SUMMARY—Creates the Council on Food Security and the Food for People, Not Landfills Program. (BDR 18-57)

AN ACT relating to public health; creating the Council on Food Security within the Department of Health and Human Services; prescribing the membership and duties of the Council; creating the Food for People, Not Landfills Program; authorizing the Director of the Department of Health and Human Services to adopt regulations to carry out the Program; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

In 2014, the Governor established by executive order the Council on Food Security. (Executive Order 2014-03 (2-12-2014)) The Council was charged with various responsibilities related to the implementation of the goals of the "2013 Food Security in Nevada: Nevada's Plan of Action" issued by the Department of Health and Human Services ("the Plan") and the improvement of the quality of life and health of persons in this State by increasing food security throughout the State.





7 **Section 7** of this bill creates the Council in statute and prescribes its membership, 8 which includes ex officio members and members appointed by the Governor and 9 the Director of the Department of Health and Human Services at the direction of 10 the Governor. Section 8 of this bill authorizes the Chair of the Council to appoint 11 subcommittees to study issues within the scope of the duties of the Council. 12 Section 9 of this bill prescribes the duties of the Council, which include: (1) various 13 responsibilities related to implementation of the Plan; (2) advising the Governor on matters related to food security; (3) advising, assisting and making recommendations to the Director for the administration of the Food for People, Not 14 15 16 Landfills Program; and (4) submitting an annual report to the Director and the 17 Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau regarding the accomplishments and 18 recommendations of the Council.

19 Section 10 of this bill creates the Food for People, Not Landfills Program $\tilde{20}$ within the Department of Health and Human Services for the purposes of 21 22 23 24 25 26 increasing food security by decreasing food waste, redirecting excess consumable food to a higher and better purpose and recognizing and assisting persons who further those purposes. In administering the program, the Director of the Department is required to: (1) set forth goals and objectives for the ensuing 5 years to increase the amount of food diverted from landfills and utilize such food to increase food security; (2) establish criteria for a food donor to participate in the 27 27 28 29 Program; (3) create an official seal for the Program and allow a participant to use the official seal; (4) take any other action the Director deems necessary to assist a participant in the Program in furthering the goals of the Program; and (5) submit an $\overline{30}$ annual report to the Legislature concerning the Program. Section 10 authorizes the 31 Director to adopt regulations based upon the recommendations of the Council to 32 carry out the Program.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 232 of NRS is hereby amended by adding 2 thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 to 10, inclusive, of this 3 act.

4 Sec. 2. As used in sections 2 to 10, inclusive, of this act, 5 unless the context otherwise requires, the words and terms defined 6 in sections 3 to 6, inclusive, of this act have the meanings ascribed 7 to them in those sections.

8 Sec. 3. "Council" means the Council on Food Security 9 created by section 7 of this act.

10 Sec. 3.5. "Food donor" means a person or entity, including, 11 without limitation, a restaurant, grocery store or retail or 12 wholesale business, that gives or otherwise provides food, directly 13 or indirectly, to persons in need of food.

14 Sec. 4. "Food security" means the ability of a person to 15 access enough food for an active and healthy life.

16 Sec. 5. "Plan" means the "2013 Food Security in Nevada: 17 Nevada's Plan for Action" issued by the Department of Health 18 and Human Services.





Sec. 6. "Program" means the Food for People, Not Landfills 1 2 **Program created by section 10 of this act.** 3 Sec. 7. 1. The Council on Food Security is hereby created 4 within the Department. The Council consists of: 5 (a) The Governor or his or her designee; (b) The Director or his or her designee from within the 6 7 **Department**; (c) The Administrator of the Division of Welfare and 8 9 Supportive Services of the Department or his or her designee from within the Division; 10 (d) The Regional Administrator for the Western Regional 11 12 Office of the United States Department of Agriculture, Food and 13 Nutrition Service or his or her designee from within the United 14 States Department of Agriculture; (e) The Executive Director of the Office of Economic 15 Development or his or her designee from within the Office; 16 17 (f) The Administrator of the Division of Public and Behavioral Health of the Department or his or her designee from within the 18 19 **Division**: 20 (g) The Superintendent of Public Instruction or his or her 21 designee from within the Department of Education; 22 (h) The Director of the State Department of Agriculture or his 23 or her designee from within the Department; (i) The Administrator of the Aging and Disability Services 24 25 Division of the Department or his or her designee from within the 26 **Division**: 27 (j) Five members appointed by the Governor as follows: 28 (1) One member who is a representative of retailers of food; 29 (2) One member who is a representative of manufacturing 30 that is not related to food; (3) One member who is a representative of the gaming 31 32 industry, hospitality industry or restaurant industry; (4) One member who is a representative of farmers or 33 ranchers engaged in food production; and 34 35 (5) One member who is a representative of persons engaged in the business of processing or distributing food; 36 37 (k) At least five members appointed by the Governor or the Director at the direction of the Governor from among the 38 39 following persons: (1) A person who is a representative of a food bank serving 40 41 *northern* Nevada; 42 (2) A person who is a representative of a food bank serving 43 southern Nevada; 44 (3) A person who is a representative of an organization that 45 provides community-based services, including, without limitation,





1 services that focus on the social determinants of health, in 2 northern Nevada;

3 (4) A person who is a representative of an organization that 4 provides community-based services, including, without limitation, 5 services that focus on the social determinants of health, in 6 southern Nevada;

7 (5) A person who is a representative of an organization that 8 provides community-based services, including, without limitation, 9 services that focus on the social determinants of health, in rural 10 Nevada;

11 (6) A person who is a representative of the University of 12 Nevada Cooperative Extension;

13 (7) A person who possesses knowledge, skill and experience 14 in the provision of services to senior citizens and persons with 15 disabilities;

16 (8) A person who is a representative of a local health 17 authority; and

(9) A person who possesses knowledge, skill and experience
 in the provision of services to children and families; and

20 (1) Such other representatives of State Government as may be 21 designated by the Governor.

22 2. The Governor or his or her designee shall serve as the 23 Chair of the Council.

3. Each appointed member of the Council serves a term of 2
years. Each appointed member may be reappointed at the pleasure
of the appointing authority, except that an appointed member may
not serve for more than three consecutive terms or 6 consecutive
years.

29 4. If a vacancy occurs in the appointed membership of the 30 Council, the Council shall recommend a person to the appointing authority who appointed that member to fill the vacancy. The 31 32 appointing authority shall appoint a replacement member after 33 receiving and considering the recommendation of the Council. A member appointed to fill a vacancy shall serve as a member of the 34 Council for the remainder of the original term of appointment and 35 may be reappointed for two additional consecutive terms through 36 37 the regular appointment process.

38 5. The appointing authority may remove a member for 39 malfeasance in office or neglect of duty. Absences from three 40 consecutive meetings constitutes good and sufficient cause for 41 removal of a member.

42 6. Each member of the Council:

43 (a) Serves without compensation; and





1 (b) While engaged in the business of the Council, is entitled to 2 receive the per diem allowance and travel expenses provided for 3 state officers and employees generally.

4 7. The Department of Health and Human Services shall 5 provide administrative support to the Council.

6 8. The Council shall meet at least once each calendar quarter 7 and may meet at such further times as deemed necessary by the 8 Chair.

9 9. The Council may apply for and accept gifts, grants, 10 donations and contributions from any source for the purpose of 11 carrying out its duties pursuant to section 9 of this act.

12 Sec. 8. 1. The Chair of the Council on Food Security 13 created by section 7 of this act may appoint subcommittees 14 composed of members of the Council, former members of the 15 Council and members of the public who have relevant experience 16 or knowledge to consider specific problems or other matters that 17 are related to and within the scope of the functions of the Council.

18 2. A subcommittee appointed pursuant to subsection 1 must 19 not contain more than five members. To the extent practicable, the 20 members of such a subcommittee must be representative of the 21 various geographic areas and ethnic groups of this State.

22 Sec. 9. The Council on Food Security created by section 7 of 23 this act shall:

24 1. Develop, coordinate and implement a food system that will:
25 (a) Partner with initiatives in economic development and
26 social determinants of health;

27 (b) Increase access to improved food resource programs;

(c) Increase participation in federal nutrition programs by
 eligible households; and

30 (d) Increase capacity to produce, process, distribute and 31 purchase food in an affordable and sustainable manner.

32 2. Hold public hearings to receive public comment and to 33 discuss issues related to food security in this State.

34 3. Serve as a clearinghouse for the review and approval of 35 any events or projects initiated in the name of the Plan.

36 **4.** Review and comment on any proposed federal, state or 37 local legislation and regulation that would affect the food policy 38 system of this State.

39 5. Advise and inform the Governor on the food policy of this 40 State.

6. Review grant proposals and alternative funding sources as
requested by the Director to provide recommendations for funding
the Plan.

44 7. Develop new resources related to the Plan.





1 8. Advise, assist and make recommendations to the Director 2 for the creation and administration of the Program.

9. On or before January 31 of each year submit an annual
report to the Director and the Director of the Legislative Counsel
Bureau concerning the accomplishments and recommendations of
the Council concerning food security.

7 Sec. 10. 1. The Food for People, Not Landfills Program is 8 hereby established within the Department for the purposes of 9 increasing food security by decreasing food waste, redirecting 10 excess consumable food to a higher and better purpose and 11 recognizing and assisting food donors who further those purposes.

12 2. The Director shall administer the Program. In 13 administering the Program, the Director shall:

(a) Set forth goals and objectives for the ensuing 5 years to
increase the amount of food diverted from landfills and utilize
such food to increase food security;

17 (b) Establish the criteria for eligibility for a food donor to 18 participate in the Program;

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(c) Create an official seal for the Program;

20 (d) Allow a food donor who participates in the Program to 21 display or otherwise use the official seal of the Program; and

(e) Take any other actions as the Director deems necessary to
 assist a food donor who participates in the Program to further the
 goals and objectives set forth pursuant to paragraph (a).

3. A person shall not use, copy or reproduce the official seal
of the Program created pursuant to subsection 2 in any way not
authorized by this section.

4. The Director may, based upon the recommendations of the
 Council pursuant to section 9 of this act, adopt regulations to
 carry out the provisions of this section.

5. On or before January 31 of each year, the Director shall submit to the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau for transmittal to the Legislature a report concerning the accomplishments of the Program and the impact of the Program on food security in this State.

Sec. 11. NRS 232.290 is hereby amended to read as follows:

232.290 As used in NRS 232.290 to 232.4858, inclusive, and
 sections 2 to 10, inclusive, of this act, unless the context requires
 otherwise:

40 1. "Department" means the Department of Health and Human41 Services.

42 2. "Director" means the Director of the Department.

43 **Sec. 12.** Notwithstanding the provisions of section 7 of this 44 act, the Council on Food Security created by the Governor by 45 executive order on February 12, 2014, shall be deemed to be the





Council on Food Security established pursuant to section 7 of this act until the appointing authorities appoint the members of the

Council on Food Security pursuant to section 7 of this act. Sec. 12.5. The provisions of subsection 1 of NRS 218D.380 do not apply to any provision of this act which adds or revises a requirement to submit a report to the Legislature.

- Sec. 13. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2019.
