SUMMARY—Revises provisions relating to waste disposal. (BDR 40-989)

EXPLANATION - Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets *fomitted material* is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to waste disposal; requiring a county whose population is 100,000 or more to divert a certain percentage of solid waste from landfills; revising the statutory goal for recycling solid waste; requiring the board of county commissioners of each county in this State to report certain information to the State Environmental Commission and the Legislature; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law requires the State Environmental Commission to adopt regulations concerning recycling with the goal of recycling at least 25 percent of the total solid waste generated within each municipality in this State. (NRS 444A.020) Section 15 of this bill raises that goal to at least 35 percent of the total solid waste generated within such a municipality. Section 13 of this bill requires a county whose population is 100,000 or more (currently Clark and Washoe Counties) to divert a certain percentage of the solid waste generated within the county, excluding construction and demolition waste, for disposal from landfills to recycling centers, facilities for the recovery of materials from solid waste or composting facilities. Section 20 of this bill requires the board of county commissioners of each county to submit to the Commission and the Legislature a report concerning the efforts of





12 13 the county to establish single-stream recycling programs and encourage recycling

by businesses within the county.

Chapter 444A of NRS is hereby amended by adding Sec. 13. 13 thereto a new section to read as follows: 14

1. Each county whose population is 100,000 or more shall 15 maintain a waste diversion rate of at least: 16

- 17 (a) Twenty-three percent for calendar year 2023;
- (b) Twenty-four percent for calendar year 2024; and 18

(c) Twenty-five percent for calendar year 2025 and for each 19 20 calendar year thereafter.

The State Environmental Commission 21 2. shall adopt 22 regulations requiring each county subject to the requirements of 23 subsection 1 to report to the Commission the waste diversion rate maintained by the county for each calendar year. 24

3. As used in this section, "waste diversion rate" means the 25 percentage of solid waste, excluding construction and demolition 26 waste, generated within a county that is diverted from a landfill to 27 28 a recycling center, facility for the recovery of recyclable materials 29 from solid waste or composting facility. 30

Sec. 14. NRS 444Å.010 is hereby amended to read as follows:

444A.010 As used in NRS 444Å.010 to 444A.080, inclusive, 31 32 and section 13 of this act, unless the context otherwise requires, the 33 words and terms defined in NRS 444A.0103 to 444A.017, inclusive, 34 have the meanings ascribed to them in those sections.

Sec. 15. NRS 444A.020 is hereby amended to read as follows: 35 444A.020 1. The State Environmental Commission shall

36 37 adopt regulations establishing minimum standards for:

38 (a) Separating at the source recyclable material from other solid waste originating from residential premises and public buildings 39



1 where services for the collection of solid waste are provided, including, without limitation, the placement of recycling containers 2 on the premises of apartment complexes and condominiums where 3 4 those services are provided.

5 (b) Establishing recycling centers for the collection and disposal 6 of recyclable material.

7 (c) The disposal of hazardous household products which are 8 capable of causing harmful physical effects if inhaled, absorbed or 9 ingested.

10 The regulations adopted pursuant to subsection 1 must be 2. adopted with the goal of recycling at least [25] 35 percent of the 11 total solid waste generated within a municipality after the second 12 13 full year following the adoption of such standards.

14 3. The State Environmental Commission shall, by regulation, 15 establish acceptable methods for disposing of used or waste tires 16 consistent with the provisions of NRS 444.505, 444.507 and 17 444.509.

27 (a) The efforts made by the county to establish programs of single-stream recycling and encourage businesses within the county 28 29 to recycle; and

(b) The results of the efforts described in paragraph (a). 30

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As used in this section: 2.

(a) "Recycling center" means a facility designed and operated to 32 33 receive, store, process or transfer recyclable material which has been separated at the source from other solid waste. 34

(b) "Single-stream recycling" means a system in which all 35 recyclable materials are collected, mixed in the collection vehicle 36 37 and separated at a recycling center. 38
