SUMMARY—Creates the Advisory Council on Nevada Wildlife Conservation and Education within the Department of Wildlife. (BDR 45-616)

EXPLANATION - Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to wildlife; creating the Advisory Council on Nevada Wildlife Conservation and Education within the Department of Wildlife; prescribing the membership and duties of the Council; authorizing the Department to fund the activities of the Council from the Wildlife Heritage Trust Account; requiring the Board of Wildlife Commissioners to maintain a list of qualified candidates for appointment to the Council; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law provides for the management of wildlife in this State, including 1 23456789 the regulation of hunting, fishing, trapping and the taking of game. (Title 45 of NRS) Section 3 of this bill creates the Advisory Council on Nevada Wildlife Conservation and Education within the Department of Wildlife and prescribes the composition of the members of the Council. Section 5 of this bill requires the Council, in cooperation with the Department, to develop and implement a public information program for the purpose of promoting and educating the general public on the history and benefits of wildlife and wildlife preservation in this State, and the importance of hunting, fishing, trapping and the taking of game in this State. Section 5 further requires the Council to prepare an operational plan to meet the 10 11 future goals of the Council and to report certain information to the Director of the 12 Department and the Board of Wildlife Commissioners. Sections 6, 9.3 and 9.7 of 13 this bill authorize the Department to fund the activities of the Council from the 14 Wildlife Heritage Trust Account. Section 8 of this bill requires the Board of





15 Wildlife Commissioners to maintain a list of qualified candidates for appointment 16 to the Council.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 501 of NRS is hereby amended by adding 2 thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 to 6, inclusive, of this 3 act. Sec. 2. "Council" means the Advisory Council on Nevada 4 Wildlife Conservation and Education created by section 3 of this 5 6 act. 7 Sec. 3. 1. There is hereby created within the Department the Advisory Council on Nevada Wildlife Conservation and 8 Education. The Council consists of the following seven members: 9 (a) A representative of the Department, designated by the 10 **Director:** and 11 (b) The following members to be appointed by the Director 12 with the advice of the Chair of the Commission: 13 14 (1) One member of the Commission or his or her designee; (2) Three residents of this State who are selected from the 15 list of candidates compiled pursuant to subsection 9 of 16 NRS 501.181; 17 (3) One resident of this State who represents small 18 businesses that are substantially affected by hunting, fishing and 19 20 trapping in this State; and 21 (4) One resident of this State who is not an employee of the Department and who has a background in media or marketing 22 23 sufficient to advise the Council in carrying out its duties pursuant to section 5 of this act. 24 2. The Director shall, to the extent practicable, ensure that 25 the membership of the Council represents all geographic areas of 26 27 this State. 28 3. After the initial terms, each member of the Council appointed pursuant to paragraph (b) of subsection 1 serves a term 29 30 of 4 years. 4. A vacancy in the appointed membership of the Council 31 must be filled in the same manner as the original appointment for 32 the remainder of the unexpired term. 33 5. An appointed member of the Council may be reappointed, 34 but must not serve more than two full terms. 35 6. Each member of the Council: 36 37 (a) Serves without compensation; and





1 (b) While engaged in the business of the Council, is entitled to 2 receive the per diem allowance and travel expenses provided for 3 state officers and employees generally.

4 7. The Director may remove any appointed member of the 5 Council for good cause.

Sec. 4. 1. At the first meeting of the Council, the Council 6 shall elect from its members a Chair, a Vice Chair and a 7 Secretary, and shall adopt the policies of the Council. Upon the 8 expiration of the term of an officer elected pursuant to this 9 10 subsection, the Council shall, at the next subsequent meeting of the Council, elect an officer to fill the vacated position. 11

The Council shall meet at least once each calendar quarter 12 2. 13 and at other times upon the call of the Chair or a majority of its 14 *members*.

15 3. A majority of the members of the Council constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business, and a quorum may 16 17 exercise any power or authority conferred on the Council.

18 4. Meetings of the Council must be conducted in accordance 19 with chapter 241 of NRS.

5. Except as otherwise provided by specific statute, the 20 documents and other information compiled by the Council in the 21 22 course of its business are public records.

Sec. 5. 1. Subject to approval by the Director, the Council 23 24 shall, in cooperation with the Department:

25 (a) Develop and implement, in collaboration with a marketing or advertising agency, a comprehensive media-based public 26 27 information program to educate the general public on the history of wildlife in Nevada, the benefits of wildlife to its citizens and the 28 benefits of wildlife management and wildlife recreational 29 30 opportunities in Nevada. The program must promote the essential 31 role that sportsmen and sportswomen play in furthering wildlife conservation in this State and must include, without limitation. 32 education to teach that hunting, fishing, trapping and the taking 33 34 of game are:

(1) Necessary for the conservation, preservation and 35 management of the natural resources of this State; 36

37 (2) A valued and integral part of the cultural heritage of 38 this State that must forever be preserved; and 39

(3) An important part of the economy of this State.

(b) Not later than 120 days after the Council's first meeting of 40 41 each year, prepare an operational plan with strategic goals and milestones in furtherance of the duties of the Council. 42

43 (c) Prepare a request for proposals for the purpose of selecting 44 a marketing or advertising agency.





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1 (d) Establish criteria for grading and selecting a marketing or advertising agency based on the submission of proposals. 2

3 (e) Conduct surveys for the purpose of developing a marketing campaign and determining the effectiveness of a campaign. 4

2. Subject to approval by the Director, the Council shall 5 6 review and approve each annual budget for the Council and 7 review any periodic financial reports provided by the Department that are related to the activities of the Council. 8

9 The Council shall, on or before December 31 of each 3. 10 even-numbered year, prepare a report to the Director and the Commission outlining the public information program 11 implemented and the operational plan prepared pursuant to 12 13 subsection 1 and the expenditures of the Council.

14 Sec. 6. 1. The activities of the Council must be funded by 15 allocations of money from the Wildlife Heritage Trust Account 16 that are made in accordance with the provisions of subsection 4 of 17 NRS 501.3575.

18 2. The Director and the Council may apply for and accept 19 any available grants and may accept any bequests, devises, donations or gifts from any public or private source to fund the 20 21 activities of the Council.

22 3. Any money described in subsections 1 and 2 must be used 23 for the activities of the Council and accounted for separately. 24 *Except as otherwise provided by law or by the terms of any grant,* 25 bequest, devise, donation or gift, any money remaining in the Account at the end of a fiscal year does not revert to the State 26 27 General Fund and must be carried over to the next fiscal year. 28

Sec. 7. NRS 501.001 is hereby amended to read as follows:

29 501.001 As used in this title, unless the context otherwise 30 requires, the words and terms defined in NRS 501.003 to 501.097, 31 inclusive, and section 2 of this act have the meanings ascribed to 32 them in those sections.

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Sec. 8. NRS 501.181 is hereby amended to read as follows:

501.181 The Commission shall:

1. Establish broad policies for:

(a) The protection, propagation, restoration, transplanting, 36 37 introduction and management of wildlife in this State.

38 (b) The promotion of the safety of persons using or property 39 used in the operation of vessels on the waters of this State.

(c) The promotion of uniformity of laws relating to policy 40 41 matters.

42 2. Guide the Department in its administration and enforcement 43 of the provisions of this title and of chapter 488 of NRS by the 44 establishment of such policies. 45

3. Establish policies for areas of interest including:





1 (a) The management of big and small game mammals, upland 2 and migratory game birds, fur-bearing mammals, game fish, and 3 protected and unprotected mammals, birds, fish, reptiles and 4 amphibians.

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(b) The control of wildlife depredations.

6 (c) The acquisition of lands, water rights and easements and 7 other property for the management, propagation, protection and 8 restoration of wildlife.

9 (d) The entry, access to, and occupancy and use of such 10 property, including leases of grazing rights, sales of agricultural 11 products and requests by the Director to the State Land Registrar for 12 the sale of timber if the sale does not interfere with the use of the 13 property on which the timber is located for wildlife management or 14 for hunting or fishing thereon.

(e) The control of nonresident hunters.

(f) The introduction, transplanting or exporting of wildlife.

17 (g) Cooperation with federal, state and local agencies on wildlife 18 and boating programs.

(h) The revocation of licenses issued pursuant to this title to any
person who is convicted of a violation of any provision of this title
or any regulation adopted pursuant thereto.

4. Establish regulations necessary to carry out the provisions of this title and of chapter 488 of NRS, including:

24 (a) Seasons for hunting game mammals and game birds, for 25 hunting or trapping fur-bearing mammals and for fishing, the daily 26 and possession limits, the manner and means of taking wildlife, 27 including, but not limited to, the sex, size or other physical 28 differentiation for each species, and, when necessary for 29 management purposes, the emergency closing or extending of a season, reducing or increasing of the bag or possession limits on a 30 31 species, or the closing of any area to hunting, fishing or trapping. 32 The regulations must be established after first considering the 33 recommendations of the Department, the county advisory boards to manage wildlife and others who wish to present their views at an 34 35 open meeting. Any regulations relating to the closure of a season 36 must be based upon scientific data concerning the management of 37 wildlife. The data upon which the regulations are based must be 38 collected or developed by the Department.

39 (b) The manner of using, attaching, filling out, punching,40 inspecting, validating or reporting tags.

41 (c) The delineation of game management units embracing 42 contiguous territory located in more than one county, irrespective of 43 county boundary lines.

44 (d) The number of licenses issued for big game and, if 45 necessary, other game species.



5. Adopt regulations requiring the Department to make public, before official delivery, its proposed responses to any requests by federal agencies for its comment on drafts of statements concerning the environmental effect of proposed actions or regulations affecting public lands.

6. Adopt regulations:

7 (a) Governing the provisions of the permit required by NRS 8 502.390 and for the issuance, renewal and revocation of such a 9 permit.

10 (b) Establishing the method for determining the amount of an 11 assessment, and the time and manner of payment, necessary for the 12 collection of the assessment required by NRS 502.390.

7. Designate those portions of wildlife management areas for
big game mammals that are of special concern for the regulation of
the importation, possession and propagation of alternative livestock
pursuant to NRS 576.129.

17 8. Adopt regulations governing the trapping of fur-bearing 18 mammals in a residential area of a county whose population is 19 100,000 or more.

20 9. Maintain a list of qualified candidates for appointment to the Council that is compiled from recommendations by any 21 Nevada sportsmen's organization. The Commission shall not 22 include a person on the list of candidates unless the person has 23 been a resident of this State for at least 5 years and has held a 24 hunting, fishing or trapping license, or any combination of such 25 licenses, in this State for at least 3 of the immediately preceding 5 26 27 vears.

6 4. For the period beginning on July 1, 2015, and ending on 7 June 30, 2019, to fund the activities of the Council, the 8 Department may annually expend from the principal of the 9 Wildlife Heritage Trust Account:

10 (a) Not more than \$250,000; and

(b) In addition, an amount of money not greater than 25
 percent of the amount of money deposited in the Account pursuant
 to subsection 2 during the previous year.

5. The Department may annually expend from the Wildlife Heritage Trust Account an amount of money not greater than 75 percent of the money deposited in the Account pursuant to subsection 2 during the previous year and the total amount of interest earned on the money in the Account during the previous year. [The]

6. Except for expenditures made pursuant to subsection 4, the
Commission shall review and approve expenditures from the
Account [. No], and no money may be expended from the Account
without the prior approval of the Commission.

24 [5.] 7. The Commission shall administer the provisions of this 25 section and may adopt any regulations necessary for that purpose.
