

SENATE BILL NO. 469—COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION

MARCH 25, 2019

Referred to Committee on Education

SUMMARY—Revises provisions relating to the reorganization of certain school districts. (BDR 34-818)

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EXPLANATION – Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets ~~omitted material~~ is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to education; clarifying that a large school district is responsible for utilities for each local school precinct; revising the number of local school precincts in a large school district that a school associate superintendent is authorized to oversee; revising provisions relating to the allocation of money by such a large school district to local school precincts to carry out the responsibilities transferred to the precincts; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel’s Digest:**

1 Existing law prescribes requirements for the transition and restructuring of  
2 school districts which have more than 100,000 pupils enrolled in its public schools  
3 (currently the Clark County School District) from a centralized operational model  
4 to a more decentralized and autonomous site-based operational model. (NRS  
5 388G.500-388G.810) To accomplish this, existing law: (1) deems each public  
6 school within a large school district, other than a charter school or a university  
7 school for profoundly gifted pupils, to be a local school precinct which is operated  
8 under site-based decision-making; and (2) provides to the local school precincts the  
9 authority to carry out certain responsibilities which have traditionally been carried  
10 out by the large school district. (NRS 388G.600)

11 Existing law: (1) requires the superintendent of schools of a large school  
12 district to transfer certain responsibilities to each local school precinct; and (2)  
13 provides that the large school district remains responsible for paying for and  
14 carrying out all other responsibilities necessary for the operation of the local school  
15 precincts. (NRS 388G.610) **Section 1** of this bill clarifies that the large school  
16 district remains responsible for utilities.

17 Existing law requires the superintendent of schools of a large school district to  
18 assign a school associate superintendent to oversee local school precincts, but  
19 prohibits such a person from being assigned to oversee more than 25 local school



20 precincts. (NRS 388G.620) **Section 1.5** of this bill removes this prohibition,  
21 therefore authorizing a school associate superintendent to oversee more than 25  
22 local school precincts.

23 Existing law sets forth the manner in which a large school district is required to  
24 determine the allocation that will be made to each local school precinct, which must  
25 be on a per pupil basis. (NRS 388G.670) Existing law requires the superintendent  
26 of schools of a large school district to inform each local school precinct on or  
27 before January 15 of each year of the estimated amount of money that will be  
28 allocated to the local school precinct for the next school year, based upon: (1) for  
29 an existing local school precinct, the actual number of pupils who attended the local  
30 school precinct as reported during the previous calendar quarter; or (2) for a new  
31 local school precinct, the estimated number of pupils who will attend the new  
32 school and the effect on any existing local school precinct. (NRS 388G.680) For  
33 purposes of this allocation, **section 3** of this bill changes the measure for  
34 determining the number of pupils for existing local school precincts from actual  
35 numbers to estimates by the large school district, which is the same measure as is  
36 used for determining the number of pupils for a new local school precinct.

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 388G.610 is hereby amended to read as  
2 follows:

3 388G.610 1. Except as otherwise provided in this section, the  
4 superintendent shall transfer authority to each local school precinct  
5 to carry out responsibilities in accordance with this section and the  
6 plan of operation approved for the local school precinct.

7 2. The superintendent shall transfer to each local school  
8 precinct the authority to carry out the following responsibilities:

9 (a) Select for the local school precinct the:

10 (1) Teachers;

11 (2) Administrators other than the principal; and

12 (3) Other staff who work under the direct supervision of the  
13 principal.

14 (b) Direct the supervision of the staff of the local school  
15 precinct, including, without limitation, taking any necessary  
16 disciplinary action which does not involve a violation of law or  
17 which does not require an investigation to comply with the law.

18 (c) Procure such equipment, services and supplies as the local  
19 school precinct deems necessary or advisable to carry out the plan of  
20 operation for the local school precinct. Equipment, services and  
21 supplies may be procured from the large school district in which the  
22 local school precinct is located or elsewhere, but such procurement  
23 must be carried out in accordance with the applicable policies of the  
24 large school district.

25 (d) Develop a balanced budget for the local school precinct for  
26 the use of the money allocated to the local school precinct, which



1 must include, without limitation, the manner in which to expend any  
2 money not used for the purposes described in paragraphs (a), (b) and  
3 (c).

4 (e) Any other responsibility for which authority is transferred  
5 pursuant to subsection 7.

6 3. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 7, a large school  
7 district shall remain responsible for paying for and carrying out all  
8 other responsibilities necessary for the operation of the local school  
9 precincts and the large school district which have not been  
10 transferred to the local school precincts pursuant to subsection 2,  
11 including, without limitation, responsibility for:

12 (a) Negotiating the salaries, benefits and other conditions of  
13 employment of administrators, teachers and other staff necessary for  
14 the operation of the local school precinct;

15 (b) Transportation services;

16 (c) Food services;

17 (d) Risk management services;

18 (e) Financial services, including payroll services;

19 (f) Qualifying employees for any position within the large  
20 school district;

21 (g) Services to promote and ensure equity and diversity;

22 (h) Services to ensure compliance with all laws relating to civil  
23 rights;

24 (i) Identification, evaluation, program placement, pupil  
25 assignment and other services provided to pupils pursuant to the  
26 Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, 20 U.S.C. §§ 1400 et  
27 seq., and the regulations adopted pursuant thereto, or pursuant to  
28 section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, 29 U.S.C. § 794, and  
29 the regulations adopted pursuant thereto;

30 (j) Legal services;

31 (k) Maintenance and repair of buildings;

32 (l) Maintenance of the grounds of the local school precinct;

33 (m) Custodial services;

34 (n) Implementation of the master plan developed for English  
35 learners;

36 (o) Internal audits;

37 (p) Information technology services;

38 (q) Police services;

39 (r) Emergency management services;

40 (s) Carrying out state mandated assessments and accountability  
41 reports; ~~and~~

42 (t) Capital projects ~~and~~; and

43 (u) *Utilities.*

44 4. To the greatest extent possible, the principal of a local  
45 school precinct shall select teachers who are licensed and in good



1 standing before selecting substitutes to teach at the local school  
2 precinct. The principal, in consultation with the organizational team,  
3 shall make every effort to ensure that effective licensed teachers are  
4 employed at the local school precinct.

5 5. If a large school district is unable to provide any necessary  
6 maintenance or repair of the buildings or grounds of a local school  
7 precinct in a timely manner, the large school district must, at the  
8 expense of the large school district, procure any equipment, services  
9 and supplies necessary from another entity or business to provide  
10 such maintenance or repair for the local school precinct or take any  
11 other necessary action.

12 6. To the extent that any member of the staff of central services  
13 is assigned to provide services at a local school precinct on a  
14 temporary or permanent basis, the decision regarding the assignment  
15 and any subsequent reassignment of the member of the staff must be  
16 made in consultation with the principal of the local school precinct  
17 and the school associate superintendent.

18 7. On or before January 15 of each year, the superintendent  
19 shall determine, in consultation with the principals, school associate  
20 superintendents and organizational teams of each local school  
21 precinct, any additional authority that is not listed in subsection 2 to  
22 recommend transferring to one or more local school precincts. Such  
23 authority may include the authority to carry out any of the  
24 responsibilities listed in subsection 3 which is not prohibited by law,  
25 other than the responsibility for capital projects, if it is determined  
26 that transferring the authority will serve the best interests of the  
27 pupils. The recommendation to transfer authority to one or more  
28 local school precincts must be submitted for approval by the board  
29 of trustees of the large school district. The board of trustees of the  
30 large school district shall consider such a recommendation and  
31 determine whether to approve the transfer of additional authority at  
32 its next regularly scheduled meeting if submitted within 5 working  
33 days before the next regularly scheduled meeting and otherwise the  
34 recommendation shall be considered at the following meeting.

35 8. If the authority to carry out any responsibility is transferred  
36 to a local school precinct pursuant to subsection 7, the large school  
37 district must allocate additional money to the local school precinct  
38 in an amount equal to the amount that would otherwise be paid by  
39 the large school district to carry out the responsibility.

40 **Sec. 1.5.** NRS 388G.620 is hereby amended to read as  
41 follows:

42 388G.620 1. The superintendent shall assign a school  
43 associate superintendent to oversee ~~each~~ *one or more* local school  
44 ~~precinct. Each school associate superintendent must not be assigned~~  
45 ~~to oversee more than 25 local school~~ precincts.



1 2. Whenever a vacancy occurs in the position of school  
2 associate superintendent, the superintendent shall post notice of the  
3 vacancy. The superintendent shall interview qualified candidates for  
4 the vacant position. At least one, but not more than two  
5 representatives of the principals of the local school precincts  
6 overseen by the vacant position must be allowed to participate in  
7 interviewing candidates for the vacant position. If the local  
8 governmental agency which has the most schools that are overseen  
9 by the vacant position is:

10 (a) A city, the governing body of the city may appoint one  
11 representative to participate in interviewing candidates for the  
12 vacant position.

13 (b) Not a city, the board of county commissioners for the county  
14 in which the large school district is located may appoint one  
15 representative to participate in interviewing candidates for the  
16 vacant position.

17 3. Each person who participates in interviewing candidates  
18 pursuant to subsection 2 shall comply with all laws that apply to an  
19 employer when making a decision about employment.

20 4. Upon completion of the interviews pursuant to subsection 2  
21 and before the superintendent makes a final determination about  
22 which candidate to hire, the superintendent must notify the  
23 governing body of the city or the board of county commissioners for  
24 the county, as applicable, regarding the candidate whom the  
25 superintendent intends to hire. After receiving such notice, the  
26 governing body of the city or the board of county commissioners, as  
27 applicable, may hold a public meeting within 10 days to question  
28 the superintendent and the candidate for the vacant position and  
29 receive public input. After any such meeting or, if no such meeting  
30 is held, after 10 days, the superintendent shall, in his or her sole  
31 discretion, hire a candidate for the vacant position.

32 5. After the school associate superintendent is hired, the  
33 superintendent may, in his or her sole discretion, reassign and make  
34 other employment decisions concerning the school associate  
35 superintendent.

38 **Sec. 3.** NRS 388G.680 is hereby amended to read as follows:

39 388G.680 1. On or before January 15 of each year, the  
40 superintendent shall inform each local school precinct of the  
41 estimated amount of money that will be allocated to the local school  
42 precinct for the next school year. The allocation must be based upon  
43 *estimates by the large school district of* the number of pupils in  
44 each category who *will* attend the local school precinct after



1 applying the appropriate weight to each category of pupil as  
2 determined pursuant to NRS 388G.670.

3 2. ~~Except as otherwise provided in subsections 3 and 4, the~~  
4 ~~number and category of pupils must be determined based upon~~  
5 ~~the report of the pupils attending each local school precinct for the~~  
6 ~~previous calendar quarter pursuant to NRS 387.1223.~~

7 ~~3.]~~ If an additional local school precinct is added in the large  
8 school district, for the purpose of determining the first allocation for  
9 the new local school precinct, the large school district must estimate  
10 the number of pupils in each category who will attend the new local  
11 school precinct and the effect on any existing local school precinct.  
12 If the opening of a new local school precinct is anticipated to reduce  
13 the number of pupils who will attend another local school precinct,  
14 for purposes of determining the allocation, the number of pupils  
15 must be adjusted accordingly.

16 ~~4.]~~ 3. The estimated amount of money allocated to each local  
17 school precinct for the next school year must be adjusted on or  
18 before November 1 of each year to reflect the actual number of  
19 pupils in each category who attend the local school precinct.

20 **Sec. 4.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2019.
