SUMMARY—Revises provisions relating to the confidentiality of personal information contained in records of county assessors. (BDR 20-376)

EXPLANATION - Matter in bolded italics is new; matter between brackets formitted material is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to public records; adding prosecutors to a list of persons who may request that certain personal information contained in the records of the county assessor be kept confidential; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Under existing law, justices, judges and peace officers, and the spouses and minor children of such persons, may request that personal information contained in the records of the county assessor be kept confidential. (NRS 250.140) This bill adds prosecutors and the spouses and minor children of prosecutors to the list of persons who may request that their personal information contained in the records of a county assessor be kept confidential.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. NRS 250.140 is hereby amended to read as follows: 250.140 1. The following persons may request that personal information contained in the records of a county assessor be kept confidential: 4

- (a) Any justice or judge in this State.
 - (b) Any peace officer or retired peace officer.
- (c) Any prosecutor.
