SUMMARY—Revises provisions relating to the protection of personally identifiable information from release. (BDR 52-332)

AN ACT relating to the security of personal information; revising the information protected as personal information; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law imposes a requirement upon data collectors, including, without 23456789 limitation, businesses and governmental entities, that collect personal information to provide certain security measures to ensure the protection of such personal information. (Chapter 603A of NRS) Existing law treats the unauthorized acquisition of computerized data that materially compromises the security, confidentiality or integrity of personal information as a breach of the security of the system data. (NRS 603A.020) If such a breach of the security of the system data occurs, existing law requires the data collector to provide certain notice of the breach to any resident of this State whose unencrypted personal information was, or 10 is reasonably believed to have been, acquired by an unauthorized person. (NRS 11 603A.220) Existing law further establishes what information constitutes personal 12 information for the purposes of requiring a data collector to ensure the protection of 13 the information. Such information generally includes some portion of the name of a 14 natural person in combination with certain other data elements, including, without 15 limitation, a social security number or account number. (NRS 603A.040) This bill 16 expands the information which constitutes personal information by including 17 several additional data elements that, when paired with a portion of the name of a 18 natural person, constitute personal information. This bill also treats a user name, 19 unique identifier or electronic mail address in combination with a password, access 20 21 code or security question and answer as personal information regardless of whether such information is paired with a portion of the name of a natural person. Finally, 22 23 this bill excludes as personal information: (1) a number which is altered to provide not more than the last four digits of the number and to remove at least two digits;





24 and (2) publicly available information that is widely distributed through other 25 media.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY. DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. NRS 603A.040 is hereby amended to read as 2 follows: 3

603A.040 1. "Personal information" means [a]:

4 (a) A natural person's first name or first initial and last name in 5 combination with any one or more of the following data elements $\frac{1}{2}$ 6 when the name and data elements are not encrypted:

7 -(a)]:

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(1) Social security number.

9 (b) (2) Driver's license number, driver authorization card number or identification card number. 10

[(c)] (3) A private key, as defined in NRS 720.100, that is 11 12 unique to a natural person and is used to authenticate or sign an electronic record. 13

14 (4) Account number, credit card number or debit card number, in combination with any required security code, access 15 16 code or password that would permit access to the person's financial 17 account.

[(d)] (5) A medical identification number or a health insurance 18 19 identification number.

20 [(e)] (6) Information about a medical or mental health 21 diagnosis or treatment by a health care professional of a natural 22 person.

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(7) Passport number.

(8) Individual taxpayer identification number or identity 24 25 protection personal identification number issued by the Internal 26 *Revenue Service of the United States Department of the Treasury.*

27 (9) Unique biometric data generated from a measurement 28 or analysis of characteristics of a human body used to authenticate the identity of a natural person. 29

(b) A user name, unique identifier or electronic mail address in 30 31 combination with a password, access code or security question and 32 answer that would permit access to an online account.

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The term does not include : 2.

34 (a) A number that has been altered such that not more than 35 the last four digits of a social security number, the last four digits of 36 a driver's license number, the last four digits of a driver authorization card number or the last four digits of an identification 37 card the number are accessible and at least two digits have been 38 *removed*; or [publicly] 39





(b) Publicly available information that is lawfully made
available to the general public from federal, state or local
governmental records [.] or widely distributed through other media.
Sec. 2. This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.

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
