#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

<b>Section 1.</b> That sections 3701.24 and 3701.50 be amended	5
and section 3701.2410 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as	6
follows:	7
<b>Sec. 3701.24.</b> (A) As used in this section and sections 3701.241 to 3701.249 3701.2410 of the Revised Code:	8
(1) "AIDS" means the illness designated as acquired immunodeficiency syndrome.	10 11
(2) "HIV" means the human immunodeficiency virus identified as the causative agent of AIDS.	12 13
(3) "AIDS-related condition" means symptoms of illness related to HIV infection, including AIDS-related complex, that are confirmed by a positive HIV test.	14 15 16
(4) "HIV test" means any test for the antibody or antigen	17

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to HIV that has been approved by the director of health under	18
division (B) of section 3701.241 of the Revised Code.	19
(5) "Health care facility" has the same meaning as in	20
section 1751.01 of the Revised Code.	21
(6) "Director" means the director of health or any	22
employee of the department of health acting on the director's	23
behalf.	24
(7) "Physician" means a person who holds a current, valid	25
certificate issued under Chapter 4731. of the Revised Code	26
authorizing the practice of medicine or surgery and osteopathic	27
medicine and surgery.	28

(8) "Nurse" means a registered nurse or licensed practical	29
nurse who holds a license or certificate issued under Chapter	30
4723. of the Revised Code.	31
(9) "Anonymous test" means an HIV test administered so	32
that the individual to be tested can give informed consent to	33
the test and receive the results by means of a code system that	34
does not link the identity of the individual tested to the	35
request for the test or the test results.	36
(10) "Confidential test" means an HIV test administered so	37
that the identity of the individual tested is linked to the test	38
but is held in confidence to the extent provided by sections	39
3701.24 to 3701.248 of the Revised Code.	40
(11) "Health care provider" means an individual who	41
provides diagnostic, evaluative, or treatment services. Pursuant	42
to Chapter 119. of the Revised Code, the director may adopt	43
rules further defining the scope of the term "health care	44
provider."	45

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(12) "Significant exposure to body fluids" means a	46
percutaneous or mucous membrane exposure of an individual to the	47
blood, semen, vaginal secretions, or spinal, synovial, pleural,	48
peritoneal, pericardial, or amniotic fluid of another	49
individual.	50
(13) "Emergency medical services worker" means all of the	51
following:	52
(a) A peace officer;	53
(b) An employee of an emergency medical service	54
organization as defined in section 4765.01 of the Revised Code;	55
(c) A firefighter employed by a political subdivision;	56
(d) A volunteer firefighter, emergency operator, or rescue	57
operator;	58
(e) An employee of a private organization that renders	59

(B) Persons designated by rule adopted by the director	67
under section 3701.241 of the Revised Code shall report promptly	68
every case of AIDS, every AIDS-related condition, and every	69
confirmed positive HIV test to the department of health on forms	70
and in a manner prescribed by the director. In each county the	71
director shall designate the health commissioner of a health	72
district in the county to receive the reports.	73

(C) No person shall fail to comply with the reporting	74
requirements established under division (B) of this section.	75
(D) Information reported under this section that	76
identifies an individual is confidential and may be released	77
only with the written consent of the individual except as the	78
director determines necessary to ensure the accuracy of the	79
information, as necessary to provide treatment to the	80
individual, as ordered by a court pursuant to section 3701.243	81
or 3701.247 of the Revised Code, or pursuant to a search warrant	82
or a subpoena issued by or at the request of a grand jury,	83
prosecuting attorney, city director of law or similar chief	84
legal officer of a municipal corporation, or village solicitor,	85

HIV test to be conducted when the professional first examines	104
the woman related to her pregnancy unless the woman refuses the	105
test.	106
(2) A licensed health care professional who provides care	107
to a pregnant woman during the third trimester of gestation	108
shall conduct an assessment at the time the professional first	109
examines the woman related to her pregnancy during that	110
trimester to determine whether any activities posing a risk of	111
infection with HIV have occurred more recently than would have	112
been detected by the most recent test during the pregnancy, if	113
any. In conducting the assessment, the licensed health care	114
professional shall consider information available from the	115
United States centers for disease control and prevention	116
concerning risk factors for transmission. If the licensed health	117
care professional determines that activities posing a risk of	118
infection with HIV have occurred, or that no test has been	119
conducted during the pregnancy, the professional shall cause an	120
HIV test to be conducted unless the woman refuses the test.	121
(C) Subject to division (D) of this section, a licensed	122
health care professional who provides care to a pregnant woman	123
at delivery shall determine whether the woman's medical records	124

for disease control and prevention concerning risk factors for	128
transmission of HIV and shall ask the woman whether any	129
activities posing such a risk have occurred more recently than	130
would have been detected by that test. If the licensed health	131
care professional determines that no HIV test was conducted	132
during her third trimester, or that activities posing a risk of	133

HIV infection have occurred more recently than would have been	
detected by the most recent test, the professional shall cause	135
an HIV test to be conducted at the time of delivery unless the	136
woman refuses the test.	137
(D)(1) Before an HIV test is conducted pursuant to	138
division (B) or (C) of this section, the licensed health care	139
professional shall inform the woman that the test will be	140
conducted and of her right to refuse.	141
(2) If a woman's medical record indicates that another	142
licensed health care professional has complied with the	143
requirements of divisions (B) and (C) of this section for the	144
pregnancy, the treating licensed health care professional is not	145
required to comply with the requirements of those divisions.	146
(E) If the results of an HIV test conducted pursuant to	147
this section are positive, the licensed health care professional	148
shall provide post-test counseling to the woman in accordance	149
with any rules adopted pursuant to section 3701.242 of the	150
Revised Code.	151
(F) A licensed health care professional who causes an HIV	152
test or assessment to be conducted pursuant to this section	153
shall record that information in the woman's medical records. If	154
a woman refuses an HIV test offered pursuant to this section,	155
the professional shall record her refusal in her medical	156
records.	157
(G) The director of health may adopt rules in accordance	158
with Chapter 119. of the Revised Code as the director considers	159
appropriate to implement this section.	160

(B) (1) Except as provided in divisions (B) (2) and (3) of	171
this section, every physician who attends any pregnant woman for	172
conditions relating to pregnancy during the period of gestation	173
shall take specimens of such woman at the time of first	174
examination or within ten days thereof, and shall submit such	175
specimens to an approved laboratory for standard syphilis and	176
gonorrhea tests.	177
(2) If, in the opinion of the physician attending such	178
woman, her condition does not permit the taking of specimens for	179
submission to an approved laboratory, then no specimens shall be	180
taken prior to delivery. If no specimens are taken prior to	181
delivery because of the woman's condition, then such specimens	182
shall be taken as soon after delivery as the physician deems it	183
advisable.	184
(3) The health commissioner of the city or general health	185
district, wherein any person required to be tested for syphilis	186
and gonorrhea under division (B)(1) of this section or section	187
3701.49 of the Revised Code resides, may waive the those	188
requirements of such sections if the commissioner is satisfied	189
by written affidavit or other written proof that the tests	190
required are contrary to the tenets or practices of the	191

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religious creed of which the person is an adherent, and that the	192
public health and welfare would not be injuriously affected by	193
such waiver.	194
(C)(1) A licensed health care professional who provides	195
prenatal care to a pregnant woman during the third trimester of	196
gestation shall conduct an assessment when the professional	197
first examines the woman during that trimester to determine	198
whether any activities posing a risk of infection with syphilis	199
or gonorrhea have occurred more recently than would have been	200
detected by the most recent test during the pregnancy, if any.	201
In conducting the assessment, the licensed health care	202
professional shall consider information available from the	203
United States centers for disease control and prevention	204
concerning risk factors for transmission.	205
Unless the licensed health care professional has	206
determined that the pregnant woman's condition does not permit	207
the test to be conducted, if the licensed health care	208
professional determines that activities posing a risk of	209
syphilis or gonorrhea infection have occurred more recently than	210
would have been detected by the most recent test, or that no	211
test has been conducted during the pregnancy, the professional	212
shall cause tests for syphilis and gonorrhea to be conducted	213
unless the woman refuses the test.	214
If the third trimester assessment is not conducted because	215
a licensed health care professional has determined that the	216
woman's condition does not permit the test to be conducted, the	217
test shall be conducted after delivery in accordance with	218
division (B)(2) of this section.	219
(2) Before syphilis and gonorrhea tests are conducted	220
pursuant to division (C)(1) of this section, the licensed health	221

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care professional shall inform the woman of the tests to be	222
conducted and her right to refuse.	
(3) If a woman's medical record indicates that another	224
licensed health care professional has complied with the	225
requirements of division (C)(1) of this section for the	226
pregnancy, the treating licensed health care professional is not	227
required to comply with the requirements of that division.	228
(4) A licensed health care professional who causes tests	229
or an assessment to be conducted pursuant to division (C)(1) of	230
this section shall record that information in the woman's	231
medical records. If a woman refuses the tests, the refusal shall	232
be recorded in her medical records.	233
Section 2. That existing sections 3701.24 and 3701.50 of	234
the Revised Code are hereby repealed.	235
