schools or university schools for profoundly gifted 32 pupils.

33 Upon approval of the formula pursuant to subsection 2, the 3. Department shall provide written notice to each school district, 34 35 charter school and university school for profoundly gifted pupils 36 within the first 30 days of each fiscal year that sets forth the required 37 minimum combined amount of money that the school district, charter school and university school for profoundly gifted pupils 38 must expend for textbooks, instructional supplies, instructional 39 40 software and instructional hardware for that fiscal year. If a school district, charter school or university school for profoundly gifted 41 42 pupils is granted a waiver pursuant to NRS 387.2065 [] or is 43 allowed to reduce its expenditures pursuant to section 1 of this act, 44 the Department shall provide written notice to the school district, 45 charter school or university school within 30 days after the Interim
