BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.21 be amended and section	4
4503.520 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	5
Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state	6
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall	7
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid	8
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of	9
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced	10
in division (B) of this section.	11
(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the	12
registrar collects in the fund as follows:	13
The registrar shall pay the contributions received	14
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast	15
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for	16
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast	17
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to	18
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of	19

the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 20 other abortion-related activities. 21 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 22 receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 23 organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 24 deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 25 organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 26 the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 27 manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 28 other money in that fund. 29 The registrar shall pay the contributions received 30 pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 31 society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 32 and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 33 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 34 receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 35 national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 36

amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley37chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These38chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to39assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services40directly to their clients.41

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar42receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the43national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money44it receives under this section to assist those who have45pancreatic cancer and their families.46

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar47receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the48

Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar52receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the53St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for54its research and other programs.55

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 56 receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to 57 special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions 58 for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities. 59

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar60receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the61children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the62contributions for its research and other programs.63

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar64receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to65the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to66raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic67pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.68

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 69 receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 70 the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 71 children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 72 research for the cure of childhood cancers. 73

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 74 receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 75 future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 76 contributions into its general account to be used for 77

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educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 78 America foundation. 79 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 80 receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 81 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 82 extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 83 the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 84 85 The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 86 cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 87 scholarships and other educational activities. 88 The registrar shall pay the contributions received 89 pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 90 organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 91 contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 92 that organization. 93 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 94 receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 95 Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 96 97 scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 98 99 The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.507 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 100 aerospace institute, which shall use those contributions to 101

programming.103The registrar shall pay the contributions received104pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the105

facilitate student internships in aerospace and educational

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 109 receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a 110 kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 111 Ohio chapters of a kid again. 112

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 113 receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 114 university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 115 collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 116 section. A university or college that receives contributions 117 from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 118 scholarship fund. 119

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 120 receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 121 university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 122 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 123 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 124 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 125 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 126 university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 127 funds as provided in this section. 128

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 129 receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to 130 Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes 131 of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who 132 attend the university. The university shall not use any of the 133 funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship 134 program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements 135 with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such 136

funds as provided in this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 138 receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the 139 university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of 140 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 141 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 142 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 143 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 144 university of Alabama to effectuate the distribution of such 145 funds as provided in this section. 146

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar147receives pursuant to section 4503.518 of the Revised Code to the148Nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the149contributions for the "On Our Sleeves" campaign.150

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 151 receives pursuant to section 4503.519 of the Revised Code 152 equally to NAMI Ohio (national alliance on mental illness of 153 Ohio), Ohio peer recovery organizations, and OCAAR (Ohio citizen 154 advocates for addiction recovery). 155

156 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.520 of the Revised Code to 157 Purdue university in West Lafayette, Indiana, for purposes of 158 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 159 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 160 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 161 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with 162 Purdue university to effectuate the distribution of such funds 163 as provided in this section. 164

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

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receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 166 Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 167 for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 168 cyclists of all ages. 169

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 170 receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 171 "friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 172 incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 173 of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 174 expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 175 educational, and cultural events at the monument. 176

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar177receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the178fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for179the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the180lighthouses of fairport harbor.181

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar182receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the183Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the184contributions only to promote and support the football team of185Washington high school of the Massillon city school district.186

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 187 receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 188 United States power squadron district seven which shall annually 189 distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United 190 States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron 191 district shall use the money it receives under this section to 192 pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 193 sponsors within this state. 194

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 195 receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 196 Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 197 international, which shall use the money it receives under this 198 section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 199 activities. 200

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 201 receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 202 Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 203 under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 204 its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 205 to children, young adults, and families in this state. 206

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 207 receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 208 Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 209 receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 210 to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 211 to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 212 213 their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 214 research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and the improvement of patient outcomes. 215

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 216 receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 217 thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 218 organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 219 organization in paying for the charitable activities and 220 programs it sponsors in support of United States military 221 personnel, veterans, and their families. 222

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar223receives pursuant to section 4503.532 of the Revised Code to the224

Ohio history connection, which shall use the contributions for 225 the benefit of the Paul Laurence Dunbar house. 226 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 227 receives pursuant to section 4503.533 of the Revised Code to the 228 nonprofit organization Ohio conference of teamsters and industry 229 health and welfare fund, which shall use the contributions to 230 further the nonprofit's mission. 231 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 232 receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 233 disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 234 programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 235 families. 236 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 237 receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 238 pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 239 into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 240 be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 241 hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 242 of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 243 destination. 244

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 245 the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 246 to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 247 the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 248 programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 249

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the250contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section2514503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other252source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is253

designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The254Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this255section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and256cats and for educational programs concerning the proper257veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio258pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and259maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties.260

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar261receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the262rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated.263

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 264 receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 265 Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 266 corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 267 the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 268 members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 269 charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 270 provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 271 Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 272 for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 273 promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 274 incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 275 under this section. 276

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 277 receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 278 Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 279 the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 280 programs. 281

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar282receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the283

western reserve historical society, which shall use the 284 contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 285

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 286 receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the 287 Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple 288 negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the 289 contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 290

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 291 receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the 292 central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, 293 which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the 294 Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory 295 the person who paid the contribution resides. 296

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 297 receives pursuant to section 4503.559 of the Revised Code to 298 playhouse square, located in Cleveland, Ohio, which shall use 299 the contributions to further its mission of presenting and 300 producing a wide variety of quality performing arts, advancing 301 arts education, and creating a superior destination for 302 entertainment, business, and residential living. 303

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 304 receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 305 state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 306 deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 307 establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 308 distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 309 ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 310 for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 311 managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 312 Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 313 such payments are to be made.

receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 317 Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 318 expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 319 river watershed. 320

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 321 receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the 322 Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen 323 nature preserve. 324

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use the money in support of the park.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 329 receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the 330 Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the 331 contributions for wildlife preservation purposes. 332

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 333 receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the 334 girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the 335 contributions to support the activities of the organization. 336

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 342

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receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 343 Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 344 contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 345 information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 346 local beekeeping programs. 347

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar348receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the349national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the350contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace351legends to inspire future leaders.352

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 353 receives pursuant to section 4503.578 of the Revised Code to 354 keep Ohio beautiful, incorporated, which shall use the 355 contributions towards its mission of empowering Ohio communities 356 to take greater responsibility for improving the local 357 environment through litter prevention, beautification, community 358 greening, waste reduction, and recycling. 359

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 360 receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 361 national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use 362 the contributions for educational purposes. 363

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 364 receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the 365 Ohio past detachment commander's club, inc., which shall use the 366 contributions to support the activities of the organization. 367

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 368 receives pursuant to section 4503.582 of the Revised Code to the 369 progressive animal welfare society adoption center, inc., which 370 shall use the contributions to support the activities of the 371 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar373receives pursuant to section 4503.583 of the Revised Code to the374American legion, department of Ohio, inc., which shall use the375contributions to support the activities of the organization.376

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 377 receives pursuant to section 4503.584 of the Revised Code to the 378 Ohio oil and gas energy education foundation to fund 379 scholarships for students pursuing careers in the oil and 380 natural gas industry. 381

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 382 pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 383 contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 384 applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 385 professional sports team located in the county of that sports 386 commission and that is participating in the license plate 387 program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 388 of the county of residence of an applicant. 389

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each390contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of391the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates392that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is393participating in the license plate program pursuant to division394(G) of that section.395

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 396 receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 397 pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 398 which shall use the contributions for the protection and 399 preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 400

Ohio and for educational programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar402receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to403pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of404supporting cancer research.405

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar406receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the407Stan Hywet hall and gardens.408

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.597 of the Revised Code to the Circleville pumpkin show, incorporated, which shall use the contributions to promote good will surrounding the Circleville pumpkin show as a nonprofit annual event.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar417receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the418Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council419shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner420throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.421

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 422 receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 423 girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 424 heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 425 manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 426 scouts. 427

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar428receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the429

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Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council430shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner431throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.432

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar433receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the434charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m.,435which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes.436

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar437receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the438Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio,439which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes.440

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 441 receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 442 Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 443 of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 444 charitable purposes. 445

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar446receives pursuant to section 4503.703 of the Revised Code to the447Ohio chapter of the loyal order of the moose.448

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 449 receives pursuant to section 4503.704 of the Revised Code to the 450 Antioch shrine foundation located in the municipal corporation 451 of Dayton. 452

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar453receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the454fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall455deposit the fees into its general account to be used for456purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated.457

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 458

receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 459 fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 460 deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 461 used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 462 enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 463 methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 464

The registrar shall pay the contributions received465pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio466concerns of police survivors, which shall use those467contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate468to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed469in the line of duty.470

The registrar shall pay the contributions received471pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater472Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those473contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in474the line of duty and support its charitable purposes.475

The registrar shall pay the contributions received476pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio477association of chiefs of police.478

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 479 receives, or has received, pursuant to section 4503.715 of the 480 Revised Code to the community foundation of Ohio's electric 481 cooperatives, which shall use the contributions to recognize and 482 memorialize fallen or injured lineworkers and support their 483 families. 484

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar485receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the486fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall487

lives to the fullest.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 489 receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 490 organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 491 association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 492 Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 493 shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 494 administering a program to secure the proper representation in 495 the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 496 497 children, and for the training and supervision of persons participating in that program. 498 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 499 receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the 500 Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the 501 contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state. 502 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 503 receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the 504 Ohio Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, 505 which shall use the contributions for programs, education, and 506 advocacy purposes throughout the state. 507 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 508 receives pursuant to section 4503.725 of the Revised Code to the 509 ALS association central & southern Ohio chapter, which shall 510 split the contributions between that chapter and the ALS 511 association northern Ohio chapter in accordance with any 512 agreement between the two associations. The contributions shall 513 be used to discover treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, 514 advocate for, and empower people affected by ALS to live their 515

The school shall use fifty per cent of the1148contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its1149students, twenty-five per cent of the contributions to benefit1150

arts and enrichment at the school, and twenty-five per cent of1151the contributions to benefit athletics at the school.1152The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1153receives pursuant to section 4503.961 of the Revised Code to1154

Fairfield senior high school located in the municipal1155corporation of Fairfield. The high school shall not use the1156contributions for any political purpose.1157

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1158receives pursuant to section 4503.962 of the Revised Code to1159Hamilton high school located in the municipal corporation of1160Hamilton. The high school shall not use the contributions for1161any political purpose.1162

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1163receives pursuant to section 4503.963 of the Revised Code to1164Ross high school located in Ross township in Butler county. The1165high school shall not use the contributions for any political1166purpose.1167

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1168receives pursuant to section 4503.964 of the Revised Code to1169Chardon hilltopper gridiron club. The club shall use1170contributions to fund college and career technical training1171scholarships for students.1172

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1173receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the1174friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money1175to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free1176emergency medical first response throughout Israel.1177

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1178 receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the 1179 Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and1180activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the1181city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park."1182

(C) All investment earnings of the license plate 1183 contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than 1184 the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall 1185 distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this 1186 section the investment income the fund earned the previous 1187 calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an 1188 entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity 1189 received from the fund during the previous calendar year. 1190
