SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION—Proposing to amend the Nevada Constitution to provide certain rights to voters.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law provides voters with certain rights. (NRS 293.2546) This resolution proposes to amend the Nevada Constitution by adding a new section to Article 2 to provide similar rights in the Nevada Constitution.

RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF 4 NEVADA, JOINTLY, That a new section, designated Section 1A, be 5 added to Article 2 of the Nevada Constitution to read as follows: 6 7 Sec. 1A. Each voter has the right: 8 1. To receive and cast a ballot that: (a) Is written in a format that allows the clear 9 identification of candidates; and 10 (b) Accurately records the voter's preference in the 11 selection of candidates. 12 2. To have questions concerning voting procedures 13 answered and to have an explanation of the procedures for 14 voting posted in a conspicuous place at the polling place. 15





1	3. To vote without being intimidated, threatened or
2	coerced.
3	4. To vote during any period for early voting or on
4	election day if the voter is waiting in line at a polling place
5	at which, by law, the voter is entitled to vote at the time that
6	the polls close and the voter has not already cast a vote in
7	that election.
8	5. To return a spoiled ballot and receive another ballot
9	in its place.
10	6. To request assistance in voting, if necessary.
11	7. To a sample ballot which is accurate, informative
12	and delivered in a timely manner.
13	8. To receive instruction in the use of the equipment
14	for voting during any period for early voting or on election
15	day.
16	9. To equal access to the elections system without
17	discrimination, including, without limitation, discrimination
18	on the basis of race, age, disability, military service,
19	employment or overseas residence.
20	10. To a uniform, statewide standard for counting and
21	recounting all votes accurately.
22	11. To have complaints about elections and election
23	contests resolved fairly, accurately and efficiently.

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
