BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 3319.301 of the Revised Code be	4
amended to read as follows:	5
Sec. 3319.301. (A) As used in this section:	6
(1) "Career-technical provider" means any of the	7
<pre>following:</pre>	8
(a) A joint vocational school district;	9
(b) A school district that is a participant in a compact	10
career-technical education provider, as defined in section	11
3326.01 of the Revised Code;	12
(c) A school district that is a comprehensive career-	13
technical education provider, as defined in section 3326.01 of	
the Revised Code;	15
(d) A school district that provides career-technical	16

courses.		
(2) "Dropout recovery community school" means a community	18	
school established under Chapter 3314. of the Revised Code in	19	
which a majority of the students are enrolled in a dropout	20	
prevention and recovery program that is operated by the school.	21	
(2) (3) "Industry-recognized credential program" means a	22	
career-technical course in which a student may earn an industry-	23	
recognized credential approved under section 3313.6113 of the	24	
Revised Code.	25	
(3) (4) "Public safety officer" means any of the	26	
<pre>following:</pre>	27	
(a) A corrections officer, as defined in section 2941.1412	28	
of the Revised Code;	29	
(b) Emergency medical services personnel, as defined in	30	
section 2133.21 of the Revised Code;	31	
Section 2133.21 of the Nevisea code,	31	
(c) An emergency service telecommunicator, as defined in	32	
section 4742.01 of the Revised Code;	33	
(d) A firefighter, as defined in section 3937.41 of the	34	
Revised Code;	35	
(e) A law enforcement officer, as defined in section	36	
3937.41 of the Revised Code;	37	
(f) A dispatcher employed by a police, fire, or sheriff's	38	
department or the state highway patrol or a civilian dispatcher	39	
employed by a public employer other than a police, fire, or	40	
sheriff's department to dispatch police, fire, sheriff's	41	
department, or emergency medical or rescue personnel and units.	42	
(5) "STEM school" means a science, technology,	43	

engineering,	and mathematics school	established under Chapter	44
3326. of the	Revised Code.		45

(B) The state board of education shall issue permits to 46 individuals who are not licensed as required by sections 3319.22 47 to 3319.30 of the Revised Code, but who are otherwise qualified, 48 to teach classes for not more than a total of twelve hours a 49 week, except that an individual teaching in a STEM school or an-50 individual teaching an industry recognized credential program-51 offered at a dropout recovery community school described in 52 division (F) of this section may teach classes for not more than 53 a total of forty hours a week. The state board, by rule, shall 54 set forth the qualifications, other than licensure under 55 sections 3319.22 to 3319.30 of the Revised Code, to be met by 56 individuals in order to be issued a permit as provided in this 57 section. Such qualifications shall include the possession of a 58 baccalaureate, master's, or doctoral degree in, or significant 59 experience related to, the subject the individual is to teach. 60 For an individual assigned to teach a career-technical class, 61 significant experience related to a subject shall include 62 career-technical experience. Applications for permits pursuant 63 to this section shall be made in accordance with section 3319.29 64 of the Revised Code. A permit issued under this section shall be 65 renewable. 66

The state board, by rule, shall authorize the board of education of each school district—and—, each STEM school, and each dropout recovery community school to engage individuals holding permits issued under this section to teach classes for not more than the total number of hours a week specified in the permit. The rules shall include provisions with regard to each of the following:

(1) That a board of education—or_,_STEM school, or dropout_	74
recovery community school shall engage a nonlicensed individual	75
to teach pursuant to this section on a volunteer basis, or by	76
entering into a contract with the individual or the individual's	77
employer on such terms and conditions as are agreed to between	78
the board or school and the individual or the individual's	79
employer;	80
(2) That an employee of the board of education—or_,_STEM	81
school, or dropout recovery community school who is licensed	82
under sections 3319.22 to 3319.30 of the Revised Code shall	83
directly supervise a nonlicensed individual who is engaged to	84
teach pursuant to this section until the superintendent of the	85
school district or the chief administrative officer of the STEM	86
school or dropout recovery community school is satisfied that	87
the nonlicensed individual has sufficient understanding of, and	88
experience in, effective teaching methods to teach without	
supervision.	90
(C) A nonlicensed individual engaged to teach pursuant to	91
this section is a teacher for the purposes of Title XXXIII of	92
the Revised Code except for the purposes of Chapters 3307. and	93
3317. and sections 3319.07 to 3319.31 of the Revised Code. Such	94
an individual is not an employee of the board of education—or	95
STEM school, or dropout recovery community school for the	96
purpose of Titles I or XLI or Chapter 3309. of the Revised Code.	97
(D) Students enrolled in a class taught by a nonlicensed	98
individual pursuant to this section and rules adopted thereunder	99
shall receive the same credit as if the class had been taught by	100
an employee licensed pursuant to sections 3319.22 to 3319.30 of	101
the Revised Code.	102

engage any one or more nonlicensed individuals if such	104
employment displaces from employment an existing licensed	105
employee of the district.	106
(F) The state board shall issue a permit to teach not more	107
than forty hours a week under division (B) of this section to	108
any of the following:	
(1) An individual teaching in a STEM school;	110
(2) An individual teaching an industry-recognized	111
<pre>credential program at a dropout recovery community school;</pre>	112
(3) An individual teaching practical exercises in a	113
career-technical course offered by a career-technical provider	114
and designed to prepare students to work as a public safety	115
officer.	116
