A BILL

To amend section 4755.40 of the Revised Code to	1
modify the laws governing the practice of	2
physical therapy.	3

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4755.40 of the Revised Code be	4
amended to read as follows:	5
Sec. 4755.40. As used in sections 4755.40 to 4755.56 and	6
4755.99 of the Revised Code:	7
(A) (1) "Physical therapy" means the evaluation and	8
treatment of a person by physical measures and the use of	9
therapeutic exercises and rehabilitative procedures, with or	10
without assistive devices, for the purpose of preventing,	11
correcting, or alleviating any disability physical impairments,	12
functional limitations, and physical disabilities. "Physical	13
therapy" includes physiotherapy. If	14
With respect to the evaluation of a person, "physical	15
therapy" includes determining a diagnosis in order to treat the	16
person's physical impairments, functional limitations, and	17

<u>a plan of therapeutic intervention.</u>	19
"Physical therapy" includes ordering tests, including	20
diagnostic imaging and studies, that are performed and	21
interpreted by other licensed health care professionals.	22
If performed by a person who is adequately trained,	23
physical therapy includes all of the following:	24
(1) The <u>the</u> design, fabrication, <u>and revision of various</u>	25
assistive devices, and the provision of education $_{ au}$ and	26
instruction in the use of various assistive <u>those</u> devices,	27
including braces, splints, ambulatory or locomotion devices,	28
wheelchairs, prosthetics, and orthotics ;	29
(2) The "Physical therapy" includes the administration of	30
topical drugs that have been prescribed by a licensed health	31
professional authorized to prescribe drugs, as defined in	32
section 4729.01 of the Revised Code;	33
(3) The "Physical therapy" includes the establishment and	34
modification of physical therapy programs, treatment planning,	35
patient education and instruction, and consultative services $ au$	36
(4) Physiotherapy.	37
(2) "Physical measures" include massage and other manual	38
therapy techniques, heat, cold, air, light, water, electricity	39
except as provided in division (A)(3) of this section, sound,	40
and the performance of tests of neuromuscular function as an aid	41
to such <u>the provision of</u> treatment.	42
(3) "Physical therapy" does not include the medical	43
diagnosis of a patient's disability, the use of Roentgen rays or	44
radium for diagnostic or therapeutic purposes, or <u>except</u> to the	45

extent that division (A)(1) of this section includes the	46
ordering of tests.	47
"Physical therapy" does not include the use of electricity	48
for cauterization or other surgical purposes.	49
(B) "Physical therapist" means a person who practices or	50
provides patient education and instruction in physical therapy	51
and includes a physiotherapist.	52
(C) "Physical therapist assistant" means a person who	53
assists in the provision of physical therapy treatments,	54
including the provision of patient education and instruction,	55
under the supervision of a physical therapist.	56
(D) "Supervision" means the availability and	57
responsibility of the supervisor for direction of the actions of	58
the person supervised.	59
Section 2. That existing section 4755.40 of the Revised	60
Code is hereby repealed.	61

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
