BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 4729.281 and 4729.283 be amended	4
and section 3902.70 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as	5
follows:	
Sec. 3902.70. (A) As used in this section:	7
(1) "Cost-sharing requirement" means the cost to a covered	8
person under a health benefit plan according to any coverage	9
limit, copayment, coinsurance, deductible, or other out-of-	10
pocket expense requirement.	
(2) "Covered person," "health benefit plan," and "health	12
plan issuer" have the same meanings as in section 3922.01 of the	13
Revised Code.	14

(3) "Licensed health professional authorized to prescribe	15
drugs" has the same meaning as in section 4729.01 of the Revised	16
Code.	17
(B) Notwithstanding section 3901.71 of the Revised Code,	18
<u>if a health plan issuer covers a prescription drug under a</u>	19
health benefit plan, the health plan issuer shall also provide	20
coverage for that drug not more than three times during any	20
twelve-month period when it is dispensed by a pharmacist to a	21
covered person in accordance with section 4729.281 of the	23
Revised Code.	24
A health benefit plan shall not impose cost-sharing	25
requirements for a drug dispensed in accordance with section	26
4729.281 of the Revised Code that are greater than those imposed	27
when that drug is dispensed in accordance with a prescription	28
issued by a licensed health professional authorized to prescribe	29

Sec. 4729.281. (A) A pharmacist may dispense or sell a	31
dangerous drug, other than a schedule II controlled substance as	32
defined in section 3719.01 of the Revised Code, without a	33
written or oral prescription from a licensed health professional	34

(1) The pharmacy at which the pharmacist works practices	37
has a record of a prescription for the drug in the name of the	38

(A) A pharmacist may dispense naltrexone 108 without a written or oral prescription from a licensed health 109 professional authorized to prescribe drugs if all of the 110 following conditions are met: 111 (1) The pharmacist is able to verify a record of a 112 prescription for the injectable long-acting or extended-release 113 form of naltrexone in the name of the patient who is requesting 114 the drug, but the prescription does not provide for a refill or 115 the time permitted by rules adopted by the state board of 116 pharmacy for providing refills has elapsed. 117 (2) The pharmacist is unable to obtain authorization to 118 refill the prescription from the prescriber who issued it or 119 another prescriber responsible for the patient's care. 120 (3) In the exercise of the pharmacist's professional 121 judgment, the pharmacist determines that both of the following 122 are the case: 123 (a) The drug is necessary to continue the patient's 124 therapy for substance use disorder. 125 (b) Failure to dispense the drug to the patient could 126 result in harm to the health of the patient. 127 (B) Before dispensing naltrexone under this section, the 128 pharmacist shall offer the patient the choice of receiving 129

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either the oral form or injectable long-acting or extended-130release form, but only if both forms of the drug are available131for dispensing at the time of the patient's request or within132one day after the request.133

(C) (1) With respect to naltrexone dispensed in an oral
form under this section, the pharmacist shall not dispense an
amount that exceeds a five-day supply.

(2) With respect to naltrexone dispensed in an injectable
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 long-acting or extended-release form under this section, both of
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 the following apply:
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(a) The pharmacist shall exercise professional judgment indetermining the amount of the drug dispensed.141

(b) The pharmacist may administer the drug by injection to
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 the patient but only in accordance with section 4729.45 of the
 Revised Code.

(D) A pharmacist who dispenses naltrexone under this 145 section shall do all of the following: 146

(1) For one year after the date of dispensing, maintain a
record in accordance with this chapter of the drug dispensed,
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including the amount and form dispensed, the original
prescription number, the name and address of the patient, and,
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if the individual receiving the drug is not the patient, the
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name and address of that individual;

(2) Notify the prescriber who issued the <u>original</u>
prescription described in division (A) (1) of this section or
another prescriber responsible for the patient's care not later
than five days after the drug is dispensed;

(3) If applicable, obtain authorization for additional 157

dispensing from one of the prescribers described in division (D)		
(2) of this section.	159	
(E) A pharmacist shall exercise professional judgment in	160	
determining the number of times naltrexone may be dispensed	161	
under this section to the same patient.	162	
(F) This section does not limit the authority of a	163
