SENATE BILL NO. 443–COMMITTEE ON LEGISLATIVE OPERATIONS AND ELECTIONS

MARCH 27, 2023

Referred to Committee on Legislative Operations and Elections

SUMMARY—Revises provisions relating to voter registration. (BDR 24-842)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: May have Fiscal Impact. Effect on the State: Yes.

EXPLANATION - Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to elections; revising provisions relating to voter registration during certain periods preceding an election; requiring the Department of Motor Vehicles to have extended hours of operation in certain counties during certain periods preceding the deadline to register to vote by mail for certain elections and following the day of certain elections; prohibiting, in certain counties, the Department to require an appointment to obtain a driver's license or identification card during certain periods; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law sets forth certain deadlines for registering to vote by mail, 123456789 computer or appearing in person at the office of the county or city clerk. (NRS 293.560, 293C.527) Existing law also authorizes an elector to register to vote after such deadlines: (1) through the Thursday preceding the election, by computer using the online registration system provided on the Internet website of the Office of the Secretary of State; and (2) after such online registration, by appearing in person during the period for early voting or on election day. To register to vote during such periods, an elector must provide his or her driver's license or identification card issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles and, if the license or identification 10 card does not include his or her current residential address, certain documents 11 establishing proof of residency. (NRS 293.5837-293.5847) Sections 1 and 2 of this 12 13 bill instead provide that to register to vote in person during the period for early voting or on election day, an elector must provide any current and valid photo 14 identification as proof of identity and, if such proof of identity was not issued by 15 the Department of Motor Vehicles or does not include his or her current residential 16 address, the elector must also provide proof of residency.





17 Existing law authorizes the Director of the Department of Motor Vehicles to 18 arrange for extended hours of operation for offices of the Department in a county 19 whose population is 100,000 or more (currently Clark County and Washoe 20 21 22 23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 County). (NRS 481.057) Section 3 of this bill provides that, in a county whose population is 100,000 or more, the Director is required to arrange for the offices of the Department to remain open on Saturdays and Sundays and at hours other than 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. for a person to only apply for the issuance or renewal of any type of driver's license or identification card issued by the Department: (1) during the two weeks immediately preceding the last day to register to vote by mail for a primary election, presidential preference primary election or general election; and (2) during the six calendar days immediately following the day of a primary election, presidential preference primary election or general election. Section 3 further prohibits the Department from requiring, in a county whose population is 100,000 or more, a person to have an appointment to apply for the issuance or renewal of 31 any type of driver's license or identification card issued by the Department: (1) 32 33 during the two weeks immediately preceding the last day to register to vote by mail for a primary election, presidential preference primary election or general election; 34 and (2) during the six calendar days immediately following the day of a primary 35 election, presidential preference primary election or general election.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 293.5842 is hereby amended to read as 2 follows:

3 293.5842 1. Notwithstanding the close of any method of 4 registration for an election pursuant to NRS 293.560 or 293C.527, 5 an elector may register to vote in person at any polling place for 6 early voting by personal appearance in the county or city, as 7 applicable, in which the elector is eligible to vote.

8 2. To register to vote in person during the period for early 9 voting, an elector must:

(a) Appear before the close of polls at a polling place for early
voting by personal appearance in the county or city, as applicable, in
which the elector is eligible to vote.

(b) Complete the application to register to vote by a method
authorized by the county or city clerk pursuant to this paragraph.
The county or city clerk shall authorize at least one of the following
methods for a person to register to vote pursuant to this paragraph:

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(1) A paper application; or

(2) The system established by the Secretary of State pursuantto NRS 293.671.

20 \rightarrow If the county or city clerk authorizes the use of both methods, the 21 county or city clerk may limit the use of one method to 22 circumstances when the other method is not reasonably available.

(c) Except as otherwise provided in subsection 3, provide his or
 her current and valid [driver's license or] *photo* identification [card
 issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles which shows his or her





physical address] as proof of the elector's identity and, *if the photo* 1 2 identification was issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles and 3 shows the elector's current residential address, as proof of the 4 *elector's identity and* residency. 3. If the [driver's license or] photo identification [card] was 5 *not* issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles to the elector *or* 6 7 does not have the elector's current residential address, the following 8 documents may be used to establish the residency of the elector if 9 the current residential address of the elector, as indicated on his or her application to register to vote, is displayed on the document: 10 11 (a) A military identification card; 12 (b) A utility bill, including, without limitation, a bill for electric, 13 gas, oil, water, sewer, septic, telephone, cellular telephone or cable 14 television service: 15 (c) A bank or credit union statement; 16 (d) A paycheck; 17 (e) An income tax return; 18 (f) A statement concerning the mortgage, rental or lease of a 19 residence: 20 (g) A motor vehicle registration; 21 (h) A property tax statement; or 22 (i) Any other document issued by a governmental agency. 23 Subject to final verification, if an elector registers to vote in 4. 24 person at a polling place pursuant to this section: 25 (a) The elector shall be deemed to be conditionally registered to 26 vote at the polling place upon: 27 (1) The determination that the application to register to vote 28 is complete; and 29 (2) The verification of the elector's identity and residency 30 pursuant to this section. 31 (b) After the elector is deemed to be conditionally registered to 32 vote at the polling place pursuant to paragraph (a), the elector: 33 (1) May vote in the election only at that polling place; (2) Must vote as soon as practicable and before leaving that 34 35 polling place; and 36 (3) Must vote by casting a provisional ballot, unless it is 37 verified, at that time, that the elector is qualified to register to vote and to cast a regular ballot in the election at that polling place. 38

39 Sec. 2. NRS 293.5847 is hereby amended to read as follows:
293.5847 1. Notwithstanding the close of any method of

registration for an election pursuant to NRS 293.560 or 293C.527,
an elector may register to vote in person on the day of the election at
any polling place in the county or city, as applicable, in which the
elector is eligible to vote.





1 2. To register to vote on the day of the election, an elector 2 must:

3 (a) Appear before the close of polls at a polling place in the 4 county or city, as applicable, in which the elector is eligible to vote.

5 (b) Complete the application to register to vote by a method 6 authorized by the county or city clerk pursuant to this paragraph. 7 The county or city clerk shall authorize at least one of the following 8 methods for a person to register to vote pursuant to this paragraph:

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(1) A paper application; or

10 (2) The system established by the Secretary of State pursuant 11 to NRS 293.671.

12 \rightarrow If the county or city clerk authorizes the use of both methods, the 13 county or city clerk may limit the use of one method to 14 circumstances when the other method is not reasonably available.

15 (c) Except as otherwise provided in subsection 3, provide his or 16 her current and valid [driver's license or] photo identification [card 17 issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles which shows his or her 18 physical address] as proof of the elector's identity, and if the photo 19 identification was issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles and 20 shows the elector's current residential address, as proof of the 21 elector's identify and residency

21 *elector's identity* and residency.

3. If the [driver's license or] photo identification [card] was not issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles to the elector or does not have the elector's current residential address, the following documents may be used to establish the residency of the elector if the current residential address of the elector, as indicated on his or her application to register to vote, is displayed on the document:

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(a) A military identification card;

(b) A utility bill, including, without limitation, a bill for electric,
 gas, oil, water, sewer, septic, telephone, cellular telephone or cable
 television service;

- 32 (c) A bank or credit union statement;
- 33 (d) A paycheck;
- 34 (e) An income tax return;

(f) A statement concerning the mortgage, rental or lease of aresidence;

- 37 (g) A motor vehicle registration;
- 38 (h) A property tax statement; or

39 (i) Any other document issued by a governmental agency.

40 4. Subject to final verification, if an elector registers to vote in 41 person at a polling place pursuant to this section:

42 (a) The elector shall be deemed to be conditionally registered to 43 vote at the polling place upon:

44 (1) The determination that the application to register to vote 45 is complete; and





1 (2) The verification of the elector's identity and residency 2 pursuant to this section.

3 (b) After the elector is deemed to be conditionally registered to 4 vote at the polling place pursuant to paragraph (a), the elector:

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(1) May vote in the election only at that polling place;

6 (2) Must vote as soon as practicable and before leaving that 7 polling place; and

(3) Must vote by casting a provisional ballot.

 481.057 [In]

11 **1.** Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, in a county 12 whose population is 100,000 or more, the Director may arrange for 13 offices of the Department to remain open on Saturdays and Sundays 14 and at hours other than 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

15 2. In county whose population is 100,000 or more, the 16 Director shall arrange for the offices of the Department to remain 17 open on Saturdays and Sundays and at hours other than 8 a.m. to 18 5 p.m. for a person to apply only for the issuance or renewal of 19 any type of driver's license or identification card issued by the 20 Department:

(a) During the two weeks immediately preceding the last day to
 register to vote by mail pursuant to NRS 293.560 for a primary
 election, presidential preference primary election or general
 election; and

(b) During the six calendar days immediately following the day
 of a primary election, presidential preference primary election or
 general election.

28 3. In a county whose population is 100,000 or more, the 29 Department shall not require a person to have an appointment for 30 the issuance or renewal of any type of driver's license or 31 identification card issued by the Department:

(a) During the two weeks immediately preceding the last day to
register to vote by mail pursuant to NRS 293.560 for a primary
election, presidential preference primary election or general
election; and

(b) During the six calendar days immediately following the day
of a primary election, presidential preference primary election or
general election.

39 4. As used in this section:

40 (a) "General election" has the meaning ascribed to it in 41 NRS 293.060.

42 (b) "Presidential preference primary election" has the 43 meaning ascribed to it in NRS 293.0771.

44 (c) *"Primary election" has the meaning ascribed to it in* 45 NRS 293.080.





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Sec. 4. 1. This section becomes effective upon passage and approval.

2. Sections 1, 2 and 3 of this act become effective:

(a) Upon passage and approval for the purpose of adopting regulations and performing any other preparatory administrative tasks that are necessary to carry out the provisions of this act; and
(b) On January 1, 2024, for all other purposes.
