BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 4765.01, 4765.11, and 4765.16 be	7
amended and section 4765.53 of the Revised Code be enacted to	8
read as follows:	9
Sec. 4765.01. As used in this chapter:	10
(A) "First responder" means an individual who holds a	11
current, valid certificate issued under section 4765.30 of the	12
Revised Code to practice as a first responder.	13
(B) "Emergency medical technician-basic" or "EMT-basic"	14
means an individual who holds a current, valid certificate	15
issued under section 4765.30 of the Revised Code to practice as	16
an emergency medical technician-basic.	17
(C) "Emergency medical technician intermediate" or "EMT I"	1.0

(C) "Emergency medical technician-intermediate" or "EMT-I" 18

means an individual who holds a current, valid certificate 19
issued under section 4765.30 of the Revised Code to practice as 20
an emergency medical technician-intermediate. 21

(D) "Emergency medical technician-paramedic" or "paramedic" means an individual who holds a current, valid certificate issued under section 4765.30 of the Revised Code to practice as an emergency medical technician-paramedic.

(E) "Ambulance" means any motor vehicle that is used, or
26 is intended to be used, for the purpose of responding to
27 emergency medical situations, transporting emergency patients,
28 and administering emergency medical service to patients before,
29 during, or after transportation.

(F) "Cardiac monitoring" means a procedure used for the
purpose of observing and documenting the rate and rhythm of a
patient's heart by attaching electrical leads from an
electrocardiograph monitor to certain points on the patient's
body surface.

(G) "Emergency medical service" means any of the services described in sections 4765.35, 4765.37, 4765.38, and 4765.39 of the Revised Code that are performed by first responders, emergency medical technicians-basic, emergency medical technicians-intermediate, and paramedics. "Emergency medical service" includes such services performed before or during any transport of a patient, including transports between hospitals and transports to and from helicopters.

(H) "Emergency medical service organization" means a
public or private organization using first responders, EMTsbasic, EMTs-I, or paramedics, or a combination of first
responders, EMTs-basic, EMTs-I, and paramedics, to provide
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emergency medical services.

(I) "Physician" means an individual who holds a current,
valid license issued under Chapter 4731. of the Revised Code
authorizing the practice of medicine and surgery or osteopathic
medicine and surgery.

(J) "Registered nurse" means an individual who holds a
current, valid license issued under Chapter 4723. of the Revised
Code authorizing the practice of nursing as a registered nurse.
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(K) "Volunteer" means a person who provides services
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either for no compensation or for compensation that does not
exceed the actual expenses incurred in providing the services or
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in training to provide the services.

(L) "Emergency medical service personnel" means first responders, emergency medical technicians-basic, emergency medical technicians-intermediate, emergency medical techniciansparamedic, and persons who provide medical direction to such persons.

(M) "Hospital" has the same meaning as in section 3727.0165 of the Revised Code.66

(N) "Trauma" or "traumatic injury" means severe damage to
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 or destruction of tissue that satisfies both of the following
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 conditions:
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(1) It creates a significant risk of any of the following: 70
(a) Loss of life; 71
(b) Loss of a limb; 72
(c) Significant, permanent disfigurement; 73
(d) Significant, permanent disability. 74

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(2) It is caused by any of the following:	75
(a) Blunt or penetrating injury;	76
(b) Exposure to electromagnetic, chemical, or radioactive	77
energy;	78
(c) Drowning, suffocation, or strangulation;	79
(d) A deficit or excess of heat.	80
(O) "Trauma victim" or "trauma patient" means a person who	81
has sustained a traumatic injury.	82
(P) "Trauma care" means the assessment, diagnosis,	83
transportation, treatment, or rehabilitation of a trauma victim	84
by emergency medical service personnel or by a physician, nurse,	85
physician assistant, respiratory therapist, physical therapist,	86
chiropractor, occupational therapist, speech-language	87
pathologist, audiologist, or psychologist licensed to practice	88
as such in this state or another jurisdiction.	89
(Q) "Trauma center" means all of the following:	90
(1) Any hospital that is verified by the American college	91
of surgeons as an adult or pediatric trauma center;	92
(2) Any hospital that is operating as an adult or	93
pediatric trauma center under provisional status pursuant to	94
section 3727.101 of the Revised Code;	95
(3) Until December 31, 2004, any hospital in this state	96
that is designated by the director of health as a level II	97
pediatric trauma center under section 3727.081 of the Revised	98
Code;	99
(4) Any hospital in another state that is licensed or	100
designated under the laws of that state as capable of providing	101

specialized trauma care appropriate to the medical needs of the	
trauma patient.	103
(R) "Pediatric" means involving a patient who is less than	104
sixteen years of age.	105
(S) "Adult" means involving a patient who is not a	106
pediatric patient.	107
(T) "Geriatric" means involving a patient who is at least	108
seventy years old or exhibits significant anatomical or	109
physiological characteristics associated with advanced aging.	110
(U) "Air medical organization" means an organization that	111
provides emergency medical services, or transports emergency	112
victims, by means of fixed or rotary wing aircraft.	113
(V) "Emergency care" and "emergency facility" have the	114
same meanings as in section 3727.01 of the Revised Code.	115
(W) "Stabilize," except as it is used in division (B) of	116
section 4765.35 of the Revised Code with respect to the manual	117
stabilization of fractures, has the same meaning as in section	
1753.28 of the Revised Code.	119
(X) "Transfer" has the same meaning as in section 1753.28	120
of the Revised Code.	121
(Y) "Firefighter" means any member of a fire department as	122
defined in section 742.01 of the Revised Code.	123
(Z) "Volunteer firefighter" has the same meaning as in	124
section 146.01 of the Revised Code.	125
(AA) "Part-time paid firefighter" means a person who	126
provides firefighting services on less than a full-time basis,	127
is routinely scheduled to be present on site at a fire station	128

or other designated location for purposes of responding to a 129 fire or other emergency, and receives more than nominal 130 compensation for the provision of firefighting services. 131 (BB) "Physician assistant" means an individual who holds a 132 valid license to practice as a physician assistant issued under 133 Chapter 4730. of the Revised Code. 134 (CC) "Medical identification product" means a tag or 135 emblem worn by an individual as a bracelet, necklace, chain, or 136 other piece of jewelry that notes the individual's critical 137 health information. 138 Sec. 4765.11. (A) The state board of emergency medical, 139 fire, and transportation services shall adopt, and may amend and 140 rescind, rules in accordance with Chapter 119. of the Revised 141 Code and division (C) of this section that establish all of the 142 following: 143 (1) Procedures for its governance and the control of its 144 actions and business affairs; 145 (2) Standards for the performance of emergency medical 146 services by first responders, emergency medical technicians-147 basic, emergency medical technicians-intermediate, and emergency 148 medical technicians-paramedic; 149 (3) Application fees for certificates of accreditation, 150 certificates of approval, certificates to teach, and 151 certificates to practice, which shall be deposited into the 152 trauma and emergency medical services fund created in section 153 4513.263 of the Revised Code; 154 (4) Criteria for determining when the application or 155 renewal fee for a certificate to practice may be waived because 156

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(5) Procedures for issuance and renewal of certificates of 158 accreditation, certificates of approval, certificates to teach, 159 and certificates to practice, including any procedures necessary 160 to ensure that adequate notice of renewal is provided in 161 accordance with division (D) of section 4765.30 of the Revised 162 Code; 163 (6) Procedures for suspending or revoking certificates of 164 accreditation, certificates of approval, certificates to teach, 165 and certificates to practice; 166 (7) Grounds for suspension or revocation of a certificate 167 to practice issued under section 4765.30 of the Revised Code and 168 for taking any other disciplinary action against a first 169 responder, EMT-basic, EMT-I, or paramedic; 170 (8) Procedures for taking disciplinary action against a 171 first responder, EMT-basic, EMT-I, or paramedic; 172 (9) Standards for certificates of accreditation and 173 certificates of approval; 174 (10) Qualifications for certificates to teach; 175 (11) Requirements for a certificate to practice; 176 (12) The curricula, number of hours of instruction and 177 training, and instructional materials to be used in adult and 178 pediatric emergency medical services training programs and adult 179 and pediatric emergency medical services continuing education 180 programs; 181 (13) Procedures for conducting courses in recognizing 182 symptoms of life-threatening allergic reactions and in 183 calculating proper dosage levels and administering injections of 184 epinephrine to adult and pediatric patients who suffer life-185

threatening allergic reactions; 186 (14) Examinations for certificates to practice; 187 (15) Procedures for administering examinations for 188 certificates to practice; 189 (16) Procedures for approving examinations that 190 demonstrate competence to have a certificate to practice renewed 191 without completing an emergency medical services continuing 192 education program; 193 (17) Procedures for granting extensions and exemptions of 194 emergency medical services continuing education requirements; 195 (18) Procedures for approving the additional emergency 196 medical services first responders are authorized by division (C) 197 of section 4765.35 of the Revised Code to perform, EMTs-basic 198 are authorized by division (C) of section 4765.37 of the Revised 199 Code to perform, EMTs-I are authorized by division (B) $\frac{(5)}{(6)}$ of 200 section 4765.38 of the Revised Code to perform, and paramedics 201 are authorized by division (B) $\frac{(6)}{(7)}$ of section 4765.39 of the 202 Revised Code to perform; 203 (19) Standards and procedures for implementing the 204 requirements of section 4765.06 of the Revised Code, including 205 206 designations of the persons who are required to report information to the board and the types of information to be 207 reported; 208 (20) Procedures for administering the emergency medical 209 services grant program established under section 4765.07 of the 210 Revised Code; 211

(21) Procedures consistent with Chapter 119. of theRevised Code for appealing decisions of the board;213

(B) The board may adopt, and may amend and rescind, rules	235
in accordance with Chapter 119. of the Revised Code and division	236
(C) of this section that establish the following:	237
(1) Specifications of information that may be collected	238
under the trauma system registry and incidence reporting system	239
created under section 4765.06 of the Revised Code;	240
(2) Standards and procedures for implementing any of the	241
recommendations made by any committees of the board or under	242

section 4765.04 of the Revised Code;

(3) Requirements that a person must meet to receive a 244
certificate to practice as a first responder pursuant to 245
division (A)(2) of section 4765.30 of the Revised Code; 246

(4) Any other rules necessary to implement this chapter. 247

(C) In developing and administering rules adopted under
this chapter, the state board of emergency medical, fire, and
transportation services shall consult with regional directors
and regional physician advisory boards created by section
4765.05 of the Revised Code and emphasize the special needs of
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pediatric and geriatric patients.

(D) Except as otherwise provided in this division, before 254 adopting, amending, or rescinding any rule under this chapter, 255 the board shall submit the proposed rule to the director of 256 public safety for review. The director may review the proposed 257 rule for not more than sixty days after the date it is 258 submitted. If, within this sixty-day period, the director 259 approves the proposed rule or does not notify the board that the 260 rule is disapproved, the board may adopt, amend, or rescind the 261 262 rule as proposed. If, within this sixty-day period, the director notifies the board that the proposed rule is disapproved, the 263 264 board shall not adopt, amend, or rescind the rule as proposed unless at least twelve members of the board vote to adopt, 265 amend, or rescind it. 266

This division does not apply to an emergency rule adopted267in accordance with section 119.03 of the Revised Code.268

Sec. 4765.16. (A) All courses offered through an emergency269medical services training program or an emergency medical270services continuing education program, other than ambulance271

driving, shall be developed under the direction of a physician 272 who specializes in emergency medicine. Each course that deals 273 with trauma care shall be developed in consultation with a 274 physician who specializes in trauma surgery. Except as specified 275 by the state board of emergency medical, fire, and 276 transportation services pursuant to rules adopted under section 277 4765.11 of the Revised Code, each course offered through a 278 training program or continuing education program shall be taught 279 by a person who holds the appropriate certificate to teach 280 issued under section 4765.23 of the Revised Code. 281

(B) A training program for first responders shall meet the
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standards established in rules adopted by the board under
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section 4765.11 of the Revised Code. The program shall include
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courses in both each of the following areas for at least the
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number of hours established by the board's rules:

(1) Emergency victim care;

(2) Reading and interpreting a trauma victim's vital288signs: 289

(3) Recognizing when a victim is wearing a medical290identification product and how to read and respond to291information noted on a medical identification product.292

(C) A training program for emergency medical techniciansbasic shall meet the standards established in rules adopted by the board under section 4765.11 of the Revised Code. The program shall include courses in each of the following areas for at least the number of hours established by the board's rules: 293

(1) Emergency victim care;

(2) Reading and interpreting a trauma victim's vital300

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(3) Triage protocols for adult and pediatric trauma	301
victims;	302
(4) In-hospital training;	303
(5) Clinical training;	304
(6) Training as an ambulance driver <u>;</u>	305
(7) Recognizing when a victim is wearing a medical	306

Each operator of a training program for emergency medical	309
technicians-basic shall allow any pupil in the twelfth grade in	310
a secondary school who is at least seventeen years old and who	311
otherwise meets the requirements for admission into such a	312
training program to be admitted to and complete the program and,	313
as part of the training, to ride in an ambulance with emergency	314
medical technicians-basic, emergency medical technicians-	315
intermediate, and emergency medical technicians-paramedic. Each	316
emergency medical service organization shall allow pupils	317
participating in training programs to ride in an ambulance with	318
emergency medical technicians-basic, advanced emergency medical	319
technicians-intermediate, and emergency medical technicians-	320
paramedic.	321
(D) A training program for emergency medical technicians-	322
intermediate shall meet the standards established in rules	323
adopted by the board under section 4765.11 of the Revised Code.	324

The program shall include, or require as a prerequisite, the

(1) Recognizing symptoms of life-threatening allergic

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reactions and in calculating proper dosage levels and 330 administering injections of epinephrine to persons who suffer 331 life-threatening allergic reactions, conducted in accordance 332 with rules adopted by the board under section 4765.11 of the 333 Revised Code: 334 (2) Venous access procedures; 335 (3) Cardiac monitoring and electrical interventions to 336 support or correct the cardiac function. 337 (E) A training program for emergency medical technicians-338 paramedic shall meet the standards established in rules adopted 339 by the board under section 4765.11 of the Revised Code. The 340 program shall include, or require as a prerequisite, the 341 training specified in divisions (C) and (D) of this section and 342 courses in each of the following areas for at least the number 343 of hours established by the board's rules: 344 Medical terminology; 345 346 (2) Venous access procedures; (3) Airway procedures; 347 (4) Patient assessment and triage; 348 (5) Acute cardiac care, including administration of 349 parenteral injections, electrical interventions, and other 350 emergency medical services; 351 (6) Emergency and trauma victim care beyond that required 352 under division (C) of this section; 353 (7) Clinical training beyond that required under division 354 (C) of this section. 355 (F) A continuing education program for first responders, 356

EMTs-basic, EMTs-I, or paramedics shall meet the standards 357 established in rules adopted by the board under section 4765.11 358 of the Revised Code. A continuing education program shall 359 include instruction and training in subjects established by the 360 board's rules for at least the number of hours established by 361 the board's rules. 362
