#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 4513.35 and 4513.39 of the	9
Revised Code be amended to read as follows:	10
Sec. 4513.35. (A) All fines collected under sections	11
4511.01 to 4511.78, 4511.99, and 4513.01 to 4513.37 of the	12
Revised Code shall be paid into the county treasury and, with	13
the exception of that portion distributed under section 307.515	14
of the Revised Code, shall be placed to the credit of the fund	15
for the maintenance and repair of the highways within that	16

(2) All fines collected from, and all moneys arising from 54 bonds forfeited by, persons arrested under division (E)(3) of 55 section 2935.03 of the Revised Code are deemed to be collected, 56 and to arise, from arrests made within the jurisdiction in which 57 the arresting officer is appointed, elected, or employed, for 58 violations of municipal ordinances that are substantially 59 equivalent to one of the sections or one of the provisions of 60 one of the chapters of the Revised Code listed in division (E) 61 (1) of that section and for violations of one of the sections or 62 one of the provisions of one of the chapters of the Revised Code 63 listed in division (E)(1) of that section, and shall be 64 distributed accordingly. 65

Sec. 4513.39. (A) The state highway patrol and sheriffs or 66 their deputies shall exercise, to the exclusion of all other 67 peace officers except within municipal corporations and except 68 as specified in division (B) of this section and division (E) of 69 section 2935.03 of the Revised Code, the power to make arrests 70 for violations on all state highways, of sections 4503.11, 71 4503.21, 4511.14 to 4511.16, 4511.20 to 4511.23, 4511.26 to 72 4511.40, 4511.42 to 4511.48, 4511.58, 4511.59, 4511.62 to 73 4511.71, 4513.03 to 4513.13, 4513.15 to 4513.22, 4513.24 to 74 4513.34, 4549.01, 4549.08 to 4549.12, and 4549.62 of the Revised 75 76 Code.

- (B) A member of the police force of a township police 77 district created under section 505.48 of the Revised Code or of 78 a joint police district created under section 505.482 of the 79 Revised Code, and a township constable appointed pursuant to 80 section 509.01 of the Revised Code, who has received a 81 certificate from the Ohio peace officer training commission 82 under section 109.75 of the Revised Code, shall exercise the 83 power to make arrests for violations of those sections listed in 84 division (A) of this section, other than sections 4513.33 and 85 4513.34 of the Revised Code, as follows: 86
- 87 (1) If the population of the township that created the township or joint police district served by the member's police 88 force or the township that is served by the township constable 89 is fifty thousand or less, the member or constable shall 90 exercise that power on those portions of all state highways, 91 except those highways included as including those highways that 92 are part of the national highway system but that are not part of 93 the interstate system, as defined in section 5516.01 of the 94 Revised Code, that are located within the township or joint 95 police district, in the case of a member of a township or joint 96 police district police force, or within the unincorporated 97 territory of the township, in the case of a township constable; 98
- (2) If the population of the township that created the township or joint police district served by the member's police force or the township that is served by the township constable is greater than fifty thousand, the member or constable shall exercise that power on those portions of all state highways—and—highways included as—, including any highway that is a part of the interstate highway system—or otherwise a part of the—national highway system, as defined in section 5516.01 of the—Revised Code,—that are located within the township or joint
