

SENATE BILL NO. 121—COMMITTEE ON NATURAL RESOURCES

(ON BEHALF OF THE COMMITTEE ON
HIGH-LEVEL RADIOACTIVE WASTE)

SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing the Commission on Nuclear Projects. (BDR 40-250)

AN ACT relating to hazardous materials; revising the scope of the duties of the Commission on Nuclear Projects; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law establishes the Commission on Nuclear Projects and imposes
2 certain duties on the Commission relating to the potential disposal of radioactive
3 waste in this State and the location of a facility for the disposal of radioactive waste
4 in this State. (NRS 459.009-459.0092) This bill revises the definition of
5 “radioactive waste” to include high-level radioactive waste, low-level radioactive
6 waste, transuranic waste, spent nuclear fuel and certain other radioactive materials,
7 thereby expanding the scope of the duties of the Commission as such duties pertain
8 to the potential disposal of radioactive waste in this State.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 459.0092 is hereby amended to read as
2 follows:

3 459.0092 **1.** The Commission shall:

4 **H-1 (a)** Be informed on issues and developments relating to the
5 disposal of radioactive waste.



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1 [2.] (b) Report to the Governor and the Legislature on any
2 matter relating to the disposal of radioactive waste which it deems
3 appropriate and on any such matter requested by the Governor.

4 [3.] (c) Advise and make recommendations to the Governor and
5 the Legislature on the policy of this State concerning all projects
6 involving the disposal of radioactive waste.

7 [4.] (d) Formulate the administrative policies of the Agency and
8 its divisions.

9 [5.] (e) Advise the state and local governments on litigation
10 relating to radioactive waste.

11 [6.] (f) Adopt such regulations and perform such other duties as
12 are necessary to carry out the provisions of NRS 459.009 to
13 459.0098, inclusive.

14 **2. As used in this section, “radioactive waste” means
15 radioactive material, including, without limitation:**

16 (a) High-level radioactive waste;

17 (b) Low-level radioactive waste;

18 (c) Transuranic waste;

19 (d) Spent nuclear fuel;

20 (e) Any radioactive material resulting from, or a by-product of,
21 the nuclear fuel cycle, the reprocessing of spent nuclear fuel or
22 nuclear weapons reprocessing; and

23 (f) Any other radioactive material that the Nuclear Regulatory
24 Commission determines must be permanently isolated.

25 ↳ The term includes, without limitation, radioactive material that
26 is a solid, semisolid, liquid or contained gas, or any combination
27 thereof.

28 **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2011.
