A BILL

To enact section 182.01 of the Revised Code to
create the Loving State Index and the Loving
State Index Commission to evaluate and rank
municipal corporations in Ohio regarding
critical supports that are vital to student
academic success in order to identify gaps in
opportunity for low-income individuals and
minority individuals.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 182.01 of the Revised Code be
enacted to read as follows:

Sec. 182.01. (A) There is hereby created the loving state
index commission. The commission shall do all of the following:

(1) Establish a system to evaluate and rank municipal
corporations in this state regarding critical supports that are
vital to student academic success in order to identify gaps in
opportunity for low-income individuals and minority individuals.
The system shall be known as the loving state index.

(2) Establish criteria to evaluate the following factors

<u>publish and submit to the members of the general assembly a</u>	50
<u>report containing the commission's evaluation and ranking of</u>	51
<u>municipal corporations. The report shall be available online via</u>	52
<u>the web sites of the departments of education, health, commerce,</u>	53
<u>natural resources, environmental protection services, and</u>	54
<u>transportation, JobsOhio, and the governor's office of faith-</u>	55
<u>based and community initiatives. The report shall contain</u>	56
<u>information regarding the scoring strategy, data, and analysis</u>	57
<u>the commission used.</u>	58
<u>(B) The commission consists of the following eight</u>	59
<u>members:</u>	60
<u>(1) The superintendent of public instruction or the</u>	61
<u>superintendent's designee;</u>	62
<u>(2) The director of health or the director's designee;</u>	63
<u>(3) The director of commerce or the director's designee;</u>	64
<u>(4) The director of natural resources or the director's</u>	65
<u>designee;</u>	66
<u>(5) The director of environmental protection or the</u>	67
<u>director's designee;</u>	68

<u>(6) The director of transportation or the director's</u>	69
<u>designee;</u>	70
<u>(7) The chief investment officer of JobsOhio or the</u>	71
<u>officer's designee;</u>	72
<u>(8) The executive director of the governor's office of</u>	73
<u>faith-based and community initiatives or the director's</u>	74

<u>(C) The commission shall select from its membership a</u>	76
<u>chairperson. The members of the commission shall serve without</u>	77
<u>compensation, but shall be reimbursed for the actual and</u>	78
<u>necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their official</u>	79
<u>duties.</u>	80
<u>(D) Political subdivisions shall provide data to the</u>	81
<u>commission upon request unless the data is exempt from</u>	82
<u>disclosure as a public record under section 149.43 of the</u>	83
<u>Revised Code.</u>	84
<u>(E) For purposes of this section:</u>	85
<u>"Political subdivision" means any county, township,</u>	86
<u>municipal corporation, public school, city or general health</u>	87
<u>district, alcohol, drug addiction, and mental health services</u>	88
<u>board, or other body corporate and politic that is responsible</u>	89
<u>for government activities in a geographic area smaller than the</u>	90
<u>state.</u>	91
<u>"Public school" means a school district created under</u>	92
<u>Chapter 3311., community school created under Chapter 3314.,</u>	93
<u>STEM school created under Chapter 3326., or college-preparatory</u>	94
<u>boarding school created under Chapter 3328. of the Revised Code.</u>	95
