To urge President Biden not to recommend to Congress that	1

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF OHIO (THE SENATE CONCURRING):

WHEREAS, Pursuant to the MISSION Act, a federal law passed in 2018, the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) is required to study the current and future health care needs of veterans across America, and to evaluate VA's health care infrastructure to ensure VA is ready and able to continue to provide veterans with world-class access and outcomes; and

WHEREAS, VA submitted its Asset and Infrastructure Review (AIR) report to President Joseph R. Biden, the United States Congress, and the AIR Commission on March 14, 2022; and

WHEREAS, According to VA, "The AIR report is the result of13years of research and analysis intended to help VA build a14

health care network with the right facilities, in the right places, to provide the right care for all Veterans, including underserved and at-risk Veteran populations in every part of the 17 country - making sure our facilities and services are accessible 18 to Veterans in their communities"; and

WHEREAS, The AIR report includes a recommendation that the VA Medical Center in Chillicothe be closed; and

WHEREAS, The Veterans Affairs Medical Center in Chillicothe has been serving veterans in southern Ohio since 1924; and

WHEREAS, The Veterans Affairs Medical Center in Chillicothe operates outpatient clinics in rural areas, including Athens, Cambridge, Lancaster, Marietta, Portsmouth, and Wilmington, to provide access to care close to rural veterans' homes; and

WHEREAS, The VA Chillicothe Healthcare System also serves the health care needs of veterans living in parts of West Virginia and Kentucky; and

WHEREAS, The facilities and programs of the Veterans Affairs Medical Center in Chillicothe have received accreditation from the College of American Pathologists as well as the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities; and

WHEREAS, The Veterans Affairs Medical Center in Chillicothe has almost 1,400 employees who provide care to over 20,000 veterans each year; and

WHEREAS, In 2021, the Veterans Affairs Medical Center in Chillicothe recorded 898 hospital admissions and 221,979 outpatient visits; and

WHEREAS, It is vital to provide veterans with health care 42 services close to where they live so that they have the means to 43 receive the care that they have earned; now therefore be it 44
