То	remit funds from the State Fiscal Recovery Fund	1
	to repay unemployment advances, to provide funds	2
	to support improvements at pediatric behavioral	3
	health care facilities, to require the	4
	Development Services Agency to establish the	5
	Water and Sewer Quality Program, and to make	6
	appropriations.	7

# BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 215.10. On August 31, 2021, or as soon as possible	8
thereafter, the Director of Job and Family Services shall	9
certify to the Director of Budget and Management, the President	10
and Minority Leader of the Senate, the Speaker and Minority	11

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Leader of the House of Representatives, and the Governor, the 12 balance of amounts advanced to the state under section 1201 of 13 the "Social Security Act," 42 U.S.C. 1321. Upon receipt of this 14 certification, the Director of Budget and Management shall remit 15 the amount certified, not to exceed the available balance, from 16 the State Fiscal Recovery Fund (Fund 5CV3) to the Unemployment 17 Compensation Fund established in section 4141.09 of the Revised 18 Code. The amount of the remittance is hereby appropriated from 19 Fund 5CV3. The amount remitted shall be credited to the 20 Mutualized Account. The Director of Job and Family Services 21 shall deposit as cash the amount remitted with the Secretary of 22 23 the Treasury of the United States to the credit of the account of this state in the unemployment trust fund established and 24 maintained pursuant to section 904 of the "Social Security Act," 25 42 U.S.C. 1104, to reduce or eliminate the balance of amounts 26 advanced to the state under section 1201 of the "Social Security 27 Act," 42 U.S.C. 1321. 28

On December 27, 2021, or as soon as possible thereafter, 29 the Director of Job and Family Services shall certify to the 30 Director of Budget and Management, the President and Minority 31 Leader of the Senate, the Speaker and Minority Leader of the 32 House of Representatives, and the Governor, the balance of 33 amounts advanced to the state under section 1201 of the "Social 34 Security Act," 42 U.S.C. 1321. Upon receipt of this 35 certification, the Director of Budget and Management shall remit 36 the amount certified, not to exceed the available balance, from 37 the State Fiscal Recovery Fund (Fund 5CV3) to the Unemployment 38 Compensation Fund established in section 4141.09 of the Revised 39 Code. The amount of the remittance is hereby appropriated from 40 Fund 5CV3. The amount remitted shall be credited to the 41 Mutualized Account. The Director of Job and Family Services 42 shall deposit as cash the amount remitted with the Secretary of
the Treasury of the United States to the credit of the account
of this state in the unemployment trust fund established and
maintained pursuant to section 904 of the "Social Security Act,"
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42 U.S.C. 1104, to reduce or eliminate the balance of amounts
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advanced to the state under section 1201 of the "Social Security
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Act," 42 U.S.C. 1321.

Section 215.20. All items in this act are hereby 50 appropriated as designated out of any moneys in the state 51 treasury to the credit of the designated fund. For all operating 52 53 appropriations made in this act, those in the first column are for fiscal year 2022 and those in the second column are for 54 fiscal year 2023. The operating appropriations made in this act 55 are in addition to any other operating appropriations made for 56 the FY 2022-FY 2023 biennium. 57

The foregoing appropriation item 336648, ARPA Pediatric61Behavioral Health, shall be used to support infrastructure62improvements at pediatric behavioral health care facilities to63improve inpatient and outpatient settings.64

Section 215.40. Within the limits set forth in this act, 65 the Director of Budget and Management shall establish accounts 66 indicating the source and amount of funds for each appropriation 67 made in this act, and shall determine the form and manner in 68 which appropriation accounts shall be maintained. Expenditures 69 from operating appropriations contained in this act shall be 70 accounted for as though made in the main operating 71 appropriations act of the 134th General Assembly. The operating 72 appropriations made in this act are subject to all provisions of 73 the main operating appropriations act of the 134th General 74 Assembly that are generally applicable to such appropriations. 75

Section 220.10. All items in Section 220.11 of this act 76 are hereby appropriated as designated out of any moneys in the 77 state treasury to the credit of the designated fund. For all 78 operating appropriations made in Section 220.11 of this act, 79 those in the first column are for fiscal year 2022 and those in 80 the second column are for fiscal year 2023. The operating 81 appropriations made in this act are in addition to any other 82 operating appropriations made for the FY 2022-FY 2023 biennium. 83

The foregoing appropriation item 042526, Coronavirus Local 87 Fiscal Recovery, shall be used by the Director of Budget and 88 Management to disburse funding to nonentitlement units of local 89 government in Ohio, including cities, villages, and townships, 90 on a population basis in accordance with the provisions of the 91 "American Rescue Plan Act of 2021," Pub. L. No. 117-2, and 92 consistent with guidance issued under that act. 93

Section 220.12. Within the limits set forth in this act, 94 the Director of Budget and Management shall establish accounts 95 indicating the source and amount of funds for each appropriation 96 made in this act, and shall determine the form and manner in 97 which appropriation accounts shall be maintained. Expenditures 98 from operating appropriations contained in this act shall be 99 accounted for as though made in the main operating 100 appropriations act of the 134th General Assembly. The operating 101 appropriations made in this act are subject to all provisions of 102 the main operating appropriations act of the 134th General 103 Assembly that are generally applicable to such appropriations. 104

Section 259.10. All items in this section are hereby

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appropriated as designated out of any moneys in the state106treasury to the credit of the designated fund. For all107appropriations made in this act, those in the first column are108for fiscal year 2022 and those in the second column are for109fiscal year 2023. The appropriations made in this act are in110addition to any other appropriations made for the FY 2022-FY1112023 biennium.112

The foregoing appropriation item 1956A1, Water and Sewer 115 Quality Program, shall be used by the Department of Development 116 to make grants under the Water and Sewer Quality Program created 117 in Section 259.30 of this act. Of the foregoing appropriation 118 item 1956A1, Water and Sewer Quality Program, an amount not to 119 exceed one per cent may be used to pay administrative costs of 120 the program. An amount equal to the unexpended, unencumbered 121 balance remaining in the foregoing appropriation item 1956A1, 122 Water and Sewer Quality Program, at the end of fiscal year 2022 123

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is hereby reappropriated for the same purpose in fiscal year 2023.

Section 259.20. Within the limits set forth in this act, 126 the Director of Budget and Management shall establish accounts 127 indicating the source and amount of funds for each appropriation 128 made in this act, and shall determine the form and manner in 129 which appropriation accounts shall be maintained. Expenditures 130 from appropriations contained in this act shall be accounted for 131 as though made in H.B. 110 of the 134th General Assembly. The 132 appropriations made in this act are subject to all provisions of 133 H.B. 110 of the 134th General Assembly that are generally 134 applicable to such appropriations. 135

Section 259.30. As used in this section, "political136subdivision" means a county, township, municipal corporation, or137other body corporate and politic responsible for governmental138activities in a geographic area smaller than that of the state.139

The Department of Development shall utilize the funds 140 appropriated under Section 259.10 of this act to establish and 141 administer the Water and Sewer Quality Program to provide grants 142 to political subdivisions related to water and sewer quality 143 projects. 144

The Department shall determine project eligibility and145establish a means of applying for grants under the program. The146Department shall require a political subdivision that receives147funds under the program to provide a local match or local148contribution. In extraordinary circumstances as determined by149the Department, the Department may waive the local match or150local contribution requirement.151

Not later than sixty days after this section takes effect, 152

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the county engineer of each county in the state shall submit to153the Department a list of projects within the county that are154eligible to receive funding under the program. The list shall155indicate the priority level of each project, in comparison to156the other projects on the list.157

The Department may provide grants under the program for158projects on the list each county engineer is required to submit,159or for projects otherwise submitted by a political subdivision,160so long as a project satisfies the eligibility criteria161established by the Department.162

 Section 812.20. Sections 215.10, 215.20, 215.30, 215.40,
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 220.10, 220.11, 220.12, 259.10, 259.20, and 259.30 of this act
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 are exempt from the referendum under Ohio Constitution, Article
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 II, section 1d and therefore take effect immediately when this
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 act becomes law.
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
