A BILL

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section 1
4503.578 of the Revised Code to create the "Keep 2
Ohio Beautiful" license plate. 3

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.21 be amended and section 4
4503.578 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows: 5

Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state 6
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 7
consist of all contributions paid by motor vehicle registrants 8
and collected by the registrar of motor vehicles pursuant to 9
sections 4503.491, 4503.492, 4503.493, 4503.494, 4503.495, 10
4503.496, 4503.497, 4503.498, 4503.499, 4503.4910, 4503.4911, 11
4503.50, 4503.501, 4503.502, 4503.505, 4503.506, 4503.508, 12

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 34
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 35

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 36
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 37
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 38
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 39
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 40
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 41
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 42
other abortion-related activities. 43

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 44
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 45
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 46
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 47
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 48

the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 49
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 50
other money in that fund. 51

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 52
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 53
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 54
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 55

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 56
receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 57
national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 58
amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 59
chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 60
chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 61
assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 62
directly to their clients. 63

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 64
receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 65
national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 66
it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with 67
pancreatic cancer and their families. 68

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 69
receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the 70
Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the 71
contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social 72
support services for adults who have sickle cell disease. 73

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 74
receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the 75
St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for 76
its research and other programs. 77

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund research for the cure of childhood cancers.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the contributions into its general account to be used for educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of America foundation.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 107
pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 108
cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 109
scholarships and other educational activities. 110

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 111
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 112
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 113
contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 114
that organization. 115

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 116
receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 117
Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 118
scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or 119
events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 120

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 121
pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the 122
organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that 123
organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in 124
need. 125

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 126
receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a 127
kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 128
Ohio chapters of a kid again. 129

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 130
receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 131
university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 132
collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 133
section. A university or college that receives contributions 134
from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 135

scholarship fund. 136

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 137
receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 138
university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 139
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 140
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 141
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 142
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 143
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 144
funds as provided in this section. 145

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 146
receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 147
Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 148
for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 149
cyclists of all ages. 150

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 151
receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 152
"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 153
incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 154
of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 155
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 156
educational, and cultural events at the monument. 157

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 158
receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 159
fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 160
the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 161
lighthouses of fairport harbor. 162

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 163
receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 164

Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 165
contributions only to promote and support the football team of 166
Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 167

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 168
receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 169
United States power squadron districts seven, eleven, twenty- 170
four, and twenty-nine in equal amounts. Each power squadron 171
district shall use the money it receives under this section to 172
pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 173
sponsors within this state. 174

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 175
receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 176
Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 177
international, which shall use the money it receives under this 178
section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 179
activities. 180

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 181
receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 182
Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 183
under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 184
its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 185
to children, young adults, and families in this state. 186

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 187
receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 188
Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 189
receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 190
to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 191
to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 192
their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 193
research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 194

the improvement of patient outcomes. 195

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 196
receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 197
thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 198
organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 199
organization in paying for the charitable activities and 200
programs it sponsors in support of United States military 201
personnel, veterans, and their families. 202

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 203
receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 204
disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 205
programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 206
families. 207

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 208
receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 209
pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 210
into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 211
be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 212
hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 213
of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 214
destination. 215

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 216
the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 217
to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 218
the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 219
programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 220

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 221
contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 222
4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 223

source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 224
designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 225
Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 226
section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 227
cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 228
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 229
pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 230
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 231

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 232
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 233
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 234

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 235
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 236
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 237
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 238
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 239
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 240
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 241
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 242
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 243
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 244
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 245
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 246
under this section. 247

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 248
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 249
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 250
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 251
programs. 252

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 253

receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 254
western reserve historical society, which shall use the 255
contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 256

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 257
receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the 258
Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple 259
negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the 260
contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 261

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 262
receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the 263
central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, 264
which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the 265
Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory 266
the person who paid the contribution resides. 267

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 268
receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 269
state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 270
deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 271
establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 272
distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 273
ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 274
for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 275
managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 276
Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 277
registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 278
such payments are to be made. 279

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 280
receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 281
Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 282
expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 283

river watershed.	284
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve.	285 286 287 288
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use the money in support of the park.	289 290 291 292
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the contributions for wildlife preservation purposes.	293 294 295 296
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the contributions to support the activities of the organization.	297 298 299 300

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 323
receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the 324
Ohio sons of the American legion, which shall use the 325
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 326

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 327
pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 328
contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 329
applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 330
professional sports team located in the county of that sports 331
commission and that is participating in the license plate 332
program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 333
of the county of residence of an applicant. 334

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 335
contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 336
the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 337
that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 338
participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 339
(G) of that section. 340

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 341

receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 342
pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 343
which shall use the contributions for the protection and 344
preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 345
Ohio and for educational programs. 346

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 347
receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 348
pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 349
supporting cancer research. 350

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 351
receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 352
Stan Hywet hall and gardens. 353

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 354
receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the 355
Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad. 356

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 357
receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 358
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 359
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 360
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 361

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 362
receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 363
girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 364
heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 365
manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 366
scouts. 367

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 368
receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 369
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 370

shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 371
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 372

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 373
receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the 374
charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., 375
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 376

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 377
receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the 378
Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, 379
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 380

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 381
receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 382
Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 383
of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 384
charitable purposes. 385

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 386
receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the 387
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 388
deposit the fees into its general account to be used for 389
purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated. 390

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 391
receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 392
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 393
deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 394
used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 395
enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 396
methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 397

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 398
pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 399

concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 400
contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 401
to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 402
in the line of duty. 403

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 404
pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater 405
Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 406
contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 407
the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 408

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 409
pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 410
association of chiefs of police. 411

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 412
receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 413
fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 414
to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 415
families. 416

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 417
receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the 418
fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall 419
use the contributions to further the mission of the commission. 420

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 421
receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 422
organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 423
association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 424
Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 425
shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 426
administering a program to secure the proper representation in 427
the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 428

children, and for the training and supervision of persons 429
participating in that program. 430

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 431
receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the 432
Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the 433
contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state. 434

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 435
receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the 436
Ohio Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, 437
which shall use the contributions for programs, education, and 438
advocacy purposes throughout the state. 439

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 440
receives pursuant to section 4503.725 of the Revised Code to the 441
ALS association central & southern Ohio chapter, which shall 442
split the contributions between that chapter and the ALS 443
association northern Ohio chapter in accordance with any 444
agreement between the two associations. The contributions shall 445
be used to discover treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, 446
advocate for, and empower people affected by ALS to live their 447
lives to the fullest. 448

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 449
receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to 450
Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the 451
contributions into its general account to be used for purposes 452
of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated. 453

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 454
receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the 455
Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to 456
commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in 457

Cleveland, Ohio. 458

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 459
receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 460
central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research 461
foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the 462
chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose 463
geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 464
resides. 465

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 466
receives pursuant to section 4503.734 of the Revised Code to the 467
Ohio highway patrol auxiliary foundation, which shall use the 468
contributions to fulfill the foundation's mission of supporting 469
law enforcement education and assistance. 470

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 471
receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the 472
Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the 473
moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section 474
4503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written 475
agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos. 476

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 477
receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the 478
rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston, 479
Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and 480
used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the 481
rotary foundation. 482

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 483
receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the 484
Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the 485
contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained 486

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1042
receives pursuant to section 4503.957 of the Revised Code to 1043
John F. Kennedy Catholic school located in Warren. The school 1044
shall not use the contributions it receives for any political 1045
purpose. 1046

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1047
receives pursuant to section 4503.958 of the Revised Code to 1048
Elder high school located in the municipal corporation of 1049
Cincinnati. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 1050
contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 1051
students, twenty-five per cent of the contributions to benefit 1052
arts and enrichment at the school, and twenty-five per cent of 1053
the contributions to benefit athletics at the school. 1054

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1055
receives pursuant to section 4503.961 of the Revised Code to 1056
Fairfield senior high school located in the municipal 1057
corporation of Fairfield. The high school shall not use the 1058
contributions for any political purpose. 1059

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1060
receives pursuant to section 4503.962 of the Revised Code to 1061
Hamilton high school located in the municipal corporation of 1062
Hamilton. The high school shall not use the contributions for 1063

any political purpose. 1064

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1065
receives pursuant to section 4503.963 of the Revised Code to 1066
Ross high school located in Ross township in Butler county. The 1067
high school shall not use the contributions for any political 1068
purpose. 1069

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1070
receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the 1071
friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money 1072
to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free 1073
emergency medical first response throughout Israel. 1074

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1075
receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the 1076
Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and 1077
activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the 1078
city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park." 1079

(C) All investment earnings of the license plate 1080
contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than 1081
the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall 1082
distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this 1083
section the investment income the fund earned the previous 1084
calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an 1085
entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity 1086
received from the fund during the previous calendar year. 1087

Sec. 4503.578. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger 1088
car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other 1089
vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles 1090
may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle 1091
and issuance of "Keep Ohio Beautiful" license plates. 1092

The application may be combined with a request for a 1093
special reserved license plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 1094
of the Revised Code. Upon receipt of the completed application 1095
and compliance by the applicant with divisions (B) and (C) of 1096
this section, the registrar shall issue to the applicant the 1097
appropriate vehicle registration and a set of "Keep Ohio 1098
Beautiful" license plates and a validation sticker, or a 1099
validation sticker alone when required by section 4503.191 of 1100
the Revised Code. 1101

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily 1102
inscribed on the license plates, "Keep Ohio Beautiful" license 1103
plates shall display an appropriate logo and words selected by 1104
representatives of keep Ohio beautiful, incorporated, and that 1105
are approved by the registrar. "Keep Ohio Beautiful" license 1106
plates shall display county identification stickers that 1107
identify the county of registration as required under section 1108
4503.19 of the Revised Code. 1109

(B) "Keep Ohio Beautiful" license plates and a validation 1110
sticker, or validation sticker alone, shall be issued upon 1111
receipt of an application for registration of a motor vehicle 1112
under this section; payment of the regular license tax as 1113
prescribed under section 4503.04 of the Revised Code, any 1114
applicable motor vehicle license tax levied under Chapter 4504. 1115
of the Revised Code, any applicable additional fee prescribed by 1116
section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code, an additional 1117
administrative fee of ten dollars, and a contribution as 1118
provided in division (C)(1) of this section; and compliance with 1119
all other applicable laws relating to the registration of motor 1120
vehicles. 1121

(C) (1) For each application for registration and 1122

registration renewal notice the registrar receives under this 1123
section, the registrar shall collect a contribution of twenty 1124
dollars. The registrar shall deposit this contribution into the 1125
state treasury to the credit of the license plate contribution 1126
fund created in section 4501.21 of the Revised Code. 1127

(2) The registrar shall deposit the administrative fee of 1128
ten dollars, the purpose of which is to compensate the bureau of 1129
motor vehicles for additional services required in the issuing 1130
of "Keep Ohio Beautiful" license plates, into the state treasury 1131
to the credit of the public safety - highway purposes fund 1132
created in section 4501.06 of the Revised Code. 1133

Section 2. That existing section 4501.21 of the Revised 1134
Code is hereby repealed. 1135
