BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 4755.60 and 4755.62 be amended	4
and section 4755.621 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as	5
follows:	6
Sec. 4755.60. As used in sections 4755.60 to 4755.65 and	7
4755.99 of the Revised Code:	8
(A) "Athletic training" means the practice of all of the	9
<pre>following:</pre>	10
(1) The prevention, recognition, and assessment of an	11
athletic injury and the examination, and athletic training	12
diagnosis of injuries or conditions resulting from physical	13
activities that require physical skill and utilize strength,	14
power, endurance, speed, flexibility, range of motion, or	15
agility;	16

(2) The complete management, treatment, disposition, and	17
reconditioning of acute athletic injuries upon the referral of	18
an individual authorized under Chapter 4731. of the Revised Code	19
to practice medicine and surgery, osteopathic medicine and	20
surgery, or podiatry, a dentist licensed under Chapter 4715. of	21
the Revised Code, a physical therapist licensed under this-	22
chapter, or a chiropractor licensed under Chapter 4734. of the	23
Revised Code. Athletic training includes the or conditions	24
resulting from physical activities;	25
(3) The provision of emergent care, therapeutic	26
interventions, and rehabilitation for injuries or conditions	27
resulting from physical activities;	28
(4) The promotion of and education about wellness;	29
(5) The administration of topical drugs that have been	30
prescribed by a licensed health professional authorized to	31
prescribe drugs, as defined in section 4729.01 of the Revised	32
Code. Athletic training also includes the, and are administered	33
under the direction of the prescriber;	34
(5) The organization and administration of educational	35
programs and athletic training facilities, and the;	36
(6) The performance of athletic training research;	37
(7) The education of and consulting with the public as it	38
pertains to athletic training.	39
(B) "Athletic trainer" means a person who meets the	40
qualifications of this chapter for licensure and who is employed	41
by an educational institution, professional or amateur	42
organization, athletic facility, or health care facility to	43
<pre>practice engages in the practice of athletic training consistent</pre>	44
with the person's education and training.	45

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(C) "The national athletic trainers association, inc."	46
means the national professional organization of athletic-	47
trainers that provides direction and leadership for quality-	48
athletic training practice, education, and researchAthletic	49
training diagnosis" means the judgment made after examining,	50
evaluating, assessing, or interpreting symptoms presented by a	51
patient to establish the cause and nature of the patient's	52
injury, condition, or functional impairment and the plan of care	53
for that injury, condition, or impairment within the scope of	54
athletic training. "Athletic training diagnosis" does not	55
include a medical diagnosis.	56
(D) "Athletic injury" means any injury sustained by an-	57
individual that affects the individual's participation or	58
performance in sports, games, recreation, exercise, or other-	59
activity that requires physical strength, agility, flexibility,	60
speed, stamina, or range of motionCollaboration agreement" is an	61
agreement that satisfies the requirements of section 4755.621 of	62
the Revised Code.	63
Sec. 4755.62. (A) No person shall claim to the public to	64
be an athletic trainer or imply by words, actions, or letters	65
that the person is an athletic trainer, or otherwise engage in	66
the practice of athletic training, unless the person is licensed	67
as an athletic trainer pursuant to this chapter.	68
(B) Except as otherwise provided in division (B) of	69
section 4755.65 of the Revised Code, no educational institution,	70
partnership, association, or corporation shall advertise or	71
otherwise offer to provide or convey the impression that it is	72
providing athletic training unless an individual licensed as an	73
athletic trainer pursuant to this chapter is employed by, or	74

under contract to, the educational institution, partnership,

association, or corporation and will be performing the athletic	76
training services to which reference is made.	77
(C) To qualify for an athletic trainers license, a person	78
shall:	79
(1) Have satisfactorily completed an application for	80
licensure in accordance with rules adopted by the athletic	81
trainers section of the Ohio occupational therapy, physical	82
therapy, and athletic trainers board under section 4755.61 of	83
the Revised Code;	84
(2) Have paid the examination fee required under this	85
section;	86
(3) Be of good moral character;	87
(4) Have shown, to the satisfaction of the athletic	88
trainers section, that the applicant has received a	89
baccalaureate or higher degree from an institution of higher	90
education, approved by the athletic trainers section of the	91
board and the federal regional accreditation agency and	92
recognized by the council on postsecondary accreditation, and	93
has satisfactorily completed the educational course work	94
requirements established by rule of the athletic trainers	95
section under section 4755.61 of the Revised Code.	96
(5) In addition to educational course work requirements,	97
have obtained supervised clinical experience that meets the	98
requirements established in rules adopted by the athletic	99
trainers section under section 4755.61 of the Revised Code;	100
(6) Have passed an examination adopted by the athletic	101
trainers section under division (A)(8) of section 4755.61 of the	102
Revised Code. Each applicant for licensure shall pay, at the	103
time of application, the nonrefundable examination fee set by	104

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the athletic trainers section.	
(D) The section may waive the requirements of division (C)	106
of this section for any applicant who presents proof of current	107
licensure in another state whose standards for licensure, as	108
determined by the section, are equal to or greater than those in	109
effect in this state on the date of application.	110
(E) The section shall issue a license to every applicant	111
who complies with the requirements of division (C) of this	112
section, files the required application form, and pays the fees	113
required by section 4755.61 of the Revised Code. A-Each licensee	114
shall display the licensee's license in a conspicuous place at	115
the licensee's principal place of employment.	116
A license issued under this section entitles the holder to	117
engage in the practice of athletic training, claim to the public	118
to be an athletic trainer, or to imply by words or letters that	119
the licensee is an athletic trainer. Each licensee shall display	120
the licensee's license in a conspicuous place at the licensee's	121
principal place of employmentA license issued under this section	122
does not entitle the holder to provide, offer to provide, or	123
represent that the holder is qualified to provide any care or	124
services for which the holder lacks the education, training, or	125
experience to provide or is prohibited by law from providing.	126
Sec. 4755.621. (A) As used in this section, "physician"	127
means an individual authorized under Chapter 4731. of the	128
Revised Code to practice medicine and surgery, osteopathic	129
medicine and surgery, or podiatric medicine and surgery.	130
(B) (1) A person licensed as an athletic trainer pursuant	131
to this chapter shall engage in the practice of athletic	132

training only if the person acts as follows:

(a) Upon the referral of one or more of the following:	134
(i) A physician;	135
(ii) A dentist licensed under Chapter 4715. of the Revised	136
Code;	137
(iii) A physical therapist licensed under this chapter;	138
(iv) A chiropractor licensed under Chapter 4734. of the	139
Revised Code;	140
(v) Subject to division (B)(2) of this section, an	141
athletic trainer licensed under this chapter;	142
(vi) A physician assistant licensed under Chapter 4730. of	143
the Revised Code;	144
(vii) A certified nurse practitioner licensed under_	145
Chapter 4723. of the Revised Code.	146
(b) Pursuant to a collaboration agreement that satisfies	147
the requirements of division (C) of this section.	148
(2) A person licensed as an athletic trainer may practice	149
athletic training upon the referral of an athletic trainer	150
described in division (B)(1)(a)(v) of this section only if the	151
athletic training has already been recommended and referred by a	152
health care provider described in division (B)(1)(a) of this	153
section who is not an athletic trainer.	154
(C) A person licensed as an athletic trainer pursuant to	155
this chapter shall enter into a collaboration agreement with one	156
or more physicians. The agreement shall be in writing and signed	157
by the athletic trainer and each physician with whom the	158
athletic trainer collaborates. A copy of the agreement shall be	159
maintained in the records of the athletic trainer and each	160

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collaborating physician. The agreement shall address all of the	161
following:	162
(1) The duties and responsibilities to be fulfilled by the	163
athletic trainer when engaging in the practice of athletic	164
training;	165
(2) Any limitations on the athletic trainer's practice of	166
athletic training;	167
(3) A plan of care for patients treated by the athletic	168
trainer.	169
Section 2. That existing sections 4755.60 and 4755.62 of	170
the Revised Code are hereby repealed.	171
