A BILL

То	enact sections 3301.95 and 3333.89 of the	1
	Revised Code to establish the Foster-to-College	2
	Scholarship Program, to require the Department	3
	of Education to hire a full-time school foster	4
	care liaison, and to make an appropriation for	5
	the Foster-to-College Scholarship Program.	6

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 3301.95 and 3333.89 of the	7
Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	8
Sec. 3301.95. (A) As used in this section:	9
(1) "School of origin" means the school in which a student	10
was enrolled at the time of each placement into foster care. If	11
the student's foster care placement changes, the school of	12
origin is the school in which the student is enrolled at the	13
time of the change in placement. "School of origin" includes the	14
designated receiving school at the next grade level for feeder	15
school or zone patterns when the student completes the final	16

grade level served by the school of origin. When there is more	17
than one potential school of origin, the department of	18
education, or school foster care liaison under division (B) of	19
this section, shall designate the school of origin using the	20
<pre>student's input.</pre>	21
(2) "Student placed in foster care" means a child who at	22
any time during an academic semester or term is in foster care,	23
including any child who is in the custody of a public children's	24
services agency or private child placing agency or otherwise	25
placed with a licensed foster caregiver. "Student placed in	26
foster care" includes a child who transfers enrollment as a	27
result of being returned to the child's home at the conclusion	28
of the child's placement.	29
(B) If the superintendent of public instruction determines	30
that sufficient funds are available from general revenue fund	31
appropriations made to the department of education, the	32
department shall hire a full-time school foster care liaison.	33
The school foster care liaison shall work with public children	34
services agencies, private child placing agencies, and the	35
department of job and family services to facilitate services to	36
keep students placed in foster care in the student's school of	37
origin or, if the public children services agency or private	38
child placing agency determines that it is not in a student's	39
best interest to remain in the school of origin, facilitate the	40
prompt and appropriate placement, transfer, and enrollment of	41
such a student in another public school.	42
The school foster care liaison's specific duties include:	43
(1) Responding to a request from a public children	44
services agency or private child placing agency for input from a	45
school district or school concerning the determination of	46

whether it is in the best interest of the student placed in	47
foster care to remain in the school of origin;	48
(2) Collaborating with the public children services agency	49
or private child placing agency to ensure that any necessary	50
transportation and services are provided for the student placed	51
in foster care to remain in the student's school of origin;	52
(3) If a public children services agency or private child	53
placing agency determines that it is not in the student's best	54
interest to remain in the school of origin, working with the	55
agency, juvenile probation officer, parents, guardian ad litem	56
or counsel for the student, and foster caregivers to ensure that	57
the student is enrolled in a new school immediately with	58
transition planning, and that the student's complete education	59
information and records are requested immediately by the	60
student's new school upon enrollment;	61
(4) Upon receiving the required notification and	62
invitation, participating in a transition planning meeting	63
regarding the enrollment in a public school of a student placed	64
in foster care from a state-licensed day treatment facility, or	65
hospital, or having a designee participate in the meeting;	66
(5) Participating, or having the liaison's designee	67
participate, in any interagency collaboration team or threat	68
assessment team centered on students placed in foster care,	69
which the school district or school may develop or on which the	70
school district or school may be invited to participate;	71
(6) Providing students placed in foster care with	72
information about the foster-to-college scholarship program_	73
established in section 3333.89 of the Revised Code.	74
Sec. 3333.89. (A) As used in this section:	75

(1) "Chafee ETV grant" means an educational and training	76
voucher program grant made pursuant to the "John H. Chafee	77
Foster Care Program for Successful Transition to Adulthood," 42	78
<u>U.S.C. 677.</u>	79
(2) "Cost of attendance" has the same meaning as in	80
section 3333.37 of the Revised Code.	81
(3) "Federal need analysis" means the methodology	82
determined by the United States department of education to	83
determine the amount of a student's financial need to pay for	84
postsecondary education.	85
(4) "Institution of higher education" has the same meaning	86
as in section 3345.19 of the Revised Code.	87
(5) "Noncertified kinship care" means a public children	88
services agency or private child placing agency has placed a	89
child in the care of a kinship caregiver, as defined in section	90
5101.85 of the Revised Code, who has not met the requirements	91
for a foster home certificate issued under section 5103.03 of	92
the Revised Code or has chosen not to pursue that certificate.	93
(6) "Qualifying student" means a resident of Ohio as	94
defined in section 3333.31 of the Revised Code, who has been	95
accepted for enrollment at an institution of higher education	96
who has been placed in either of the following:	97
(a) Foster care at any time on or after the student's	98
thirteenth birthday;	99
(b) Noncertified kinship care at any time on or after the	100
student's thirteenth birthday and was, at any time, adjudicated	101
an abused child as defined in section 2151.031 of the Revised	102
Code, a neglected child as defined in section 2151.03 of the	103
Revised Code, or a dependent child as defined in section 2151.04	104

of the Revised Code.	105
(B)(1) The foster-to-college scholarship program is	106
established. Under the program, beginning in the 2023-2024	107
academic year, each qualifying student shall be awarded a	108
foster-to-college scholarship based on the student's federal	109
need analysis. The amount of the foster-to-college scholarship	110
shall equal the applicant's recognized cost of attendance after	111
deducting all of the following:	112
(a) The student aid index as calculated by the federal	113
<pre>need analysis;</pre>	114
(b) The amount of any federal Pell grant award for which	115
the applicant is eligible;	116
(c) The amount of any state grant;	117
(d) The federal supplemental educational opportunity	118
grant;	119
(e) The Ohio college opportunity grant, under section	120
3333.122 of the Revised Code;	121
(f) The amount of any other state and federal gift aid;	122
(g) The Chafee ETV grant;	123
(h) Extended foster care benefits under 42 U.S.C. 675(8)	124
<u>(B);</u>	125
(i) The amount of any private grants or scholarships,	126
excluding grants and scholarships provided by the private	127
institution of higher education in which the eligible student is	128
<pre>enrolled;</pre>	129
(j) For public institutions, the sum of all institutional	130
grants, scholarships, tuition waivers, and tuition remission	131

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amounts.	132
(2) The foster scholarship shall be paid directly to the	133
participating institution of higher education in which the	134
student is enrolled.	135
(3) An eligible private institution may choose not to	136
participate in the foster-to-college scholarship program	137
established under this section. To opt out, the institution	138
shall provide notice to the chancellor of higher education by	139
the first day of September for the next academic year.	140
(4) An eligible private institution that chooses to	141
participate in the program and accepts a student's application	142
to attend the institution shall provide institutional grants,	143
scholarships, tuition waivers, or tuition remission in an amount	144
equal to the difference between the institution's cost of	145
attendance and the sum of the scholarship under this division	146
and the sum of the amounts in divisions (B)(1)(a) to (j) of this	147
section.	148
(C) In order to receive a scholarship under the program,	149
the qualifying student shall do all of the following:	150
(1) Complete the free application for federal student aid,	151
including acknowledgement of past or current foster care	152
<pre>placement;</pre>	153
(2) If eligible, complete the application for a Chafee ETV	154
<pre>grant;</pre>	155
(3) Be enrolled in courses leading toward a bachelor's	156
degree, a postgraduate degree, an associate's degree, an	157
industry-recognized credential, or a certificate of completion	158
at an institution of higher education;	159

(4) Request financial assistance in accordance with	160
policies set forth by the institution of higher education;	161
(5) Remain in satisfactory academic standing in accordance	162
with the academic policies of the institution of higher	163
education and be making progress toward completion of the	164
requirements of the educational program in which the student is	165
enrolled.	166
(D)(1) Eligible students shall apply to participate in the	167
program in a form and manner prescribed by the chancellor. The	168
chancellor shall approve each qualifying student who applies and	169
who has a remaining cost of attendance for the period in which	170
the application is approved after all other financial aid for	171
which that applicant qualifies has been applied to the	172
applicant's account at the institution. The chancellor shall	173
approve applications in the order in which they are received.	174
The amount of scholarships awarded shall not exceed the amount	175
appropriated for that purpose.	176
(2) The chancellor shall pay to each institution of higher	177
education in which a participant who receives a scholarship	178
described in division (B) of this section is enrolled the amount	179
of the scholarship awarded under that division.	180
(E) The chancellor shall enter into an agreement with the	181
same organization engaged by the department of job and family	182
services to administer the Chafee ETV program to employ four	183
full-time employees to serve as foster care student navigators	184
and assist prospective qualifying students in applying for and	185
enrolling in institutions of higher education and the foster-to-	186
college scholarship program. The navigators shall work with	187
school district and school foster care liaisons to identify	188
prospective qualifying students. A navigator shall provide_	189

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guidance to prospective	qualifying students w	ith selecting		190
institutions and progra	ms in which the studen	t may wish to		191
enroll. A navigator sha	ll, at the request of	a student, assist		192
the student with comple	ting an institution's	application for		193
admission, the free app	lication for federal s	tudent aid, and, if	_	194
