SENATE BILL NO. 76–SENATOR NEAL

PREFILED JANUARY 23, 2023

Referred to Committee on Natural Resources

SUMMARY—Establishes provisions governing certain products that contain intentionally added perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances. (BDR 40-291)

EXPLANATION - Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to hazardous materials; prohibiting, with certain exceptions, the sale and distribution of certain products containing intentionally added perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances; requiring, with certain exceptions, manufacturers of cookware containing intentionally added perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances to provide certain information to a customer; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law prohibits, with certain exceptions, the discharge, use or release of 23456789 any Class B firefighting foam that contains intentionally added perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances for the purpose of testing the Class B firefighting foam or firefighting training. (NRS 459.682) Beginning on January 1, 2024, section 21 of this bill prohibits, with certain exceptions, a manufacturer from selling, offering for sale, distributing for sale or distributing for use any carpet or rug, fabric treatment, food packaging or juvenile product that contains intentionally added perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances. Section 21 also requires a manufacturer of such products to include a statement on the product label that 10 perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances were not intentionally added or used 11 to make the product. Section 24 of this bill amends section 21 to also prohibit, 12 beginning July 1, 2024, a manufacturer from selling, offering for sale, distributing 13 for sale or distributing for use any cosmetics, indoor textile furnishings or indoor 14 upholstered furniture that contain intentionally added perfluoroalkyl and 15 polyfluoroalkyl substances.

Section 22 of this bill requires, with certain exceptions, a manufacturer of cookware sold in this State that contains intentionally added perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances to include on the cookware product label and on any product listing for online sales: (1) that the product contains intentionally added





20 perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances; and (2) an Internet address and quick response code for a website that contains certain information about the intentionally added perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances.

21 22 23 24 25 26 27 28 29 Section 23 of this bill provides that a person who willfully and knowingly violates the provisions of section 21, 22 or 24 is subject to a maximum civil penalty of \$1,000.

Section 20 of this bill provides an exception to the requirements and prohibitions set forth in this bill to the extent that such provisions are preempted by or conflict with federal law.

Sections 3-19 of this bill define certain terms related to these requirements.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA. REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY. DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 459 of NRS is hereby amended by adding 1 thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 to 23, inclusive, of this 2 3 act.

Sec. 2. As used in sections 2 to 23, inclusive, of this act, the 4 5 words and terms defined in sections 3 to 19, inclusive, of this act have the meanings ascribed to them in those sections. 6

7 Sec. 3. "Adult mattress" means any mattress other than a 8 toddler mattress, crib mattress or other sleep product for infants.

"Carpet or rug" means a fabric product marketed or 9 Sec. 4. 10 intended for use as a floor covering in a household or business.

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Sec. 5. (Deleted by amendment.)

12 Sec. 6. "Component" means an identifiable component of a product, regardless of whether the manufacturer of the product is 13 14 the manufacturer of the component.

Sec. 7. "Cookware" means a durable houseware product that 15 is used in a residence or kitchen to prepare, dispense or store food 16 17 or beverages, including, without limitation, any pot, pan, skillet, grill, baking sheet, baking mold, tray, bowl or cooking utensil. 18

"Cosmetic" means a product that is intended to 19 Sec. 8. 1. 20 be rubbed onto or introduced into, poured, sprinkled, sprayed on or otherwise applied to the human body for the purposes of 21 cleaning, cleansing, beautifying, promoting or altering the 22 23 appearance of a person, including, without limitation, any skin moisturizer, perfume, lipstick, nail polish, eye or facial makeup, 24 25 shampoo, conditioner, permanent wave, hair dye or deodorant. 26

The term does not include: 2.

27 (a) A product that requires a prescription for distribution or 28 dispensation; or

29 (b) Hydrofluoroolefins used as propellants in cosmetics.

Sec. 9. "Fabric treatment" means a product applied to fabric 30 to give the fabric one or more characteristics, including, without 31 32 limitation, stain resistance or water resistance. The term does not





include hydrofluoroolefins used as propellants in fabric 1 2 treatments.

"Food packaging" means a package or packaging 3 Sec. 10. component that is used in direct contact with food and is 4 composed of, in substantial part, paper, paperboard or other 5 6 materials originally derived from plant fibers.

7 "Intentionally perfluoroalkvl Sec. 11. 1. added and substances" perfluoroalkyl 8 polyfluoroalkyl means and polyfluoroalkyl substances that a manufacturer has intentionally 9 added to a product and that have a functional or technical effect 10 the product. The term includes. without limitation. 11 on 12 perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances that are intentional 13 breakdown products of an added chemical that also have a functional or technical effect on the product. 14

15 2. The term does not include the use of recycled materials which may contain perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances 16 17 due to the use of perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances in the original product. 18

"Juvenile product" means a product designed 19 Sec. 11.5. 1. 20 by a manufacturer for use by an infant or child less than 12 years 21 of age, including, without limitation, a bassinet, child restraint system for use in motor vehicles, changing pad, toddler mattress, 22 23 crib mattress or other sleep product for infants, high chair, infant 24 carrier, infant seat, polyurethane foam mat, pad or pillow, nap cot, 25 play mat, playpen or stroller.

26 The term does not include: 2.

27 (a) Electronic products, including, without limitation, any 28 personal computer and any associated equipment, audio and video 29 equipment, calculator, wireless phone, gaming console, handheld 30 device incorporating a video screen or any associated peripheral device such as a mouse, keyboard, power supply unit or power 31 32 cord:

33 (b) An internal component of a juvenile product that is not designed or intended to come into direct contact with the skin or 34 mouth of a child as a result of the reasonably foreseeable use of 35 36 the product: or 37

(c) An adult mattress.

Sec. 12. "Manufacturer" means a person that manufactures 38 or assembles a product. The term includes, without limitation, the 39 40 importer or first domestic distributor of the product if a product is imported into the United States and the manufacturer does not 41 42 have a presence in the United States.

43 Sec. 13. "Package" means the material that is intended or used to contain, protect, handle, deliver or present a product. 44





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"Packaging component" means an individual part 1 Sec. 14. 2 of a package, including, without limitation, the interior or exterior cushioning, 3 blocking, bracing, weatherproofing, exterior strapping, coating, closure, ink or label. 4

5 **Sec. 15.** *"Perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances" has* the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 459.678. 6

7 Sec. 16. 1. "Product" means an item, and any component 8 of such an item, that is manufactured, assembled or otherwise prepared for sale or distribution to a customer and that is sold or 9 distributed for personal, residential, commercial or industrial use, 10 11 including, without limitation, for use in making other products.

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The term does not include: 2.

13 (a) Any drug, medical device, biologic or diagnostic regulated 14 by the United States Food and Drug Administration or the United 15 States Department of Agriculture;

16 (b) Any drug, medical device, biologic, parasiticide or 17 diagnostic administered or used to treat animals regulated by the United States Food and Drug Administration pursuant to the 18 Federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act, 21 U.S.C. §§ 351 et seq., 19 20 the United States Department of Agriculture pursuant to the 21 Virus-Serum-Toxin Act, 21 U.S.C. §§ 151 et seq. or the United 22 States Environmental Protection Agency pursuant to the Federal 23 Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act, 7 U.S.C. §§ 136 et 24 sea.:

25 (c) A veterinary pesticide product approved by the United 26 States Environmental Protection Agency for use in animals;

27 (d) Any packaging used for a product described in paragraph 28 (a), (b) or (c); or29

(e) A used product offered for sale or resale.

Sec. 17. "Textile" means any product made in whole or in 30 part from a natural or synthetic fiber, yarn or fabric, including, 31 32 without limitation, leather, cotton, silk, jute, hemp, wool, nylon or 33 polyester. The term does not include any textile used in a medical, professional or industrial setting. 34

Sec. 18. "Textile furnishing" means a type of textile intended 35 for use in households and businesses, including, without 36 37 limitation, any drapery, floor covering, furnishing, bedding, towel or tablecloth. The term does not include a textile furnishing 38 intended for use in a medical, professional or industrial setting. 39

"Upholstered furniture" means any article of 40 Sec. 19. *furniture that is:* 41

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1. Designed for sitting, resting or reclining; and 2.

Wholly or partially stuffed with filling material. 43

44 Sec. 20. The provisions of sections 2 to 23, inclusive, of this 45 act do not apply to the extent that those provisions are preempted





by or conflict with federal law, including, without limitation, any 1 provision of federal law requiring the use of products that contain 2 intentionally added perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances. 3

Sec. 21. 1. A manufacturer shall not sell, offer for sale, 4 distribute for sale or distribute for use in this State any of the 5 following types of products if the product contains intentionally 6 7 added perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances:

8 (a) Carpets or rugs;

(b) Fabric treatments; 9

(c) Food packaging; or 10

(d) Juvenile products. 11

A manufacturer of the products described in subsection 1 12 2. 13 shall include on the product label a statement that is clearly visible and legible in both English and Spanish that reads: "NO 14 PERFLUOROALKYL POLYFLUOROALKYL 15 OR SUBSTANCES WERE INTENTIONALLY ADDED OR USED 16 **TO MAKE THIS PRODUCT."** 17 18

3. The provisions of this section do not apply to:

19 product which contains perfluoroalkyl and (a) A20 polyfluoroalkyl substances due to the use of recycled materials 21 containing perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances in the 22 original product; or

23 (b) A carpet or rug that was manufactured or imported before 24 January 1, 2024.

25 Sec. 22. 1. A manufacturer of cookware sold in this State 26 contains intentionally added that perfluoroalkyl and 27 polyfluoroalkyl substances in the handle of the product or in any 28 product surface that comes into contact with any food or 29 beverages shall:

30 (a) Except as otherwise provided in subsection 3, include on 31 the product label:

32 (1) That the product contains intentionally added 33 perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances; and

(2) A statement, in both English and Spanish, that reads: 34 35 "For more information about the perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances in the product, visit" followed by: 36

(I) An Internet address for a website that provides 37 information about why the perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl 38 substances are intentionally added; and 39

40 (II) A quick response (QR) code or other machinereadable code used for storing an Internet address for the website 41 42 that provides information about why the perfluoroalkyl and 43 polyfluoroalkyl substances are intentionally added:





1 (b) Include in any product listing for online sales in this State, 2 the information required to be included on the product label 3 pursuant to paragraph (a); and

4 (c) Ensure that the information required pursuant to 5 paragraphs (a) and (b) is clearly visible and legible to the 6 customer on the label and on the product listing for online sales.

7 2. A manufacturer shall not claim on the packaging for 8 cookware that the cookware is free of perfluoroalkyl and 9 polyfluoroalkyl substances, unless no individual perfluoroalkyl or 10 polyfluoroalkyl compound has been intentionally added to the 11 cookware.

12 3. Cookware that meets the following requirements is exempt 13 from the requirements of paragraph (a) of subsection 1:

14 (a) The surface area of the cookware cannot fit a product label 15 of at least 2 square inches; and

16 (b) The cookware does not have:

17 (1) An exterior or wrapper on which a product label can 18 appear or be affixed; or

19 (2) A tag or other attachment with information about the 20 product attached to the cookware.

4. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 3, a manufacturer shall not sell, offer for sale, distribute for sale or distribute for use any cookware that contains one or more intentionally added perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances in the handle of the product or in any product surface that comes into contact with food or beverages, unless the manufacturer and the cookware comply with the requirements of this section.

28 Sec. 23. A person who willfully and knowingly violates the 29 provisions of section 21 or 22 of this act is subject to a civil penalty 30 not to exceed \$1,000.

31 Sec. 24. Section 21 of this act is hereby amended to read as 32 follows:

Sec. 21. 1. A manufacturer shall not sell, offer for
sale, distribute for sale or distribute for use in this State any
of the following types of products if the product contains
intentionally added perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl
substances:

- (a) Carpets or rugs;
- (b) Fabric treatments;
- (c) Food packaging; [or]
 - (d) Juvenile products [-];
- 42 (e) Cosmetics;
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- (f) Indoor textile furnishings; or
- 44 (g) Indoor upholstered furniture.





2. A manufacturer of the products described in 1 2 subsection 1 shall include on the product label a statement that is clearly visible and legible in both English and Spanish 3 4 that reads: "NO PERFLUOROALKYL OR 5 POLYFLUOROALKYL SUBSTANCES WERE INTENTIONALLY ADDED OR USED TO MAKE THIS 6 PRODUCT." 7 8

3. The provisions of this section do not apply to:

9 product which contains perfluoroalkyl (a) A and polyfluoroalkyl substances due to the use of recycled 10 11 materials containing perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl 12 substances in the original product; [or]

13 (b) A carpet or rug that was manufactured or imported before January 1, 2024 [-]; or 14

(c) Any other textile product, other than a carpet or rug, that was manufactured or imported before July 1, 2024.

17 Sec. 25. 1. This section and sections 1 to 23, inclusive, of this act become effective on January 1, 2024. 18

19 2. Section 24 of this act becomes effective on July 1, 2024.

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
