SUMMARY—Authorizes the placement of a designation of veteran status on certain documents issued bv the Department of Motor Vehicles. (BDR 43-80)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: No. Effect on the State: Yes.

EXPLANATION - Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets for its material is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to motor vehicles; authorizing a person who has been honorably discharged from the Armed Forces of the United States to obtain a designation on his or her instruction permit, driver's license or identification card indicating that he or she is a veteran; requiring the Department of Motor Vehicles, on a monthly basis, to submit to the Office of Veterans Services a list of persons who have declared that they are veterans of the Armed Forces; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law requires the Department of Motor Vehicles to place a designation 1 23456 on the instruction permit, driver's license or identification card of certain persons, including persons with a disability which impairs or limits the ability to walk. (NRS 483.349, 483.865) Existing law also requires the Department to inquire whether a person wishes to declare that he or she is a veteran when applying for an instruction permit, driver's license or identification card. (NRS 483.292, 483.852)





7 Sections 6 and 9 of this bill require that a person who: (1) applies to the 8 Department for the initial issuance or renewal of an instruction permit, driver's 9 license or identification card; and (2) requests to have imprinted on that permit, 10 license or card a designation that he or she is a veteran of the Armed Forces of the 11 United States, submit a copy of his or her DD Form 214, "Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty," indicating that he or she was honorably discharged 12 13 from the Armed Forces. If such a person fulfills the requirements of section 6 or 9, 14 as applicable, sections 2 and 3 of this bill require the Department to place a 15 designation that the person is a veteran on the person's instruction permit, driver's 16 license or identification card, as appropriate. Sections 6 and 9 also require the 17 Department to compile and submit to the Office of Veterans Services each month a 18 list of persons who have declared that they are veterans of the Armed Forces.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 483 of NRS is hereby amended by adding 2 thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 and 3 of this act.

Sec. 2. 1. Upon the application of a person who requests 3 4 that his or her instruction permit or driver's license indicate that 5 he or she is a veteran of the Armed Forces of the United States pursuant to subsection 3 of NRS 483.292, and who satisfies the 6 requirements of that subsection, the Department shall place on 7 any instruction permit or driver's license issued to the person 8 pursuant to the provisions of this chapter a designation that the 9 10 person is a veteran.

11 2. The Director shall determine the design and placement of 12 the designation of veteran status required by subsection 1 on any 13 instruction permit or driver's license to which this section applies.

Sec. 3. 1. Upon the application of a person who requests 14 that his or her identification card indicate that he or she is a 15 veteran of the Armed Forces of the United States pursuant to 16 subsection 3 of NRS 483.852, and who satisfies the requirements 17 of that subsection, the Department shall place on any 18 identification card issued to the person pursuant to this section 19 and NRS 483.810 to 483.890, inclusive, a designation that the 20 21 person is a veteran.

22 2. The Director shall determine the design and placement of 23 the designation of veteran status required by subsection 1 on any 24 identification card to which this section applies.

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Sec. 4. NRS 483.015 is hereby amended to read as follows:

483.015 Except as otherwise provided in NRS 483.330, the
provisions of NRS 483.010 to 483.630, inclusive, *and section 2 of this act* apply only with respect to noncommercial drivers' licenses.





Sec. 5. NRS 483.020 is hereby amended to read as follows:

483.020 As used in NRS 483.010 to 483.630, inclusive, and
section 2 of this act, unless the context otherwise requires, the
words and terms defined in NRS 483.030 to 483.190, inclusive,
have the meanings ascribed to them in those sections.

Sec. 6. NRS 483.292 is hereby amended to read as follows:

7 483.292 1. When a person applies to the Department for *the* 8 *initial issuance of* an instruction permit or driver's license pursuant 9 to NRS 483.290 [] or *the renewal of an instruction permit or* 10 *driver's license*, the Department shall inquire whether the person 11 desires to declare that he or she is a veteran of the Armed Forces of 12 the United States.

13 2. If the person desires to declare pursuant to subsection 1 that
 14 he or she is a veteran of the Armed Forces of the United States, the
 15 person shall provide [evidence] :

(a) Evidence satisfactory to the Department that he or she has
 been honorably discharged from the Armed Forces of the United
 States ; and

19 (b) A written release authorizing the Department to provide to 20 the Office of Veterans Services personal information about the 21 person, which release must be signed by the person and in a form 22 required by the Director pursuant to NRS 481.063.

3. If the person declares pursuant to subsection 1 that he or 23 she is a veteran of the Armed Forces of the United States, the 24 25 Department shall count the declaration and maintain it only 26 numerically in a record kept by the Department for that purpose.] In 27 addition to the declaration described in subsection 1, a person who is a veteran of the Armed Forces of the United States and who 28 29 wishes to have placed on his or her instruction permit or driver's 30 license a designation that he or she is a veteran, as described in 31 section 2 of this act, must:

(a) If applying for the initial issuance of an instruction permit
or driver's license, appear in person at an office of the Department
and submit a copy of his or her DD Form 214, "Certificate of
Release or Discharge from Active Duty," issued by the United
States Department of Defense, indicating that the person has been
honorably discharged from the Armed Forces of the United States.
(b) If applying for the renewal of an instruction permit or

driver's license upon which a designation that the person is a veteran:

(1) Is not placed, submit by mail or in person a copy of his
or her DD Form 214, "Certificate of Release or Discharge from
Active Duty," issued by the United States Department of Defense,
indicating that the person has been honorably discharged from the
Armed Forces of the United States.



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1 (2) Is placed, submit by mail, in person or by other means 2 authorized by the Department a statement that the person wishes the instruction permit or driver's license to continue to designate 3 4 that the person is a veteran. 5

4. The Department shall, at least once each {quarter:} month:

6 (a) Compile [the aggregate number] *a list* of persons who have, during the immediately preceding [quarter,] month, declared 7 pursuant to subsection 1 that they are veterans of the Armed Forces 8 9 of the United States; and

10 (b) Transmit that **[number]** list to the Office of Veterans 11 Services to be used for statistical *and communication* purposes. 12

Sec. 7. NRS 483.530 is hereby amended to read as follows:

13 483.530 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, it is 14 a misdemeanor for any person:

15 (a) To display or cause or permit to be displayed or possess any 16 cancelled, revoked, suspended, fictitious, fraudulently altered or 17 fraudulently obtained driver's license;

(b) To alter, forge, substitute, counterfeit or use an unvalidated 18 19 driver's license;

20 (c) To lend his or her driver's license to any other person or 21 knowingly permit the use thereof by another;

22 (d) To display or represent as one's own any driver's license not 23 issued to him or her:

(e) To fail or refuse to surrender to the Department, a peace 24 25 officer or a court upon lawful demand any driver's license which 26 has been suspended, revoked or cancelled;

27 (f) To permit any unlawful use of a driver's license issued to 28 him or her;

29 (g) To do any act forbidden, or fail to perform any act required, 30 by NRS 483.010 to 483.630, inclusive **[]**, and section 2 of this act; 31 or

32 (h) To photograph, photostat, duplicate or in any way reproduce 33 any driver's license or facsimile thereof in such a manner that it could be mistaken for a valid license, or to display or possess any 34 such photograph, photostat, duplicate, reproduction or facsimile 35 36 unless authorized by this chapter.

Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, a person 37 2. who uses a false or fictitious name in any application for a driver's 38 license or identification card or who knowingly makes a false 39 statement or knowingly conceals a material fact or otherwise 40 41 commits a fraud in any such application is guilty of a category E felony and shall be punished as provided in NRS 193.130. If the 42 false statement, knowing concealment of a material fact or other 43 44 commission of fraud described in this subsection relates solely to 45 the age of a person, including, without limitation, to establish false





1 proof of age to game, purchase alcoholic beverages or purchase cigarettes or other tobacco products, the person is guilty of a 2 3 misdemeanor.

4 Sec. 8. NRS 483.620 is hereby amended to read as follows:

5 483.620 It is a misdemeanor for any person to violate any of 6 the provisions of NRS 483.010 to 483.630, inclusive, *and section 2* 7 of this act, unless such violation is, by NRS 483.010 to 483.630, inclusive, and section 2 of this act, or other law of this State, 8 9 declared to be a felony. 10

Sec. 9. NRS 483.852 is hereby amended to read as follows:

11 483.852 1. When a person applies to the Department for *the initial issuance of* an identification card pursuant to NRS 483.850 12 13 H or the renewal of an identification card pursuant to NRS 14 483.875, the Department shall inquire whether the person desires to declare that he or she is a veteran of the Armed Forces of the United 15 16 States.

17 2. If the person desires to declare pursuant to subsection 1 that 18 he or she is a veteran of the Armed Forces of the United States, the person shall provide *[evidence]*: 19

(a) Evidence satisfactory to the Department that he or she has 20 21 been honorably discharged from the Armed Forces of the United 22 States **H** : and

23 (b) A written release authorizing the Department to provide to 24 the Office of Veterans Services personal information about the 25 person, which release must be signed by the person and in a form 26 required by the Director pursuant to NRS 481.063.

3. If the person declares pursuant to subsection 1 that he or 27 she is a veteran of the Armed Forces of the United States, the 28 29 Department shall count the declaration and maintain it only 30 numerically in a record kept by the Department for that purpose.] In 31 addition to the declaration described in subsection 1, a person who is a veteran of the Armed Forces of the United States and who 32 33 wishes to have placed on his or her identification card a 34 designation that he or she is a veteran, as described in section 3 of 35 this act. must:

36 (a) If applying for the initial issuance of an identification card, 37 appear in person at an office of the Department and submit a copy of his or her DD Form 214, "Certificate of Release or Discharge 38 from Active Duty," issued by the United States Department of 39 Defense, indicating that the person has been honorably 40 41 discharged from the Armed Forces of the United States.

42 (b) If applying for the renewal of an identification card upon 43 which a designation that the person is a veteran:

44 (1) Is not placed, submit by mail or in person a copy of his 45 or her DD Form 214, "Certificate of Release or Discharge from





Active Duty," issued by the United States Department of Defense, 1 indicating that the person has been honorably discharged from the 2 Armed Forces of the United States. 3

(2) Is placed, submit by mail, in person or by other means 4 authorized by the Department a statement that the person wishes 5 the identification card to continue to designate that the person is a 6 7 veteran. 8

4. The Department shall, at least once each [quarter:] month:

9 (a) Compile [the aggregate number] *a list* of persons who have, during the immediately preceding [quarter,] month, declared 10 pursuant to subsection 1 that they are veterans of the Armed Forces 11 12 of the United States: and

(b) Transmit that [number] list to the Office of Veterans 13 Services to be used for statistical and communication purposes. 14

Sec. 10. This act becomes effective on January 1, 2014. 15
