MIDDLE SCHOOL STEM INITIATIVES PILOT PROJECT

The foregoing appropriation item 200649, Middle School 20 STEM Initiatives Pilot Project, shall be distributed to the Lake 21 County Educational Service Center for a pilot project that 22 supports innovative STEM initiatives for middle school students 23 in Lake County, such as robotics contests and after-school teams 24 that work with businesses affiliated with the Alliance for 25 Working Together. These initiatives shall provide middle school 26 students with early access to programming, engineering design, 27 and problem-solving skills, the goal of which is to build a 28 strong regional pipeline of future manufacturing workers who can 29 fill high-paying, sustainable positions in the automated 30 manufacturing industry. Not later than April 30, 2016, the Lake 31 County Educational Service Center shall submit a report that 32 describes the progress of the pilot project, including the 33 number of students participating, to the standing committees of 34 the House of Representatives and the Senate that are primarily 35 responsible for considering economic development issues. 36

Section 2. Within the limits set forth in this act, the 37 Director of Budget and Management shall establish accounts 38 indicating the source and amount of money for each appropriation 39 made in this act and shall determine the form and manner in 40 which appropriation accounts shall be maintained. Expenditures 41 from appropriations contained in this act shall be accounted for 42 as though made in the main operating appropriations act of the 43 131st General Assembly. The appropriations made in this act are 44 subject to all provisions of the main operating appropriations 45 act of the 131st General Assembly that are generally applicable 46

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to such appropriations.

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
