BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 3302.03, 3313.471, 3313.618, and	7
3313.6114 be amended and sections 3313.6025 and 3313.6026 of the	8
Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	9
Sec. 3302.03. Not later than the thirty-first day of July	10
of each year, the department of education shall submit	11
preliminary report card data for overall academic performance	12
and for each separate performance measure for each school	13
district, and each school building, in accordance with this	14
section.	15
Annually, not later than the fifteenth day of September or	16
the preceding Friday when that day falls on a Saturday or	17
Sunday, the department shall assign a letter grade for overall	18
academic performance and for each separate performance measure	19

for each school district, and each school building in a 20 district, in accordance with this section. The state board shall 21 adopt rules pursuant to Chapter 119. of the Revised Code to 22 establish performance criteria for each letter grade and 23 prescribe a method by which the department assigns each letter 24 grade. For a school building to which any of the performance 2.5 measures do not apply, due to grade levels served by the 26 building, the state board shall designate the performance 27 measures that are applicable to the building and that must be 28 29 calculated separately and used to calculate the building's overall grade. The department shall issue annual report cards 30 reflecting the performance of each school district, each 31 building within each district, and for the state as a whole 32 using the performance measures and letter grade system described 33 in this section. The department shall include on the report card 34 for each district and each building within each district the 35 most recent two-year trend data in student achievement for each 36 subject and each grade. 37

(A) (1) For the 2012-2013 school year, the department shallissue grades as described in division (E) of this section foreach of the following performance measures:

(a) Annual measurable objectives;

(b) Performance index score for a school district or 42 building. Grades shall be awarded as a percentage of the total 43 possible points on the performance index system as adopted by 44 the state board. In adopting benchmarks for assigning letter 45 grades under division (A)(1)(b) of this section, the state board 46 of education shall designate ninety per cent or higher for an 47 "A," at least seventy per cent but not more than eighty per cent 48 for a "C," and less than fifty per cent for an "F." 49

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(c) The extent to which the school district or building 50 meets each of the applicable performance indicators established 51 by the state board under section 3302.02 of the Revised Code and 52 the percentage of applicable performance indicators that have 53 been achieved. In adopting benchmarks for assigning letter 54 grades under division (A) (1) (c) of this section, the state board 55 shall designate ninety per cent or higher for an "A."

(d) The four- and five-year adjusted cohort graduation57rates.58

In adopting benchmarks for assigning letter grades under 59 division (A)(1)(d), (B)(1)(d), or (C)(1)(d) of this section, the 60 department shall designate a four-year adjusted cohort 61 graduation rate of ninety-three per cent or higher for an "A" 62 and a five-year cohort graduation rate of ninety-five per cent 63 or higher for an "A." 64

(e) The overall score under the value-added progress
dimension of a school district or building, for which the
department shall use up to three years of value-added data as
available. The letter grade assigned for this growth measure
shall be as follows:

(i) A score that is at least one standard error of measureabove the mean score shall be designated as an "A."71

(ii) A score that is less than one standard error of
measure above but greater than one standard error of measure
below the mean score shall be designated as a "B."
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(iii) A score that is less than or equal to one standard 75
error of measure below the mean score but greater than two 76
standard errors of measure below the mean score shall be 77
designated as a "C." 78

(iv) A score that is less than or equal to two standard 79
errors of measure below the mean score but is greater than three 80
standard errors of measure below the mean score shall be 81
designated as a "D." 82

(v) A score that is less than or equal to three standard errors of measure below the mean score shall be designated as an "F."

Whenever the value-added progress dimension is used as a graded performance measure, whether as an overall measure or as a measure of separate subgroups, the grades for the measure shall be calculated in the same manner as prescribed in division (A) (1) (e) of this section.

(f) The value-added progress dimension score for a school
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district or building disaggregated for each of the following
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subgroups: students identified as gifted, students with
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disabilities, and students whose performance places them in the
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lowest quintile for achievement on a statewide basis. Each
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subgroup shall be a separate graded measure.

(2) Not later than April 30, 2013, the state board of 97 education shall adopt a resolution describing the performance 98 measures, benchmarks, and grading system for the 2012-2013 99 school year and, not later than June 30, 2013, shall adopt rules 100 in accordance with Chapter 119. of the Revised Code that 101 prescribe the methods by which the performance measures under 102 division (A)(1) of this section shall be assessed and assigned a 103 letter grade, including performance benchmarks for each letter 104 grade. 105

At least forty-five days prior to the state board's 106 adoption of rules to prescribe the methods by which the 107

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performance measures under division (A) (1) of this section shall108be assessed and assigned a letter grade, the department shall109conduct a public presentation before the standing committees of110the house of representatives and the senate that consider111education legislation describing such methods, including112performance benchmarks.113

(3) There shall not be an overall letter grade for a 114school district or building for the 2012-2013 school year. 115

(B) (1) For the 2013-2014 and 2014-2015 school years, the
department shall issue grades as described in division (E) of
this section for each of the following performance measures:

(a) Annual measurable objectives;

(b) Performance index score for a school district or 120 building. Grades shall be awarded as a percentage of the total 121 possible points on the performance index system as created by 122 the department. In adopting benchmarks for assigning letter 123 grades under division (B)(1)(b) of this section, the state board 124 shall designate ninety per cent or higher for an "A," at least 125 seventy per cent but not more than eighty per cent for a "C," 126 and less than fifty per cent for an "F." 127

(c) The extent to which the school district or building 128 meets each of the applicable performance indicators established 129 by the state board under section 3302.03 of the Revised Code and 130 the percentage of applicable performance indicators that have 131 been achieved. In adopting benchmarks for assigning letter 132 grades under division (B)(1)(c) of this section, the state board 133 shall designate ninety per cent or higher for an "A." 134

(d) The four- and five-year adjusted cohort graduation135rates;136

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(e) The overall score under the value-added progress
dimension of a school district or building, for which the
department shall use up to three years of value-added data as
available.

(f) The value-added progress dimension score for a school 141 district or building disaggregated for each of the following 142 subgroups: students identified as gifted in superior cognitive 143 ability and specific academic ability fields under Chapter 3324. 144 of the Revised Code, students with disabilities, and students 145 whose performance places them in the lowest quintile for 146 achievement on a statewide basis. Each subgroup shall be a 147 separate graded measure. 148

(g) Whether a school district or building is making 149 progress in improving literacy in grades kindergarten through 150 three, as determined using a method prescribed by the state 151board. The state board shall adopt rules to prescribe benchmarks 152 and standards for assigning grades to districts and buildings 153 for purposes of division (B)(1)(g) of this section. In adopting 154 benchmarks for assigning letter grades under divisions (B)(1)(g) 155 and (C)(1)(g) of this section, the state board shall determine 156 progress made based on the reduction in the total percentage of 157 students scoring below grade level, or below proficient, 158 compared from year to year on the reading and writing diagnostic 159 assessments administered under section 3301.0715 of the Revised 160 Code and the third grade English language arts assessment under 161 section 3301.0710 of the Revised Code, as applicable. The state 162 board shall designate for a "C" grade a value that is not lower 163 than the statewide average value for this measure. No grade 164 shall be issued under divisions (B)(1)(g) and (C)(1)(g) of this 165 section for a district or building in which less than five per 166 cent of students have scored below grade level on the diagnostic 167

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assessment administered to students in kindergarten under 168 division (B)(1) of section 3313.608 of the Revised Code. 169 (h) For a high mobility school district or building, an 170 additional value-added progress dimension score. For this 171measure, the department shall use value-added data from the most 172 recent school year available and shall use assessment scores for 173 only those students to whom the district or building has 174 administered the assessments prescribed by section 3301.0710 of 175 the Revised Code for each of the two most recent consecutive 176 school years. 177 As used in this division, "high mobility school district 178 or building" means a school district or building where at least 179 twenty-five per cent of its total enrollment is made up of 180 students who have attended that school district or building for 181 less than one year. 182 (2) In addition to the graded measures in division (B)(1) 183

(2) In addition to the graded measures in division (B)(I)183of this section, the department shall include on a school184district's or building's report card all of the following185without an assigned letter grade:186

(a) The percentage of students enrolled in a district or
building participating in advanced placement classes and the
percentage of those students who received a score of three or
better on advanced placement examinations;

(b) The number of a district's or building's students who
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have earned at least three college credits through dual
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enrollment or advanced standing programs, such as the post193
secondary enrollment options program under Chapter 3365. of the
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Revised Code and state-approved career-technical courses offered
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through dual enrollment or statewide articulation, that appear
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on a student's transcript or other official document, either of 197 which is issued by the institution of higher education from 198 which the student earned the college credit. The credits earned 199 that are reported under divisions (B)(2)(b) and (C)(2)(c) of 200 this section shall not include any that are remedial or 201 developmental and shall include those that count toward the 202 curriculum requirements established for completion of a degree. 203

(c) The percentage of students enrolled in a district or 204 building who have taken a national standardized test used for 205 college admission determinations and the percentage of those 206 students who are determined to be remediation-free in accordance 207 with standards adopted under division (F) of section 3345.061 of 208 the Revised Code; 209

(d) The percentage of the district's or the building's students who receive industry-recognized credentials as approved under section 3313.6113 of the Revised Code.

(e) The percentage of students enrolled in a district or
building who are participating in an international baccalaureate
program and the percentage of those students who receive a score
of four or better on the international baccalaureate
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examinations.

(f) The percentage of the district's or building's
students who receive an honors diploma under division (B) of
section 3313.61 of the Revised Code.
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(3) Not later than December 31, 2013, the state board
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shall adopt rules in accordance with Chapter 119. of the Revised
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Code that prescribe the methods by which the performance
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measures under divisions (B) (1) (f) and (B) (1) (g) of this section
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will be assessed and assigned a letter grade, including
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performance benchmarks for each grade.

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At least forty-five days prior to the state board's 227 adoption of rules to prescribe the methods by which the 228 performance measures under division (B)(1) of this section shall 229 be assessed and assigned a letter grade, the department shall 230 conduct a public presentation before the standing committees of 231 the house of representatives and the senate that consider 232 education legislation describing such methods, including 233 performance benchmarks. 234

(4) There shall not be an overall letter grade for a
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school district or building for the 2013-2014, 2014-2015, 2015236
2016, and 2016-2017 school years.
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(C) (1) For the 2014-2015 school year and each school year
thereafter, the department shall issue grades as described in
division (E) of this section for each of the performance
measures prescribed in division (C) (1) of this section. The
graded measures are as follows:

(a) Annual measurable objectives. For the 2017-2018 school 243 year, the department shall not include any subgroup data in the 244 245 annual measurable objectives that includes data from fewer than 246 twenty-five students. For the 2018-2019 school year, the 247 department shall not include any subgroup data in the annual measurable objectives that includes data from fewer than twenty 248 students. Beginning with the 2019-2020 school year, the 249 department shall not include any subgroup data in the annual 250 measurable objectives that includes data from fewer than fifteen 251 students. 252

(b) Performance index score for a school district or253building. Grades shall be awarded as a percentage of the total254

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possible points on the performance index system as created by255the department. In adopting benchmarks for assigning letter256grades under division (C) (1) (b) of this section, the state board257shall designate ninety per cent or higher for an "A," at least258seventy per cent but not more than eighty per cent for a "C,"259and less than fifty per cent for an "F."260

(c) The extent to which the school district or building 261 meets each of the applicable performance indicators established 262 by the state board under section 3302.03 of the Revised Code and 263 the percentage of applicable performance indicators that have 264 been achieved. In adopting benchmarks for assigning letter 265 grades under division (C) (1) (c) of this section, the state board 266 shall designate ninety per cent or higher for an "A." 267

(d) The four- and five-year adjusted cohort graduation rates;

(e) The overall score under the value-added progress
dimension, or another measure of student academic progress if
adopted by the state board, of a school district or building,
for which the department shall use up to three years of valueadded data as available.

In adopting benchmarks for assigning letter grades for 275 overall score on value-added progress dimension under division 276 (C)(1)(e) of this section, the state board shall prohibit the 277 assigning of a grade of "A" for that measure unless the 278 district's or building's grade assigned for value-added progress 279 dimension for all subgroups under division (C)(1)(f) of this 280 section is a "C" or higher. 281

For the metric prescribed by division (C)(1)(e) of this282section, the state board may adopt a student academic progress283

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measure to be used instead of the value-added progress284dimension. If the state board adopts such a measure, it also285shall prescribe a method for assigning letter grades for the new286measure that is comparable to the method prescribed in division287(A) (1) (e) of this section.288

(f) The value-added progress dimension score of a school 289 district or building disaggregated for each of the following 290 subgroups: students identified as gifted in superior cognitive 291 ability and specific academic ability fields under Chapter 3324. 292 293 of the Revised Code, students with disabilities, and students 294 whose performance places them in the lowest quintile for achievement on a statewide basis, as determined by a method 295 prescribed by the state board. Each subgroup shall be a separate 296 graded measure. 297

The state board may adopt student academic progress measures to be used instead of the value-added progress dimension. If the state board adopts such measures, it also shall prescribe a method for assigning letter grades for the new measures that is comparable to the method prescribed in division (A) (1) (e) of this section.

(g) Whether a school district or building is making 304 progress in improving literacy in grades kindergarten through 305 three, as determined using a method prescribed by the state 306 board. The state board shall adopt rules to prescribe benchmarks 307 and standards for assigning grades to a district or building for 308 purposes of division (C)(1)(g) of this section. The state board 309 shall designate for a "C" grade a value that is not lower than 310 the statewide average value for this measure. No grade shall be 311 issued under division (C)(1)(g) of this section for a district 312 or building in which less than five per cent of students have 313

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scored below grade level on the kindergarten diagnostic 314 assessment under division (B)(1) of section 3313.608 of the 315 Revised Code. 316

(h) For a high mobility school district or building, an 317 additional value-added progress dimension score. For this 318 measure, the department shall use value-added data from the most 319 recent school year available and shall use assessment scores for 320 only those students to whom the district or building has 321 administered the assessments prescribed by section 3301.0710 of 322 the Revised Code for each of the two most recent consecutive 323 school years. 324

As used in this division, "high mobility school district or building" means a school district or building where at least twenty-five per cent of its total enrollment is made up of students who have attended that school district or building for less than one year.

(2) In addition to the graded measures in division (C) (1)
of this section, the department shall include on a school
district's or building's report card all of the following
without an assigned letter grade:

(a) The percentage of students enrolled in a district or
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building who have taken a national standardized test used for
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college admission determinations and the percentage of those
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students who are determined to be remediation-free in accordance
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with the standards adopted under division (F) of section
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3345.061 of the Revised Code;

(b) The percentage of students enrolled in a district or
building participating in advanced placement classes and the
percentage of those students who received a score of three or
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better on advanced placement examinations;

(c) The percentage of a district's or building's students 344 who have earned at least three college credits through advanced 345 standing programs, such as the college credit plus program under 346 Chapter 3365. of the Revised Code and state-approved career-347 technical courses offered through dual enrollment or statewide 348 articulation, that appear on a student's college transcript 349 issued by the institution of higher education from which the 350 student earned the college credit. The credits earned that are 351 reported under divisions (B)(2)(b) and (C)(2)(c) of this section 352 shall not include any that are remedial or developmental and 353 shall include those that count toward the curriculum 354 requirements established for completion of a degree. 355

(d) The percentage of the district's or building's 356
students who receive an honor's diploma under division (B) of 357
section 3313.61 of the Revised Code; 358

(e) The percentage of the district's or building's 359
students who receive industry-recognized credentials as approved 360
under section 3313.6113 of the Revised Code; 361

(f) The percentage of students enrolled in a district or
building who are participating in an international baccalaureate
program and the percentage of those students who receive a score
of four or better on the international baccalaureate
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examinations;

(g) The percentage of students enrolled in a district or367building who participate in a career information opportunity368prescribed under division (C) of section 3313.471 of the Revised369Code;370

(h) The percentage of students enrolled in a district or 371

building who receive advice about career-technical education and	372
careers in the skilled trades through a policy adopted under	373
section 3313.6025 of the Revised Code;	374
(i) The percentage of students enrolled in a district or	375
building who completed a course prescribed under section	376
3313.6026 of the Revised Code;	377
(j) The results of the college and career-ready	378
assessments administered under division (B)(1) of section	379
3301.0712 of the Revised Code;	380
(h) <u>(k)</u> Whether the school district or building has	381
implemented a positive behavior intervention and supports	382
framework in compliance with the requirements of section 3319.46	383
of the Revised Code, notated as a "yes" or "no" answer.	384
(3) The state board shall adopt rules pursuant to Chapter	385
119. of the Revised Code that establish a method to assign an	386
overall grade for a school district or school building for the	387
2017-2018 school year and each school year thereafter. The rules	388
shall group the performance measures in divisions (C)(1) and (2)	389
of this section into the following components:	390
(a) Gap closing, which shall include the performance	391
measure in division (C)(1)(a) of this section;	392
(b) Ashievement which shall include the performance	202
(b) Achievement, which shall include the performance	393
measures in divisions (C)(1)(b) and (c) of this section;	394
(c) Progress, which shall include the performance measures	395
in divisions (C)(1)(e) and (f) of this section;	396
(d) Graduation, which shall include the performance	397
measure in division (C)(1)(d) of this section;	398
(e) Kindergarten through third-grade literacy, which shall	399

include the performance measure in division (C)(1)(g) of this section;

(f) Prepared for success, which shall include the 402 performance measures in divisions (C)(2)(a), (b), (c), (d), (e), 403 and (f), (g), (h), and (i) of this section. The state board 404 shall develop a method to determine a grade for the component in 405 division (C)(3)(f) of this section using the performance 406 measures in divisions (C) (2) (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), $\frac{\text{and}}{\text{(f)}}$ 407 (q), (h), and (i) of this section. When available, the state 408 board may incorporate the performance measure under division (C) 409 $\frac{(2)(g)}{(2)(2)(2)}$ of this section into the component under 410 division (C)(3)(f) of this section. When determining the overall 411 grade for the prepared for success component prescribed by 412 division (C)(3)(f) of this section, no individual student shall 413 414 be counted in more than one performance measure. However, if a student qualifies for more than one performance measure in the 415 component, the state board may, in its method to determine a 416 grade for the component, specify an additional weight for such a 417 student that is not greater than or equal to 1.0 and not less 418 than 0.3. In determining the overall score under division (C)(3) 419 (f) of this section, the state board shall ensure that the pool 420 of students included in the performance measures aggregated 421 under that division are all of the students included in the 422 four- and five-year adjusted graduation cohort. 423

In the rules adopted under division (C) (3) of this 424 section, the state board shall adopt a method for determining a 425 grade for each component in divisions (C) (3) (a) to (f) of this 426 section. The state board also shall establish a method to assign 427 an overall grade of "A," "B," "C," "D," or "F" using the grades 428 assigned for each component. The method the state board adopts 429 for assigning an overall grade shall give equal weight to the 430

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overall grade for the report card, as required by this division, 434 the department shall conduct a public presentation before the 435 standing committees of the house of representatives and the 436 senate that consider education legislation describing the format 437 for the report card, weights that will be assigned to the 438 components of the overall grade, and the method for calculating 439 440 the overall grade. (D) On or after July 1, 2015, the state board may develop 441 a measure of student academic progress for high school students 442 using only data from assessments in English language arts and 443 mathematics. If the state board develops this measure, each 444 school district and applicable school building shall be assigned 445 a separate letter grade for it not sooner than the 2017-2018 446 school year. The district's or building's grade for that measure 447 shall not be included in determining the district's or 448 building's overall letter grade. 449 (E) The letter grades assigned to a school district or 450 451 (1) "A" for a district or school making excellent 452 453 (2) "B" for a district or school making above average (3) "C" for a district or school making average progress; 456

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(4) "D" for a district or school making below average
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progress;
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(5) "F" for a district or school failing to meet minimum 459 460 progress. (F) When reporting data on student achievement and 461 progress, the department shall disaggregate that data according 462 to the following categories: 463 (1) Performance of students by grade-level; 464 (2) Performance of students by race and ethnic group; 465 (3) Performance of students by gender; 466 (4) Performance of students grouped by those who have been 467 enrolled in a district or school for three or more years; 468 (5) Performance of students grouped by those who have been 469 enrolled in a district or school for more than one year and less 470 than three years; 471 (6) Performance of students grouped by those who have been 472 enrolled in a district or school for one year or less; 473 (7) Performance of students grouped by those who are 474 economically disadvantaged; 475 (8) Performance of students grouped by those who are 476 enrolled in a conversion community school established under 477 Chapter 3314. of the Revised Code; 478 (9) Performance of students grouped by those who are 479 classified as English learners; 480 (10) Performance of students grouped by those who have 481 disabilities; 482 (11) Performance of students grouped by those who are 483 484 classified as migrants;

(12) Performance of students grouped by those who are 485 identified as gifted in superior cognitive ability and the 486 specific academic ability fields of reading and math pursuant to 487 Chapter 3324. of the Revised Code. In disaggregating specific 488 academic ability fields for gifted students, the department 489 shall use data for those students with specific academic ability 490 in math and reading. If any other academic field is assessed, 491 the department shall also include data for students with 492 specific academic ability in that field as well. 493

(13) Performance of students grouped by those who perform
in the lowest quintile for achievement on a statewide basis, as
determined by a method prescribed by the state board.

The department may disaggregate data on student497performance according to other categories that the department498determines are appropriate. To the extent possible, the499department shall disaggregate data on student performance500according to any combinations of two or more of the categories501listed in divisions (F)(1) to (13) of this section that it deems502relevant.503

504 In reporting data pursuant to division (F) of this section, the department shall not include in the report cards 505 any data statistical in nature that is statistically unreliable 506 or that could result in the identification of individual 507 students. For this purpose, the department shall not report 508 student performance data for any group identified in division 509 (F) of this section that contains less than ten students. If the 510 department does not report student performance data for a group 511 because it contains less than ten students, the department shall 512 indicate on the report card that is why data was not reported. 513

(G) The department may include with the report cards any 514

additional education and fiscal performance data it deems 515 valuable. 516

(H) The department shall include on each report card a 517 list of additional information collected by the department that 518 is available regarding the district or building for which the 519 report card is issued. When available, such additional 520 information shall include student mobility data disaggregated by 521 race and socioeconomic status, college enrollment data, and the 522 reports prepared under section 3302.031 of the Revised Code. 523

The department shall maintain a site on the world wide 524 web. The report card shall include the address of the site and 525 shall specify that such additional information is available to 526 the public at that site. The department shall also provide a 527 copy of each item on the list to the superintendent of each 528 school district. The district superintendent shall provide a 529 copy of any item on the list to anyone who requests it. 530

(I) (1) (a) Except as provided in division (I) (1) (b) of this 531 section, for any district that sponsors a conversion community 532 school under Chapter 3314. of the Revised Code, the department 533 shall combine data regarding the academic performance of 534 students enrolled in the community school with comparable data 535 from the schools of the district for the purpose of determining 536 the performance of the district as a whole on the report card 537 issued for the district under this section or section 3302.033 538 of the Revised Code. 539

(b) The department shall not combine data from any
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conversion community school that a district sponsors if a
majority of the students enrolled in the conversion community
school are enrolled in a dropout prevention and recovery program
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that is operated by the school, as described in division (A) (4)

(a) of section 3314.35 of the Revised Code. The department shall
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include as an addendum to the district's report card the ratings
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and performance measures that are required under section
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3314.017 of the Revised Code for any community school to which
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division (I) (1) (b) of this section applies. This addendum shall
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include, at a minimum, the data specified in divisions (C) (1)
(a), (C) (2), and (C) (3) of section 3314.017 of the Revised Code.

(2) Any district that leases a building to a community 552 school located in the district or that enters into an agreement 553 554 with a community school located in the district whereby the district and the school endorse each other's programs may elect 555 to have data regarding the academic performance of students 556 enrolled in the community school combined with comparable data 557 from the schools of the district for the purpose of determining 558 the performance of the district as a whole on the district 559 report card. Any district that so elects shall annually file a 560 copy of the lease or agreement with the department. 561

(3) Any municipal school district, as defined in section 562 3311.71 of the Revised Code, that sponsors a community school 563 located within the district's territory, or that enters into an 564 agreement with a community school located within the district's 565 territory whereby the district and the community school endorse 566 each other's programs, may exercise either or both of the 567 following elections: 568
