## A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

To urge Congress to reinstate the Fairness Doctrine.

## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF OHIO (THE SENATE CONCURRING):

WHEREAS, The Fairness Doctrine was a communications policy	2
from 1949 to 1987 formulated by the Federal Communications	3
Commission; and	4
WHEREAS, The Fairness Doctrine required licensed radio and	5
television broadcasters to present fair and balanced coverage of	6
controversial issues of interest to their communities; and	7
WHEREAS, The January 6, 2021, attack on the U.S. Capitol	8
building demonstrated the murderous consequences of lies being	9
spread through traditional and social media; and	10
WHEREAS, The mob of insurrectionists who attacked our	11
democracy were not foreign enemies but, rather, fellow	12
Americans, who were fed a steady stream of lies about the	13
integrity of our elections and of political rivals; and	14
WHEREAS, The survival of American democracy will depend	15
upon a return to reliable, factual information distributed	16
through the same media; and	17

WHEREAS, Engaged citizens of all political stripes deserve 18 factual information to make informed decisions and act 19 accordingly; now therefore be it 20 RESOLVED, That we, the members of the 134th General 21 Assembly of the State of Ohio, call upon the United States 22 Congress to take the following actions in defense of our 23 Republic: 24 Craft a twenty-first century Fairness Act that ensures 25 cable, broadcast, and radio networks that use the public's 26 airwaves each provide a diversity of opinion on the issues of 27 the day; and 28 Reexamine Section 230 of the Communications Decency Act of 29 1996, 47 U.S.C. 230, to compel social media owners to take 30 responsibility for eliminating the widespread dissemination of 31 lies regarding factual matters; and be it further 32 RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the House of Representatives 33 transmit duly authenticated copies of this resolution to the 34 President of the United States, the President of the United 35 States Senate, the Speaker of the United States House of 36 Representatives, the members of the Ohio congressional 37 delegation, the Governor of Ohio, and the news media of Ohio. 38
