BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 5.2298 and 3345.43 of the Revised	9
Code be enacted to read as follows:	10
Sec. 5.2298. The month of April is designated as "Respect	11
Your Date Month" to increase public awareness of dating	12
violence, domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking, and rape	13
<u>on college campuses.</u>	14
Sec. 3345.43. (A)(1) Each state institution of higher	15
education, as defined in section 3345.011 of the Revised Code,	16
shall adopt a policy regarding incidents of dating violence,	17
domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking, and rape on campus.	18
The policy shall include the procedure for reporting such	19

incidents and the institutional plan for investigating and	20				
responding to such incidents. The policy also shall describe the	21				
consequences for committing an incident of dating violence,					
domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking, or rape on campus,					
including the institutional disciplinary proceedings and the	24				
possible penalties that may be imposed. The institution shall	25				
keep a record of all reports of such incidents that it receives.	26				
Each institution may include other incidents related to	27				
dating violence, domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking, or	28				
rape in the policy adopted under this section.	29				
(2) Each policy adopted pursuant to this section shall be	30				
developed with the goal of enhancing due process in regard to	31				
incidents of dating violence, domestic violence, sexual assault,	32				
stalking, and rape on campus and to better define the protocols	33				
provided for under the "Clery Act," 20 U.S.C. 1092(f), and Title	34				
IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, 20 U.S.C. 1681 et seq.	35				
(B)(1) Each state institution of higher education annually	36				
shall provide a copy of the policy adopted pursuant to division	37				
(A) of this section to each student enrolled in that	38				
institution. Not later than one year after the effective date of	39				
this section, the institution shall include a copy of the policy	40				
in the packet of documents that students are required to sign	41				
upon enrollment at the institution or during student					
orientation.	43				
<u>(2) Upon receipt, each student shall sign an</u>	44				
acknowledgment of receipt of a copy of the policy. In lieu of	45				
this requirement, the president of the institution, or the	46

president's designee, may sign a statement confirming that all					
students received a copy of the policy. The statement shall be	48 49				
filed with the registrar of the institution.					

(C) Each state institution of higher education shall post	50
copies of the institution's policy adopted pursuant to this	51
section in multiple, prominent locations across campus. The	52
definitions listed in division (D) of this section shall be	53
displayed prominently on each copy posted.	54
At a minimum, copies of the policy shall be posted each	55
year during the month of April to coincide with "Respect Your	56

(D) As used in this section:	59
(1) "Dating violence," "domestic violence," "sexual_	60
assault," and "stalking" have the same meanings as in the	61
"Violence Against Women Act," 42 U.S.C. 13925, as amended.	62
(2) "Rape" means a violation of section 2907.02 of the	63
Revised Code.	64
For purposes of the definitions listed in divisions (D)(1)	65
and (2) of this section, "consent" shall have the same meaning	66
as in the federal uniform code of military justice, 10 U.S.C.	67

Each state institution of higher education may expand upon	69
these definitions to address additional situations and incidents	70
related to the policy adopted pursuant to this section.	71
Section 2. This act shall be known as the "Respect Your	72
Date Act."	73
Section 3. This act is hereby declared to be an emergency	74
measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public	75
peace, health, and safety. The reason for such necessity is to	76
ensure safety on college campuses across the state for the	77
