## A BILL

	3727.14 and to enact section 3727.131 of the	2
	Revised Code to require the Department of Health	3
	to establish and maintain a stroke registry	4
	database and to provide for the recognition of	5
	thrombectomy-capable stroke centers.	6

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 3727.11, 3727.12, 3727.13,	and 7
3727.14 be amended and section 3727.131 of the Revised Co	ode be 8
enacted to read as follows:	9
Sec. 3727.11. A hospital shall not represent itself	as a 10
comprehensive stroke center, <u>thrombectomy-capable stroke</u>	center, 11
primary stroke center, or acute stroke ready hospital unl	less it 12
is recognized as such by the department of health under s	section 13
3727.13 of the Revised Code.	14
This section does not prohibit a hospital from	15

representing itself as having a relationship or affiliation with 16

a hospital recognized by the department of health under section173727.13 of the Revised Code or a hospital in another state that18is certified as a comprehensive stroke center, thrombectomy-19capable stroke center, primary stroke center, or acute stroke20ready hospital by an accrediting organization approved by the21federal centers for medicare and medicaid services.22

Sec. 3727.12. (A) A person or government entity seeking 23 recognition of a hospital as a comprehensive stroke center, 24 <u>thrombectomy-capable stroke center, primary stroke center, or 25</u> acute stroke ready hospital by the department of health under 26 section 3727.13 of the Revised Code shall file with the 27 department an application for recognition. The application shall 28 be submitted in the manner prescribed by the department. 29

(B) (1) To be eligible for recognition as a comprehensive
30 stroke center under section 3727.13 of the Revised Code, a
hospital must be certified as a comprehensive stroke center by
an accrediting organization approved by the federal centers for
medicare and medicaid services or an organization acceptable to
the department under division (C) of this section.

(2) To be eligible for recognition as a thrombectomy-36capable stroke center under section 3727.13 of the Revised Code,37a hospital must be certified as a thrombectomy-capable stroke38center by an accrediting organization approved by the federal39centers for medicare and medicaid services or an organization40acceptable to the department under division (C) of this section.41

(3) To be eligible for recognition as a primary stroke42center under section 3727.13 of the Revised Code, a hospital43must be certified as a primary stroke center by an accrediting44organization approved by the federal centers for medicare and45medicaid services or an organization acceptable to the46

# department under division (C) of this section.

(3) (4)To be eligible for recognition as an acute stroke48ready hospital under section 3727.13 of the Revised Code, a49hospital must be certified as an acute stroke ready hospital by50an accrediting organization approved by the federal centers for51medicare and medicaid services or an organization acceptable to52the department under division (C) of this section.53

(C) For purposes of division (B) of this section, to be
54 acceptable to the department an organization must certify
55 comprehensive stroke centers, thrombectomy-capable stroke
56 centers, primary stroke centers, or acute stroke ready hospitals
57 in accordance with nationally recognized certification
58 guidelines.

Sec. 3727.13. (A) (1) The department of health shall60recognize as a comprehensive stroke center a hospital that61satisfies the requirements of division (B) (1) of section 3727.1262of the Revised Code and submits a complete application.63

(2) (a) (2) The department shall recognize as a thrombectomy-capable stroke center a hospital that satisfies the requirements of division (B)(2) of section 3727.12 of the Revised Code and submits a complete application.

(3) (a) The department shall recognize as a primary stroke center a hospital that satisfies the requirements of division (B) (2) (B) (3) of section 3727.12 of the Revised Code and submits a complete application.

(b) If a hospital satisfying the requirements of division
(B) (2) (B) (3) of section 3727.12 of the Revised Code has
73 attained supplementary levels of stroke care distinction as
74 identified by an accrediting organization approved by the
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federal centers for medicare and medicaid services or an76organization accepted by the department under section 3727.12 of77the Revised Code, including by offering patients mechanical78endovascular therapy, the department shall include that79distinction in its recognition.80

(3) (4) The department shall recognize as an acute stroke ready hospital a hospital that satisfies the requirements of division (B)(3) (B)(4) of section 3727.12 of the Revised Code and submits a complete application.

(B) The department shall end its recognition of a hospital made under division (A) of this section if the accrediting organization described in division (B) of section 3727.12 of the Revised Code that certified the hospital revokes, rescinds, or otherwise terminates the hospital's certification with that organization or the certification expires.

(C) Not later than the first day of January and July each 91 year, the department shall compile and send a list of hospitals 92 recognized under division (A) of this section to the medical 93 director and cooperating physician advisory board of each 94 emergency medical service organization, as defined in section 95 4765.01 of the Revised Code. The department also shall maintain 96 a comprehensive list of recognized hospitals on its internet web 97 site and update the list not later than thirty days after a 98 hospital is recognized under division (A) of this section or its 99 recognition ends under division (B) of this section. 100

Sec. 3727.131. (A) (1) In an effort to improve the quality101of care for patients affected by stroke, the department of102health shall establish and maintain a process for the103collection, transmission, compilation, and oversight of data104related to stroke care. Such data shall be collected,105

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transmitted, compiled, and overseen in a manner prescribed by	106	
the director of health.		
As part of the process and except as provided in division	108	
(A) (2) of this section, the department shall establish or	109	
utilize a stroke registry database to store information,	110	
statistics, and other data on stroke care, including		
information, statistics, and data that align with nationally		
recognized treatment guidelines and performance measures.	113	
(2) If the department established or utilized, prior to	114	
the effective date of this section, a stroke registry database	115	
that meets the requirements of this section, then both of the	116	
following apply:	117	
(a) Division (A)(1) of this section shall not be construed	118	
to require the department to establish or utilize another such

(b) The department shall maintain both the process and	121	
stroke registry database described in this section, including in	122	
the event federal moneys are no longer available to support the	123

the federal centers for medicare and medicaid services or an	210

four levels described in sections 3727.11 to 3727.13 of the	214
Revised Code, the department of health shall recognize a	215
