BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 2303.12 of the Revised Code be	7

Sec. 2303.12. (A) As used in this section:	9
(1) "Case file" means the compendium of original documents	10
filed in a civil action or proceeding in the court of common	11
pleas, including the pleadings, motions, orders, and judgments	12
of the court on a case by case basis.	
(2) "General docket" means the appearance docket, trial	14
docket, journal, execution docket, and case files in relation to	15
those dockets and journal.	16

(B) The clerk of the court of common pleas shall keep at	1.7
least four books. They shall be called the appearance docket,	18
