## Referred to Committee on Government Affairs

SUMMARY—Revises provisions relating to businesses engaged in the development of emerging technologies. (BDR 18-447)

EXPLANATION - Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to technology; creating the Emerging Technologies Task Force within the Department of Business and Industry; prescribing the membership, powers and duties of the Task Force; authorizing the Director of the Department to create an Opportunity Center for Emerging Technology Businesses as part of the Office of Business Finance and Planning of the Department; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

#### Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Sections 2-8 of this bill provide for an Emerging Technologies Task Force within the Department of Business and Industry. Section 6 of this bill creates the 234567 Task Force and prescribes its membership. Section 7 of this bill designates the Chair of the Task Force and prescribes the minimum frequency of its meetings and the number of members required to constitute a quorum. Section 8 of this bill requires the Task Force to develop certain strategies and make certain recommendations with regard to: (1) attracting to this State businesses that are 8 engaged in the development of emerging technologies; and (2) encouraging the ġ growth of such businesses. Section 8 also requires the Task Force to submit a 10 report of its findings and recommendations annually to the Governor, the Director 11 of the Department and the Legislature. Section 9 of this bill makes a conforming 12 change to indicate the proper placement of sections 2-8 in the Nevada Revised 13 Statutes.

Existing law authorizes the Director of the Department of Business and Industry to create an Office of Business Finance and Planning within the Department for administering, coordinating and improving access to programs to assist in the growth and retention of business and industry in this State and to provide certain information to the public. (NRS 232.522) Section 10 of this bill





19 authorizes the Director to create an Opportunity Center for Emerging Technology

20 Businesses as part of the Office of Business Finance and Planning, if that office is

- 21 22 created, to advocate for, assist and support the growth of businesses engaged in the
- development of emerging technologies.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 232 of NRS is hereby amended by adding 2 thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 to 8, inclusive, of this 3 act.

4 Sec. 2. As used in sections 2 to 8, inclusive, of this act, unless 5 the context otherwise requires, the words and terms defined in sections 3, 4 and 5 of this act have the meanings ascribed to them 6 7 in those sections.

8 Sec. 3. "Blockchain" has the meaning ascribed to it in 9 NRS 719.045.

"Emerging technologies" means any technologies Sec. 4. 10 that are of a unique type or that have a unique scope of 11 application and would provide a benefit to the economy of this 12 State if developed, used or produced by businesses in this State. 13 The term includes, without limitation, blockchain technology, 14 autonomous technology, the Internet of things, robotics and 15 artificial intelligence. 16

17 Sec. 5. "Task Force" means the Emerging Technologies 18 Task Force created by section 6 of this act.

19 Sec. 6. 1. The Emerging Technologies Task Force is 20 *hereby created within the Department.* 

- 21 2. The Task Force consists of:
- 22 (a) The Director:

(b) The Commissioner of Financial Institutions or his or her 23 24 designee;

25 (c) The Director of the Department of Employment, Training 26 and Rehabilitation or his or her designee;

27 (d) One member who is a representative of the Office of the 28 Attorney General, appointed by the Attorney General;

29 (e) One member who is a representative of the Office of 30 Economic Development, appointed by the Executive Director of 31 the Office of Economic Development;

32 (f) One member who is a representative of the Nevada System of Higher Education, appointed by the Board of Regents of the 33 34 University of Nevada;

(g) One member who is a teacher at a Title I school in a large 35 school district, appointed by an organization that represents 36 *licensed educational personnel within the school district;* 37





1 (h) One member who is a representative of K-12 public 2 education, appointed by the Nevada State Education Association;

3 (i) One member who has experience as a consumer advocate,
4 appointed by the Director; and

5 (j) At least one member who has knowledge, skill and 6 experience in emerging technologies, appointed by the Director.

7 3. The Director may appoint as many additional members to 8 the Task Force who have knowledge, skill and experience in 9 emerging technologies as the Director deems necessary to carry 10 out the duties of the Task Force.

11 4. In appointing the members of the Task Force described in 12 subsections 2 and 3, the appointing authorities shall coordinate 13 the appointments to the extent practicable so that the members of 14 the Task Force:

(a) Represent the diversity of this State, including, without
limitation, the age, gender, sexual, ethnic, geographic and
socioeconomic diversity of this State; and

18 (b) Include persons with behavioral health conditions and 19 persons who have served or are serving in the military.

5. The term of each appointed member of the Task Force is 3
years. Such a member may be reappointed to the Task Force and
any vacancy must be filled in the same manner as the original
appointment.

6. The members of the Task Force serve without compensation, except that each member is entitled, while engaged in the business of the Task Force and within the limits of available money, to receive the per diem allowance and travel expenses provided for state officers and employees generally.

29 7. A member of the Task Force who is an officer or employee 30 of this State or a political subdivision of this State must be relieved from his or her duties without loss of regular compensation so that 31 32 the member may prepare for and attend meetings of the Task 33 Force and perform any work necessary to carry out the duties of the Task Force in the most timely manner practicable. A state 34 agency or political subdivision of this State shall not require an 35 officer or employee who is a member of the Task Force to make 36 37 up the time he or she is absent from work to carry out his or her duties as a member of the Task Force or use annual vacation or 38 compensatory time for the absence. 39

40 8. The Director shall provide the personnel, facilities, 41 equipment and supplies required by the Task Force to carry out 42 the provisions of sections 2 to 8, inclusive, of this act.

43 **9**. As used in this section:





1 (a) "Large school district" has the meaning ascribed to it in 2 NRS 388G.530.

3 (b) "Title I school" has the meaning ascribed to it in 4 NRS 385A.040.

Sec. 7. 1. The Director is the Chair of the Task Force.

6 2. The members of the Task Force shall meet at least once 7 each quarter at the call of the Chair. The Task Force shall 8 prescribe procedures for its own management and government.

9 3. A majority of the members of the Task Force constitutes a 10 quorum, and a quorum may exercise all the powers conferred on 11 the Task Force.

12 Sec. 8. 1. The Task Force shall:

(a) Develop concrete strategies to ensure that this State
 remains a leader in technological innovation by attracting
 businesses engaged in the development of emerging technologies.

16 (b) Make recommendations for streamlining process, 17 regulatory, structural and other barriers a business engaged in the 18 development of emerging technologies may face in relocating to or 19 expanding operations in this State.

20 (c) Identify opportunities to develop leading practices and 21 standards that will support the growth of businesses engaged in 22 the development of emerging technologies.

23 (d) Address methods to comprehensively incorporate
24 blockchain technology into all levels of government.

(e) Recommend concrete steps to develop a workforce with
technical expertise in emerging technologies, including, without
limitation, prioritizing the employment of persons who are
unemployed as a result of a pandemic, a natural disaster or an act
of terrorism and persons who are 40 years of age or older.

30 (f) Solicit input from persons and organizations with expertise 31 in emerging technologies.

(g) On or before February 1 of each year, prepare and submit
 a report to the Governor, the Director of the Department and the
 Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau for transmittal to the
 Legislature concerning its findings and recommendations.

36 2. The Task Force may apply for any available grants and
37 accept any gifts, grants or donations to assist the Task Force in
38 carrying out its duties pursuant to this section.

39 3. As used in this section, "act of terrorism" has the meaning 40 ascribed to it in NRS 202.4415.

**Sec. 9.** NRS 232.505 is hereby amended to read as follows:

42 232.505 As used in NRS 232.505 to 232.866, inclusive, *and* 43 *sections 2 to 8, inclusive, of this act,* unless the context requires 44 otherwise:

2. "Director" means the Director of the Department.

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6 1. Create within the Department, as part of the Office of the 7 Director, an Office of Business Finance and Planning to:

8 (a) Administer and coordinate programs related to financing for 9 the assistance of entities engaged in business and industry in this 10 state;

(b) Provide information to the public concerning the regulatory
 programs, assistance programs, and other services and activities of
 the Department; and

14 (c) Interact with other public or private entities to coordinate and 15 improve access to the Department's programs related to the growth 16 and retention of business and industry in this state.

2. Create within the Department, as part of the Office of
Business Finance and Planning, *if that office is created*, a Center for
Business Advocacy and Services:

(a) To assist small businesses in obtaining information about
 financing and other basic resources which are necessary for success;

(b) In cooperation with the Executive Director of the Office of Economic Development, to increase public awareness of the importance of developing manufacturing as an industry and to assist in identifying and encouraging public support of businesses and industries that manufacture goods in this state;

(c) To serve as an advocate for small businesses, subject to the
supervision of the Director or the Director's representative, both
within and outside the Department;

(d) To assist the Office of Business Finance and Planning in
establishing an information and referral service within the
Department that is responsive to the inquiries of business and
industry which are directed to the Department or any entity within
the Department; and

(e) In cooperation with the Executive Director of the Office of
Economic Development, to advise the Director and the Office of
Business Finance and Planning in developing and improving
programs of the Department to serve more effectively and support
the growth, development and diversification of business and
industry in this state.

9 (c) To serve as an advocate for businesses engaged in the development of emerging technologies, subject to the supervision 10 11 of the Director or the Director's representative, both within and 12 outside the Department:

13 (d) To assist the Office of Business Finance and Planning in 14 establishing an information and referral service within the Department that is responsive to the inquiries of businesses 15 16 engaged in the development of emerging technologies which are 17 directed to the Department or any entity within the Department.

18 (e) To collaborate with businesses engaged in the development emerging technologies, persons and organizations with 19 of expertise in emerging technologies, public and private entities and 20 21 other interested stakeholders to promote:

22 (1) The integration of emerging technologies in the private 23 sector and at all levels of government; and

24 (2) The employment of persons who are unemployed as a 25 result of a pandemic, a natural disaster or an act of terrorism and 26 persons who are 40 years of age or older; and

27 (f) In cooperation with the Executive Director of the Office of 28 Economic Development, to advise the Director and the Office of 29 Business Finance and Planning in developing and improving programs of the Department to serve more effectively and support 30 the growth, development and diversification of businesses engaged 31 32 in the development of emerging technologies in this State.

33 Require divisions, offices, commissions, boards, agencies or 4. other entities of the Department to work together to carry out their 34 35 statutory duties, to resolve or address particular issues or projects or 36 otherwise to increase the efficiency of the operation of the Department as a whole and the level of communication and 37 38 cooperation among the various entities within the Department. 39

As used in this section: 5.

(a) "Act of terrorism" has the meaning ascribed to it in 40 NRS 202.4415. 41

42 (b) "Emerging technologies" has the meaning ascribed to it in 43 section 4 of this act.





Sec. 11. The provisions of subsection 1 of NRS 218D.380 do not apply to any provision of this act which adds or revises a requirement to submit a report to the Legislature.
Sec. 12. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2021.
