BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

54 board, may authorize a disbursement from the fund for services
55 rendered under the contract.

(E) One or both of the directors shall adopt rules under
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Chapter 119. of the Revised Code as necessary to administer this
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section, including-a <u>all of the following:</u>
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(1) A rule requiring adherence to United States food and60drug administration regulations governing the conduct of61clinical practice and clinical trials;62

(2) A rule requiring that a peer-to-peer support network63be established and made available by the supplier to any64individual receiving treatment under the program;65

(3) A rule establishing the program protocol will be to66use adapted stimulation frequency and intensity modulation based67on a daily EEG and motor threshold testing as well as clinical68symptoms and signs, and biometrics;69

(4) A rule requiring that each individual who receives70treatment under the program also must receive pre- and post-71neurophysiological monitoring, with EEG and autonomic nervous72systems assessments, daily checklists of symptoms of alcohol,73opioid, or other substance use, and weekly medical counseling74and wellness programming, and also must participate in the peer-75to-peer support network established by the supplier;76
