To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section	1
4503.519 of the Revised Code to create the	2
"Purdue University" license plate.	3

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.21 be amended and section	4
4503.519 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	5
Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state	6
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall	7
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid	8
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of	9
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced	10
in division (B) of this section.	11
(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the	12
registrar collects in the fund as follows:	13
The registrar shall pay the contributions received	14
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast	15
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for	16
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast	17
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to	18
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of	19

the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 20 other abortion-related activities. 21 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 22 receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 23 organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 24 deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 25 organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 26 the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 27 manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 28 other money in that fund. 29 The registrar shall pay the contributions received 30 pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 31 society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 32 and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 33

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 34 receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 35 national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 36 amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 37 chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 38 chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 39 assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 40 directly to their clients. 41

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar42receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the43national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money44it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with45pancreatic cancer and their families.46

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar47receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the48

Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar52receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the53St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for54its research and other programs.55

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 56 receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to 57 special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions 58 for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities. 59

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar60receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the61children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the62contributions for its research and other programs.63

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar64receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to65the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to66raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic67pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.68

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 69 receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 70 the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 71 children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 72 research for the cure of childhood cancers. 73

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 74 receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 75 future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 76 contributions into its general account to be used for 77

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educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 78 America foundation. 79 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 80 receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 81 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 82 extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 83 the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 84 85 The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 86 cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 87 scholarships and other educational activities. 88 The registrar shall pay the contributions received 89 pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 90 organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 91 contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 92 that organization. 93 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 94 receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 95 Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 96 97 scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 98 99 The registrar shall pay the contributions received

pursuant to section 4503.507 of the Revised Code to the Ohio100aerospace institute, which shall use those contributions to101facilitate student internships in aerospace and educational102programming.103

The registrar shall pay the contributions received104pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the105organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that106

organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in 107 need.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 109 receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a 110 kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 111 Ohio chapters of a kid again. 112

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 113 receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 114 university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 115 collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 116 section. A university or college that receives contributions 117 from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 118 scholarship fund. 119

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 120 receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 121 university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 122 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 123 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 124 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 125 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 126 university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 127 funds as provided in this section. 128

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 129 receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to 130 Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes 131 of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who 132 attend the university. The university shall not use any of the 133 funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship 134 program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements 135 with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such 136 funds as provided in this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 138 receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the 139 university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of 140 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 141 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 142 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 143 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 144 university of Alabama to effectuate the distribution of such 145 funds as provided in this section. 146

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 147 receives pursuant to section 4503.518 of the Revised Code to the 148 Nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the 149 contributions for the "On Our Sleeves" campaign. 150

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 151 receives pursuant to section 4503.519 of the Revised Code to 152 Purdue university in West Lafayette, Indiana, for purposes of 153 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 154 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 155 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 156 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with 157 Purdue university to effectuate the distribution of such funds 158 as provided in this section. 159

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 160 receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 161 Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 162 for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 163 cyclists of all ages. 164

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

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receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 166 "friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 167 incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 168 of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 169 expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 170 educational, and cultural events at the monument. 171

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar172receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the173fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for174the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the175lighthouses of fairport harbor.176

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar177receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the178Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the179contributions only to promote and support the football team of180Washington high school of the Massillon city school district.181

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 182 receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 183 United States power squadron district seven which shall annually 184 distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United 185 States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron 186 district shall use the money it receives under this section to 187 pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 188 sponsors within this state. 189

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 190 receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 191 Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 192 international, which shall use the money it receives under this 193 section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 194 activities. 195

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 196 receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 197 Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 198 under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 199 its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 200 to children, young adults, and families in this state. 201

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 202 receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 203 Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 204 receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 205 to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 206 to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 207 their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 208 research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 209 the improvement of patient outcomes. 210

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 211 receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 212 thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 213 organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 214 organization in paying for the charitable activities and 215 programs it sponsors in support of United States military 216 personnel, veterans, and their families. 217

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for programs that serve disabled American veterans and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar223receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the224pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions225

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into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 226 be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 227 hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 228 of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 229 destination. 230

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state.

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 236 contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 237 4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 238 source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 239 designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 240 Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 241 section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 242 cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 243 veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 244 245 pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 246 maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar247receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the248rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated.249

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 250 receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 251 Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 252 corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 253 the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 254 members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 255

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charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that256provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The257Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay258for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and259promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs260incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received261under this section.262

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 263 receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 264 Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 265 the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 266 programs. 267

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar268receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the269western reserve historical society, which shall use the270contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum.271

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar272receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the273Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple274negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the275contributions for charitable and educational purposes.276

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 277 receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the 278 central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, 279 which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the 280 Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory 281 the person who paid the contribution resides. 282

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar283receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the284

state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 285 deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 286 establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 287 distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 288 ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 289 for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 290 managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 291 Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 292 registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 293 294 such payments are to be made.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning river watershed.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 304 receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 305 conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use 306 the money in support of the park. 307

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar308receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the309Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the310contributions for wildlife preservation purposes.311

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar312receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the313

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girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the 314 contributions to support the activities of the organization. 315

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 316 receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 317 Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 318 contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 319 information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 320 local beekeeping programs. 321

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar322receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the323national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the324contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace325legends to inspire future leaders.326

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar327receives pursuant to section 4503.578 of the Revised Code to328keep Ohio beautiful, incorporated, which shall use the329contributions towards its mission of empowering Ohio communities330to take greater responsibility for improving the local331environment through litter prevention, beautification, community332greening, waste reduction, and recycling.333

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 334 receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 335 national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use 336 the contributions for educational purposes. 337

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar338receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the339Ohio sons of the American legion, which shall use the340contributions to support the activities of the organization.341

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 342

pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each	343
contribution the registrar receives under that section that an	344
applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a	345
professional sports team located in the county of that sports	346
commission and that is participating in the license plate	347
program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective	348
of the county of residence of an applicant.	349

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each350contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of351the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates352that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is353participating in the license plate program pursuant to division354(G) of that section.355

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 356 receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 357 pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 358 which shall use the contributions for the protection and 359 preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 360 Ohio and for educational programs. 361

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar362receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to363pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of364supporting cancer research.365

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar366receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the367Stan Hywet hall and gardens.368

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar369receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the370Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad.371

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 372 receives pursuant to section 4503.597 of the Revised Code to the 373 Circleville pumpkin show, incorporated, which shall use the 374 contributions to promote good will surrounding the Circleville 375 pumpkin show as a nonprofit annual event. 376

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar377receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the378Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council379shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner380throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.381

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 382 receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 383 girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 384 heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 385 manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 386 scouts. 387

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar388receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the389Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council390shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner391throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.392

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 393 receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the 394 charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., 395 which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 396

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar397receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the398Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio,399which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes.400

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 401 receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 402 Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 403 of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 404 charitable purposes. 405

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.703 of the Revised Code to the Ohio chapter of the loyal order of the moose.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar409receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the410fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall411deposit the fees into its general account to be used for412purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated.413

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 414 receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 415 fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 416 deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 417 used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 418 enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 419 methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 420

The registrar shall pay the contributions received421pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio422concerns of police survivors, which shall use those423contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate424to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed425in the line of duty.426

The registrar shall pay the contributions received427pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater428Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those429

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contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in430the line of duty and support its charitable purposes.431

The registrar shall pay the contributions received432pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio433association of chiefs of police.434

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 435 receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 436 fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 437 to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 438 families. 439

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall use the contributions to further the mission of the commission.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 444 receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 445 organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 446 association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 447 Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 448 449 shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in administering a program to secure the proper representation in 450 the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 451 children, and for the training and supervision of persons 452 participating in that program. 453

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar454receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the455Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the456contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state.457

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 458

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receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the 459 Ohio Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, 460 which shall use the contributions for programs, education, and 461 advocacy purposes throughout the state. 462

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 463 receives pursuant to section 4503.725 of the Revised Code to the 464 ALS association central & southern Ohio chapter, which shall 465 split the contributions between that chapter and the ALS 466 association northern Ohio chapter in accordance with any 467 agreement between the two associations. The contributions shall 468 be used to discover treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, 469 advocate for, and empower people affected by ALS to live their 470 lives to the fullest. 471

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar472receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to473Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the474contributions into its general account to be used for purposes475of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated.476

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar477receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the478Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to479commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in480Cleveland, Ohio.481

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 482 receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 483 central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research 484 foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the 485 chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose 486 geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 487 resides. 488

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 489 receives pursuant to section 4503.734 of the Revised Code to the 490 Ohio highway patrol auxiliary foundation, which shall use the 491 contributions to fulfill the foundation's mission of supporting 492 law enforcement education and assistance. 493

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 494 receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the 495 Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the 496 moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section 497 4503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written 498 agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos. 499

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 500 receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the 501 rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston, 502 Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and 503 used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the 504 rotary foundation. 505

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 506 receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the 507 Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the 508 contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained 509 under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation. 510

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar511receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to512buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the513contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs.514

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 515 receives pursuant to section 4503.754 of the Revised Code to the 516 municipal corporation of Twinsburg. 517

The school principal or, in the school principal's 1057 discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any 1058 charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those 1059 services. The school shall ensure that any such charitable 1060 organization is exempt from federal income taxation under 1061 subsection 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school 1062 shall not use the contributions it receives for any other 1063 1064 purpose.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1065receives pursuant to section 4503.956 of the Revised Code to the1066Liberty Center local school district, which shall use the1067contributions for its gifted programs and special education and1068related services.1069

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1070receives pursuant to section 4503.957 of the Revised Code to1071John F. Kennedy Catholic school located in Warren. The school1072shall not use the contributions it receives for any political1073purpose.1074

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1075 receives pursuant to section 4503.958 of the Revised Code to 1076 Elder high school located in the municipal corporation of 1077 Cincinnati. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 1078 contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 1079 students, twenty-five per cent of the contributions to benefit 1080 arts and enrichment at the school, and twenty-five per cent of 1081 the contributions to benefit athletics at the school. 1082

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1083receives pursuant to section 4503.961 of the Revised Code to1084Fairfield senior high school located in the municipal1085corporation of Fairfield. The high school shall not use the1086contributions for any political purpose.1087

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1088receives pursuant to section 4503.962 of the Revised Code to1089Hamilton high school located in the municipal corporation of1090Hamilton. The high school shall not use the contributions for1091any political purpose.1092

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

receives pursuant to section 4503.963 of the Revised Code to 1094 Ross high school located in Ross township in Butler county. The 1095 high school shall not use the contributions for any political 1096 purpose. 1097

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1098receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the1099friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money1100to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free1101emergency medical first response throughout Israel.1102

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1103 receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the 1104 Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and 1105 activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the 1106 city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park." 1107

(C) All investment earnings of the license plate 1108 contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than 1109 the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall 1110 distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this 1111 section the investment income the fund earned the previous 1112 calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an 1113 entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity 1114 received from the fund during the previous calendar year. 1115
