SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing the Mining Oversight and Accountability Commission. (BDR 46-218)

EXPLANATION - Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to mining; revising provisions governing the membership of the Mining Oversight and Accountability Commission; temporarily revising provisions governing the review of certain mining regulations by the Commission; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law establishes the Mining Oversight and Accountability Commission, 234567 prescribes its membership and requires the Commission to provide oversight of compliance with Nevada law relating to the activities of each state agency, board, bureau, commission, department or division with respect to the taxation, operation, safety and environmental regulation of mines and mining in this State. (NRS 514A.040, 514A.060) Section 1 of this bill: (1) removes a provision intended to ensure that not more than two members of the Commission are appointed from any 8 one county in this State; (2) provides that a member serves until his or her 9 successor is appointed and qualified; and (3) authorizes a member to be 10 reappointed. Under existing law, certain regulations relating to mines or mining are 11 not effective unless they are reviewed by the Mining Oversight and Accountability Commission before they are approved by the Legislative Commission or its Subcommittee to Review Regulations. (NRS 514A.110) Sections 1.5 and 2 of this 12 13 14 bill provide that until June 30, 2020, if the Mining Oversight and Accountability 15 Commission fails to review certain regulations relating to mines or mining adopted 16 by the Commission on Mineral Resources or the State Environmental Commission 17 within 30 days after their adoption, the regulations will become effective if





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18 approved in accordance with the applicable provisions of the Nevada19 Administrative Procedure Act.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 514A.040 is hereby amended to read as 2 follows:

514A.040 1. There is hereby created the Mining Oversight
and Accountability Commission consisting of seven members
appointed as follows:

(a) Two members appointed by the Governor;

7 (b) Two members appointed by the Governor from a list of 8 persons recommended by the Majority Leader of the Senate;

9 (c) Two members appointed by the Governor from a list of 10 persons recommended by the Speaker of the Assembly; and

(d) One member appointed by the Governor from a list of 11 persons recommended by the Minority Leader of the Senate or the 12 Minority Leader of the Assembly. The Minority Leader of the 13 14 Senate shall recommend persons for appointment for the initial term, the Minority Leader of the Assembly shall recommend 15 persons for appointment for the next succeeding term, and 16 17 thereafter, the authority to recommend persons for appointment must alternate each biennium between the Houses of the 18 19 Legislature.

20 2. The Governor, Majority Leader of the Senate, Speaker of the 21 Assembly, Minority Leader of the Senate and Minority Leader of 22 the Assembly shall confer before the Governor makes an 23 appointment to ensure that [:

24 (a) Not more than two of the members are appointed from any
 25 one county in this State; and

(b) Not] not more than two of the members have a direct or indirect financial interest in the mining industry or are related by blood or marriage to a person who has such an interest.

29 3. Each member of the Commission serves for a term of 2
30 years [.] and until his or her successor is appointed and qualified.
31 A member may be reappointed.

32 4. A vacancy on the Commission must be filled by the 33 Governor in the same manner as the original appointment.

34 Sec. 1.5. NRS 514A.110 is hereby amended to read as 35 follows:

Except as otherwise provided in this section, a permanent

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1 [1.] (*a*) Nevada Tax Commission, pursuant to NRS 360.090, 2 concerning any taxation related to the extraction of any mineral in 3 this State, including, without limitation, the taxation of the net 4 proceeds pursuant to chapter 362 of NRS and Section 5 of Article 5 10 of the Nevada Constitution;

6 [2.] (b) Administrator of the Division of Industrial Relations of
7 the Department of Business and Industry for mine health and safety
8 pursuant to NRS 512.131;

9 [3.] (c) Commission on Mineral Resources pursuant to NRS 10 513.063, 513.094 or 519A.290; and

11 [4.] (d) State Environmental Commission pursuant to 12 NRS 519A.160,

13 → is not effective unless it is reviewed by the Mining Oversight and 14 Accountability Commission before it is approved pursuant to chapter 233B of NRS by the Legislative Commission or the 15 16 Subcommittee to Review Regulations appointed pursuant to subsection 6 of NRS 233B.067. After conducting its review of the 17 regulation, the Mining Oversight and Accountability Commission 18 shall provide a report of its findings and recommendations regarding 19 20 the regulation to the Legislative Counsel for submission to the 21 Legislative Commission or the Subcommittee to Review 22 Regulations, as appropriate.

23 If the Mining Oversight and Accountability Commission 2. 24 fails to review a permanent regulation described in paragraph (c) 25 or (d) of subsection 1 within 30 days after its adoption, the 26 regulation may be approved without such a review pursuant to 27 chapter 233B of NRS by the Legislative Commission or the 28 Subcommittee to Review Regulations appointed pursuant to subsection 6 of NRS 233B.067 and becomes effective in 29 30 accordance with the provisions of NRS 233B.070.

31 Sec. 2. 1. This act becomes effective upon passage and 32 approval.

2. Section 1.5 of this act expires by limitation on June 30, 2020.

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
