BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 2925.62 of the Revised Code be	4	
enacted to read as follows:	5	
Sec. 2925.62. (A) As used in this section:	6	
(1) "Dextromethorphan" means the dextrorotatory isomer of	7	
3-methoxy-N-methylmorphinan, including its salts, but not	8	
including its racemic or levorotatory forms.	9	
(2) "Evidence of majority and identity" means a document	10	
issued by the federal government or a state, county, or		
municipal government, or a subdivision or agency of any of the	12	
foregoing, including a driver's or commercial driver's license,	13	
an identification card issued under sections 4507.50 to 4507.52	14	
of the Revised Code, a military identification card, or any	15	
other form of identification that bears the name, date of birth,	16	
description, and picture of the person identified.	17	

(3) "Retailer" means a place of business that offers	18	
consumer products for sale to the general public, including a	19	
place of business that is licensed under Chapter 4729. of the	20	
Revised Code as a terminal distributor of dangerous drugs.	21	
(B) No retailer or employee of a retailer shall knowingly	22	
supply, deliver, give, or otherwise provide a drug, material,	23	
compound, mixture, preparation, or substance containing any	24	
quantity of dextromethorphan through the sale of any product to	25	
a person under eighteen years of age, unless the person has a	26	
prescription for the product being purchased.	27	
(C) For purposes of division (B) of this section, the	28	
person making the sale of a product containing dextromethorphan	29	
shall require and obtain evidence of majority and identity from	30	
the purchaser, unless from the purchaser's outward appearance	31	
the person making the sale would reasonably presume the	32	
purchaser to be twenty-five years of age or older. Proof that	33	
the person making the sale demanded, was shown, and acted in	34	
reasonable reliance on the purchaser's evidence of majority and	35	
identity is a defense to any charge of a violation of division	36	
(B) of this section.	37	
(D) A retailer or employee of a retailer is not liable for	38	
damages in a civil action for injury, death, or loss to person	39	
or property that allegedly arises from an act or omission	40	
associated with a failure to prevent the sale of a product	41	
containing dextromethorphan to a person under eighteen years of	42	
age, unless the act or omission constitutes willful or wanton	43	
misconduct.	44	
(E) Whoever violates division (B) of this section is	45	
guilty of illegally selling dextromethorphan, a minor		
misdemeanor.
