SUMMARY—Prohibits a person from owning or possessing an apiary within certain areas of this State. (BDR 49-1018)

AN ACT relating to apiaries; prohibiting a person from owning or possessing an apiary within certain areas of this State; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

## **Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

Existing law provides for the regulation of apiaries and bees in this State, including, without limitation: (1) the control of the apiary industry by the Director of the State Department of Agriculture; (2) the inspection of apiaries by the Department; and (3) the abatement of apiaries which are a nuisance. (Chapter 552 of NRS) **Section 1** of this bill prohibits a person from owning or possessing an apiary within any urban or suburban area of this State having a density of more than two residential units per acre in the urban or suburban area.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1.** Chapter 552 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

1. A person shall not own or possess an apiary within any urban or suburban area of this State having a density of more than two residential units per acre in the urban or suburban area.

2. As used in this section, "residential unit" includes, without
limitation, an apartment, condominium, mobile home, single-family home and townhouse.
Sec. 2. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2019.
