SUMMARY—Revises provisions relating to catalytic converters.
(BDR 15-37)

EXPLANATION – Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets ~~omitted material~~ is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to catalytic converters; prohibiting certain acts relating to used catalytic converters under certain circumstances; establishing requirements relating to transactions involving used catalytic converters; providing penalties; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel’s Digest:

1 **Section 2** of this bill provides that a person commits the offense of theft of a
2 catalytic converter if the person willfully takes or attempts to take possession of,
3 carries away or exercises control over a catalytic converter with the intent to
4 deprive the rightful owner of the catalytic converter. **Section 2** also provides that a
5 person commits the offense of possession of a catalytic converter if the person
6 possesses two or more used catalytic converters unless the person is licensed or
7 authorized to possess a used catalytic converter.

8 **Section 3** of this bill prohibits a person from purchasing a used catalytic
9 converter from any person other than: (1) a licensed automobile wrecker; (2) a
10 licensed scrap metal processor; (3) a licensed motor vehicle manufacturer,
11 distributor, dealer or rebuilder; (4) any other business that may reasonably generate,
12 possess or sell used catalytic converters; or (5) a person who possesses certain
13 documentation that proves the person is the lawful owner or possessor of the used
14 catalytic converter.

15 **Section 4** of this bill provides that a person who violates any provision of
16 **section 2 or 3** is guilty of: (1) a category E felony, if the violation involves one
17 used catalytic converter; (2) a category D felony, if the violation involves 2 or
18 more, but less than 10, used catalytic converters; and (3) a category C felony, if the
19 violation involves 10 or more used catalytic converters.

20 Existing law provides certain restrictions on the sale and purchase of scrap
21 metal in this State and includes a catalytic converter in the definition of the term
22 "scrap metal." (NRS 647.017, 647.092-647.098) **Section 12** of this bill excludes a
23 used catalytic converter from the definition of scrap metal.

24 **Section 8** of this bill prohibits a licensed scrap metal processor from purchasing
25 or receiving a used catalytic converter from any person other than certain licensed
26 businesses or a person possessing certain documentation that proves the person is
27 the lawful owner or possessor of the used catalytic converter.

28 Existing law requires scrap metal processors to maintain certain records of
29 purchases of scrap metal. (NRS 647.092-647.098) **Section 9** of this bill requires
30 scrap metal processors to maintain certain additional information if the scrap metal
31 processor purchases a used catalytic converter from certain licensed businesses or a
32 person who has documentation that proves the person is the lawful owner or
33 possessor of the used catalytic converter. **Section 9** also requires a scrap metal
34 processor to: (1) maintain certain records of all used catalytic converters the scrap
35 metal processor sells to another scrap metal processor; (2) maintain certain records
36 related to used catalytic converters for a period of 2 years; and (3) make certain
37 records related to used catalytic converters available to law enforcement upon
38 demand.

39 Existing law authorizes a local law enforcement agency to establish an
40 electronic reporting system, or to utilize an existing electronic reporting system, to
41 receive information relating to the purchase of scrap metal by a scrap metal
42 processor that transacts business within the jurisdiction of the local law
43 enforcement agency. If a law enforcement agency establishes or uses such a
44 system, existing law requires each scrap metal processor that transacts business
45 within the jurisdiction of the local law enforcement agency to submit to the local
46 law enforcement agency certain information relating to each purchase of scrap
47 metal from certain persons. (NRS 647.0945) **Section 14** of this bill requires each
48 scrap metal processor to submit electronically to the local law enforcement agency
49 certain additional information if the scrap metal processor purchases a used
50 catalytic converter.

51 **Section 10** of this bill prohibits a scrap metal processor from providing
52 payment for a used catalytic converter to a seller unless: (1) the payment is made by
53 check or through an electronic transfer of money cleared through an automated
54 clearinghouse; (2) the seller is a person described in **section 8**; and (3) the scrap
55 metal processor obtains certain information, including, without limitation, a
56 statement written by the seller indicating from whom the seller obtained the used
57 catalytic converter. **Section 10** provides for an exception to these requirements for a
58 scrap metal processor who holds a certain written agreement with the seller before
59 purchasing a used catalytic converter.

60 **Section 15** of this bill provides that a person who violates any provision of
61 **sections 8-10** is guilty of a misdemeanor. **Section 15** authorizes a court to also
62 issue an injunction prohibiting the person from engaging in the business of a scrap
63 metal processor. **Section 15** also provides that a scrap metal processor who is a
64 natural person and who knowingly violates **section 8** or sells a used catalytic
65 converter that the scrap metal processor knows or should know is stolen is guilty of
66 a felony, punishable by a penalty that is similar to the penalties set forth in
67 **section 4**.

68 **Sections 6 and 7** of this bill define the terms "permanently marked" and "used
69 catalytic converter," respectively, for the purpose of provisions governing scrap



70 metal processors. **Section 11** of this bill makes a conforming change to indicate the
71 proper placement of **sections 6 and 7** in the Nevada Revised Statutes.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 202 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
2 thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2, 3 and 4 of this act.

3 **Sec. 2. 1.** *A person commits the offense of theft of a*
4 *catalytic converter if the person willfully takes or attempts to take*
5 *possession of, carries away or exercises control over a used*
6 *catalytic converter with the intent to deprive the rightful owner of*
7 *the catalytic converter.*

8 **2.** *A person commits the offense of possession of a catalytic*
9 *converter if the person possesses two or more used catalytic*
10 *converters unless the person is:*

11 *(a) An automobile wrecker licensed pursuant to NRS 487.070;*

12 *(b) A scrap metal processor licensed pursuant to NRS 647.092*
13 *who maintains a fixed place of business and has obtained the used*
14 *catalytic converter in accordance with the provisions of NRS*
15 *647.094 and 647.098;*

16 *(c) A motor vehicle manufacturer, distributor, dealer or*
17 *rebuilder licensed pursuant to NRS 482.325;*

18 *(d) Any other business that may reasonably generate, possess*
19 *or sell used catalytic converters; or*

20 *(e) A person possessing documentation that proves the person*
21 *is the lawful owner or possessor of the used catalytic converter,*
22 *including, without limitation, a certificate of title or registration*
23 *that identifies the person as the legal or registered owner of the*
24 *vehicle from which the used catalytic converter was removed and*
25 *which includes a vehicle identification number that matches the*
26 *vehicle identification number permanently marked on the used*
27 *catalytic converter.*

28 **3.** *As used in this section:*

29 *(a) "Permanently marked" has the meaning ascribed to it in*
30 *section 6 of this act.*

31 *(b) "Used catalytic converter" has the meaning ascribed to it*
32 *in section 7 of this act.*

33 **Sec. 3. 1.** *A person shall not purchase a used catalytic*
34 *converter for any purpose, including, without limitation, to*
35 *dismantle, recycle or smelt, unless the person purchases the used*
36 *catalytic converter from:*

37 *(a) An automobile wrecker licensed pursuant to NRS 487.070;*

38 *(b) A scrap metal processor licensed pursuant to NRS 647.092*
39 *who maintains a fixed place of business and has obtained the used*



1 *catalytic converter in accordance with the provisions of NRS*
2 *647.094 and 647.098;*

3 *(c) A motor vehicle manufacturer, distributor, dealer or*
4 *rebuilder licensed pursuant to NRS 482.325;*

5 *(d) Any other business that may reasonably generate, possess*
6 *or sell used catalytic converters; or*

7 *(e) A person possessing documentation that proves the person*
8 *is the lawful owner or possessor of the used catalytic converter,*
9 *including, without limitation, a certificate of title or registration*
10 *that identifies the person as the legal or registered owner of the*
11 *vehicle from which the used catalytic converter was removed and*
12 *which includes a vehicle identification number that matches the*
13 *vehicle identification number permanently marked on the used*
14 *catalytic converter.*

15 **2. As used in this section:**

16 *(a) "Permanently marked" has the meaning ascribed to it in*
17 *section 6 of this act.*

18 *(b) "Used catalytic converter" has the meaning ascribed to it*
19 *in section 7 of this act.*

20 **Sec. 4. A person who violates any provision of section 2 or 3**
21 **of this act is guilty of:**

22 **1. If the violation involves one used catalytic converter, a**
23 **category E felony and shall be punished as provided in**
24 **NRS 193.130.**

25 **2. If the violation involves 2 or more, but less than 10, used**
26 **catalytic converters, a category D felony and shall be punished as**
27 **provided in NRS 193.130.**

28 **3. If the violation involves 10 or more used catalytic**
29 **converters, a category C felony and shall be punished as provided**
30 **in NRS 193.130.**

31 **Sec. 5. Chapter 647 of NRS is hereby amended by adding**
32 **thereto the provisions set forth as sections 6 to 10, inclusive, of this**
33 **act.**

34 **Sec. 6. "Permanently marked" means prominently engraved,**
35 **etched, welded, metal-stamped, acid-marked or otherwise**
36 **permanently displayed using a similarly reliable method of**
37 **imparting a lasting mark on the exterior case of a used catalytic**
38 **converter.**

39 **Sec. 7. "Used catalytic converter" means a catalytic**
40 **converter or any part thereof that has been previously installed on**
41 **a vehicle and has been removed. The term does not include a**
42 **reconditioned or refurbished catalytic converter being sold at**
43 **retail.**

44 **Sec. 8. A person who is authorized to purchase or otherwise**
45 **receive a used catalytic converter pursuant to subsection 1 of**



1 *NRS 647.0172 shall not purchase or otherwise receive a used*
2 *catalytic converter for any purpose, including, without limitation,*
3 *to dismantle, recycle or smelt, unless the person purchases or*
4 *receives the used catalytic converter from:*

5 1. *An automobile wrecker licensed pursuant to NRS 487.070;*

6 2. *A scrap metal processor licensed pursuant to NRS 647.092*
7 *who maintains a fixed place of business and has obtained the used*
8 *catalytic converter in accordance with the provisions of NRS*
9 *647.094 and 647.098;*

10 3. *A motor vehicle manufacturer, distributor, dealer or*
11 *rebuilder licensed pursuant to NRS 482.325;*

12 4. *Any other business that may reasonably generate, possess*
13 *or sell used catalytic converters; or*

14 5. *A person possessing documentation that proves the person*
15 *is the lawful owner or possessor of the used catalytic converter,*
16 *including, without limitation, a certificate of title or registration*
17 *that identifies the person as the legal or registered owner of the*
18 *vehicle from which the used catalytic converter was removed and*
19 *which includes a vehicle identification number that matches the*
20 *vehicle identification number permanently marked on the used*
21 *catalytic converter.*

22 **Sec. 9. 1.** *Except as otherwise provided in subsections 2*
23 *and 3, every scrap metal processor shall maintain in his or her*
24 *place of business a book or other permanent record in which must*
25 *be made, at the time of each purchase of a used catalytic*
26 *converter, a record of the purchase that contains:*

27 (a) *The place and date of the purchase.*

28 (b) *The name of the seller and the seller's valid driver's license*
29 *number or valid identification card number and the state of issue.*

30 (c) *A general description of the vehicle delivering the used*
31 *catalytic converter, including, without limitation, the state of the*
32 *registration of the vehicle.*

33 (d) *A description of the used catalytic converter purchased,*
34 *including, without limitation, the item type, quantity and vehicle*
35 *identification number of the used catalytic converter.*

36 (e) *A description of the vehicle from which the used catalytic*
37 *converter was removed, including, without limitation:*

38 (1) *The year, make, model and vehicle identification*
39 *number of the vehicle; and*

40 (2) *If applicable, a copy of the title of the vehicle which*
41 *includes a vehicle identification number that matches the vehicle*
42 *identification number permanently marked on the used catalytic*
43 *converter.*

44 (f) *A statement written by the seller indicating:*



1 (1) That the seller is the lawful owner or possessor of the
2 used catalytic converter; or

3 (2) The name of the person from which the seller obtained
4 the used catalytic converter, including, if applicable, the name of
5 the business as shown on a signed transfer document.

6 (g) The price paid by the scrap metal processor for the used
7 catalytic converter.

8 (h) If the seller is a business entity, other than a scrap metal
9 processor:

10 (1) The seller's physical business address;

11 (2) The seller's business telephone number; and

12 (3) The seller's business license number or tax
13 identification number of the business.

14 2. A scrap metal processor who purchases a used catalytic
15 converter from a business entity that holds a written agreement
16 with another business that sells used catalytic converters for
17 recycling purposes is required to maintain in his or her place of
18 business a book or other permanent record in which must be
19 made, at the time of each purchase, a record of the purchase that
20 contains:

21 (a) The name of the seller or agent acting on behalf of the
22 seller.

23 (b) The seller's physical business address and business
24 telephone number.

25 (c) The seller's business license number or tax identification
26 number.

27 (d) The date and place of the transaction.

28 (e) The number of used catalytic converters received in the
29 course of the transaction.

30 (f) The amount of money that was paid for each used catalytic
31 converter in the course of the transaction.

32 (g) A copy of the written agreement.

33 3. A scrap metal processor who sells a used catalytic
34 converter to another scrap metal processor shall maintain in his or
35 her place of business a book or other permanent record in which
36 must be made, at the time of each sale, a record of the sale that
37 contains:

38 (a) The name and address of each person to whom each used
39 catalytic converter is sold.

40 (b) The number of used catalytic converters being sold.

41 (c) The amount of money that was received for each used
42 catalytic converter sold in the transaction.

43 (d) The date and place of the transaction.

44 4. All records kept pursuant to subsections 1, 2 and 3 must be
45 kept and maintained for not less than 2 years.



1 5. *All used catalytic converters purchased by the scrap metal*
2 *processor and the records made and maintained in accordance*
3 *with subsections 1 to 4, inclusive, must be made available at all*
4 *times to a local law enforcement agency upon demand.*

5 **Sec. 10.** 1. *Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, a*
6 *scrap metal processor shall not provide payment for a used*
7 *catalytic converter unless:*

8 (a) *The payment is made by check or through an electronic*
9 *transfer of money cleared through an automated clearinghouse;*

10 (b) *The seller is a person described in section 8 of this act; and*

11 (c) *The scrap metal processor obtains:*

12 (1) *A clear photograph or video of the:*

13 (I) *Seller at the time of the sale;*

14 (II) *Used catalytic converter being sold; and*

15 (III) *If applicable, the vehicle identification number*
16 *permanently marked on the used catalytic converter;*

17 (2) *A copy of the seller's valid driver's license containing*
18 *the photograph and address of the seller, or a copy of a state or*
19 *federal government-issued identification card containing the*
20 *photograph and address of the seller; and*

21 (3) *A statement written by the seller indicating:*

22 (I) *That the seller is the lawful owner or possessor of the*
23 *used catalytic converter; or*

24 (II) *The name of the person from whom the seller*
25 *obtained the used catalytic converter, including, if applicable, the*
26 *name of the business as shown on a signed transfer document.*

27 2. *The provisions of subsection 1 do not apply to a scrap*
28 *metal processor who buys a used catalytic converter if the scrap*
29 *metal processor and the seller have a written agreement for the*
30 *transaction which includes:*

31 (a) *A log or other regularly updated record of all used catalytic*
32 *converters received pursuant to the agreement; and*

33 (b) *A description of each catalytic converter with enough*
34 *particularity so that each of the used catalytic converters in the*
35 *scrap metal processor's inventory can reasonably be matched to its*
36 *description in the agreement.*

37 **Sec. 11.** NRS 647.010 is hereby amended to read as follows:

38 647.010 As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise
39 requires, the words and terms defined in NRS 647.011 to 647.018,
40 inclusive, *and sections 6 and 7 of this act* have the meanings
41 ascribed to them in those sections.

42 **Sec. 12.** NRS 647.017 is hereby amended to read as follows:

43 647.017 1. "Scrap metal" means ~~F~~

44 ~~—(a) Nonferrous}~~ *nonferrous* metals, scrap iron, stainless steel or
45 other material or equipment which consists in whole or in part of



1 metal and which is used in construction, agricultural operations,
2 electrical power generation, transmission or distribution, cable,
3 broadband or telecommunications transmission, railroad equipment,
4 oil well rigs or any lights maintained by the State or a local
5 government, including, without limitation, street lights, traffic-
6 control devices, park lights or ballpark lights . ~~}; and~~

8 2. The term does not include waste generated by a household,
9 aluminum beverage containers, used construction scrap iron , ~~{or}~~
10 materials consisting of a metal product in its original manufactured
11 form which contains not more than 20 percent by weight nonferrous
12 metal ~~{}~~ *or used catalytic converters.*

13 **Sec. 13.** NRS 647.0172 is hereby amended to read as follows:

14 647.0172 “Scrap metal processor” means any person who:

15 1. Engages in the business of purchasing, trading, bartering or
16 otherwise receiving scrap metal ~~{}~~ *or used catalytic converters; or*

17 2. Uses machinery and equipment for processing and
18 manufacturing iron, steel or nonferrous scrap into prepared grades,
19 and whose principal product is scrap iron, scrap steel or nonferrous
20 metallic scrap, not including precious metals, for sale for remelting
21 purposes.

22 **Sec. 14.** NRS 647.0945 is hereby amended to read as follows:

23 647.0945 1. A local law enforcement agency may establish
24 an electronic reporting system or utilize an existing electronic
25 reporting system to receive information relating to the purchase of
26 scrap metal *or used catalytic converters* by a scrap metal processor
27 that transacts business within the jurisdiction of the local law
28 enforcement agency. An electronic reporting system established or
29 utilized pursuant to this subsection must:

30 (a) Be electronically secure and accessible only to:

31 (1) A scrap metal processor for the purpose of submitting the
32 information required by subsection 2;

33 (2) An officer of the local law enforcement agency; and

34 (3) If applicable, an authorized employee of any designated
35 third party.

37 scrap metal processor.

38 2. If a local law enforcement agency establishes an electronic
39 reporting system or utilizes an existing electronic reporting system
40 pursuant to subsection 1, each scrap metal processor that transacts

42 shall, before 12 p.m. of each business day, submit electronically to
43 the local law enforcement agency or, if applicable, a designated

18 (b) *Each purchase of a used catalytic converter conducted on*
19 *the preceding day from a person who sold the used catalytic*
20 *converter in his or her individual capacity:*

21 (1) *A statement written by the seller indicating:*

22 (I) *That the seller is the lawful owner or possessor of the*
23 *used catalytic converter; or*

24 (II) *The name of the person from whom the seller*
25 *obtained the used catalytic converter, including, if applicable, the*
26 *name of the business as shown on a signed transfer document;*

27 (2) *If applicable, a copy of the title of the vehicle from*
28 *which the used catalytic converter was removed which includes a*
29 *vehicle identification number that matches the vehicle*
30 *identification number permanently marked on the used catalytic*
31 *converter;*

32 (3) *The year, make, model and vehicle identification*
33 *number of the vehicle from which the used catalytic converter was*
34 *removed; and*

35 (4) *A description of the used catalytic converter purchased*
36 *or sold, including, without limitation, the item type, quantity and*
37 *vehicle identification number permanently marked on the used*
38 *catalytic converter.*

39 3. If a scrap metal processor is required to submit information
40 to a local law enforcement agency or, if applicable, a designated
41 third party pursuant to subsection 2, the scrap metal processor shall
42 display prominently at the point of purchase a public notice, in a
43 form approved by the local law enforcement agency, describing the
44 information that the scrap metal processor is required to submit



1 electronically to the local law enforcement agency or, if applicable,
2 the designated third party.

3 4. Nothing in this section shall be deemed to limit or otherwise
4 abrogate any duty of a scrap metal processor to maintain a book or
5 other permanent record of information pursuant to NRS 647.094.

6 5. If a local law enforcement agency establishes an electronic
7 reporting system or utilizes an existing electronic reporting system
8 to receive information pursuant to this section, the local law
9 enforcement agency shall, on or before January 15 of each odd-
10 numbered year, submit to the Director of the Legislative Counsel
11 Bureau for transmittal to the Legislature a report regarding the effect
12 of the electronic reporting system on the incidence of crime which
13 relates to the sale or purchase of scrap metal *or used catalytic*
14 *converters* within the jurisdiction of the law enforcement agency.

15 6. ~~[The]~~ *Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (b) of*
16 *subsection 2, the* provisions of this section do not apply to the
17 purchase of scrap metal *or a used catalytic converter* from a
18 business entity.

19 7. The Division of Industrial Relations of the Department of
20 Business and Industry shall, in consultation with representatives
21 from local law enforcement agencies in this state and representatives
22 from the scrap metal industry, adopt regulations to ensure the
23 confidentiality of information which is reported and maintained
24 pursuant to this section, including, without limitation, regulations
25 providing for:

- 26 (a) The confidentiality of consumer information;
27 (b) The confidentiality of proprietary information;
28 (c) Equity of input into contractual terms;
29 (d) Contractual terms relating to disclaimers, indemnification
30 and the ownership of data by a designated third party;
31 (e) Oversight of a designated third party that handles, maintains
32 or has access to such information, including, without limitation, the
33 qualifications, equipment, procedures and background checks
34 required of a designated third party;
35 (f) The manner in which reported information may be used,
36 shared or disseminated; and
37 (g) The maintenance of reported information in relationship to
38 other data maintained by a law enforcement agency.

39 8. As used in this section, "designated third party" means any
40 person with whom a local law enforcement agency has entered into
41 a contract for the purpose of receiving and storing any information
42 required to be submitted electronically by a scrap metal processor
43 pursuant to subsection 2.



1 **Sec. 15.** NRS 647.143 is hereby amended to read as follows:

20 *(b) If the violation involves 2 or more, but less than 10, used*
21 *catalytic converters, a category D felony and shall be punished as*
22 *provided in NRS 193.130.*
23 *(c) If the violation involves 10 or more used catalytic*
24 *converters, a category C felony and shall be punished as provided*
25 *in NRS 193.130.*
