## A BILL

To enact section 3333.27 of the Revised Code to	1
create the STEM Degree Loan Repayment Program	2
and to make an appropriation.	3

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 3333.27 of the Revised Code be	4
enacted to read as follows:	5
Sec. 3333.27. (A) As used in this section:	6
(1) "Eligible participant" means an individual to whom all	7
of the following apply:	8
(a) The individual holds an associate, bachelor's,	9
master's, or doctorate degree in a STEM-related field awarded on	10
or after July 1, 2016, by any public or private institution of	11
higher education in this state.	12
(b) The individual has outstanding student loans for the	13
degree described in division (A)(1)(a) of this section.	14
(c) The individual is employed in a STEM-related field in	15
the state.	16

(d) The individual has applied for and was approved to	17
participate in the STEM degree loan repayment program.	18
(2) "Employed in the state" means that an individual is	19
employed by an entity that has a valid mailing address in the	20
state or is self-employed using a valid mailing address in the	21
state.	22
(3) "STEM" is an abbreviation for "science, technology,	23
engineering, and mathematics."	24
(4) "STEM-related field" has the meaning as determined by	25
the chancellor of higher education for the purposes of this	26
section.	27
(B) The chancellor of higher education shall establish and	28
administer the STEM degree loan repayment program. The program	29
shall begin to operate on July 1, 2017. Under the program, the	30
chancellor shall pay the amounts specified in division (E) of	31
this section to repay outstanding student loans for degrees	32
described in division (A)(1)(a) of this section on behalf of	33
eligible participants who are graduates of Ohio colleges and	34
universities with STEM degrees and are employed in STEM-related	35
fields in the state.	36
The general assembly shall appropriate funds specifically	37
for the purpose of this section out of the STEM degree loan	38
repayment program fund, which is hereby created in the state	39
treasury.	40
(C) The chancellor shall adopt rules to administer the	41
program.	42
(D) The chancellor shall establish an application process	43
for the program. The chancellor shall conduct two application	44
periods each year for the STEM degree loan repayment program as	45

follows:	46
(1) One application period with a deadline of the	47
thirtieth day of June of each year;	48
(2) One application period with a deadline of the thirty-	49
first day of December of each year.	50
The chancellor shall notify an applicant of the	51
chancellor's decision within ninety days of the application	52
deadline. The application shall require proof of employment in	53
the state in a STEM-related field.	54
(E)(1) The annual amount for awards under the program	55
shall be as follows for the highest level of education attained:	56
(a) \$2,000 for an eligible participant who has been	57
awarded an associate degree;	58
(b) \$4,000 for an eligible participant who has been	59
awarded a bachelor's degree;	60
<u>(c) \$8,000 for an eligible participant who has been</u>	61
<u>awarded a graduate degree.</u>	62
(2) Awards shall be paid on behalf of an eligible	63
participant as long as the general assembly appropriates funds	64
for the program, or there are sufficient funds in the STEM	65
degree loan repayment program fund, and only so long as the	66
eligible participant remains employed in the state in a STEM-	67
related field. The chancellor shall cease making payments on	68
behalf of an eligible participant once the participant's loans	69
are paid in full.	70
(3) The chancellor shall disburse each grant award twice a	71
year in accordance with division (F) of this section.	72

(4) If, for any fiscal year, the amounts available for	73
support of the program are insufficient to provide grants to all	74
eligible participants, the chancellor shall proportionately	75
reduce the amount of each grant to be awarded for the fiscal	76
year.	77
(F)(1) The chancellor shall make payments on behalf of	78
eligible participants on the thirtieth day of April and the	79
	-
<u>thirty-first day of October of each year.</u>	80
(2) An eligible participant shall provide proof of	81
employment in the state in a STEM-related field as frequently	82
as, and in the manner, required by the chancellor. Upon	83
receiving evidence of the eligible graduate's employment in the	84
state, the chancellor shall make semiannual payments directly to	85
the eligible participant's lender. If an eligible participant	86
has more than one loan, the chancellor shall determine the	87
method by which payments shall be disbursed and for which loans.	88
(3) The participant shall continue to be eligible for the	89
program so long as the participant is employed in a STEM-related	90
field. If the participant changes places of employment, the	91
participant shall notify the chancellor of that change. The	92
chancellor shall verify that the participant's new employment is	93
in a STEM-related field.	94

The chancellor shall cease making payments on behalf of a	95
participant who ceases to be employed in a STEM-related field	96
until the participant finds new employment in a STEM-related	97
field. A former participant who is not employed in a STEM-	98
related field for one year or more shall reapply in order to	99
participate in the program.	100
(G) Each participant in the STEM degree loan repayment	101

program shall sign a promissory note payable to the state in the					102	
event the participant does not satisfy the employment					103	
requirements of the program. The amount payable under the note					104	
shall be the amount of total loan repayment made on behalf of						105
the participant under the program prorated for the period the						
participant worked in the state in a STEM field. The terms of					107

## H. B. No. 549 As Introduced

The foregoing appropriation item 235564, STEM Degree Loan130Repayment Program, shall be used by the Chancellor of Higher131Education to provide grants under the STEM Degree Loan Repayment132Program pursuant to section 3333.27 of the Revised Code.133

Section 3. Within the limits set forth in this act, the134Director of Budget and Management shall establish accounts135indicating the source and amount of funds for each appropriation136made in this act, and shall determine the form and manner in137which appropriation accounts shall be maintained.138

Expenditures from the FY 2017 appropriation contained in 139 this act shall be accounted for as though made in Am. Sub. H.B. 140 64 of the 131st General Assembly. The FY 2017 appropriation made 141 in this act is subject to all provisions of Am. Sub. H.B. 64 of 142 the 131st General Assembly that are generally applicable to such 143 appropriations. Expenditures from the FY 2018 appropriation 144 contained in this act shall be accounted for as though made in 145 the main operating appropriations act of the 132nd General 146 Assembly. The FY 2018 appropriation made in this act is subject 147 to all provisions of the main operating appropriations act of 148 the 132nd General Assembly that are generally applicable to such 149 150 appropriations.

Section 4. On July 1, 2017, or as soon as possible 151 thereafter, the Director of Budget and Management shall transfer 152 \$2,000,000 cash from the General Revenue Fund to the STEM Degree 153 Loan Repayment Program Fund (Fund 5SF0). 154
