Urging the Governor to order the Ohio Cyber Reserve	1
to investigate possible security breaches in the	2
state's unemployment compensation computer	3
network.	4

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

WHEREAS, There have been documented incidents across the	5
country where malefactors have sought to attack state	6
unemployment compensation systems since the start of the COVID-	7
19 pandemic for the purpose of either defrauding the system,	8
stealing funds, or stealing sensitive information; and	9
WHEREAS, Members of the Ohio General Assembly have received	10
reports from constituents that criminals are accessing	11
legitimate users' unemployment and similar benefit accounts,	12
redirecting benefits, and potentially stealing sensitive	13
personal information; and	14
WHEREAS, Identifying if, how, and when cybercriminals	15
access a network is paramount to preventing system breaches and	16
protecting the sensitive personal information stored therein;	17
now therefore be it	18

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RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the State of	19
Ohio strongly urges the Governor, in cooperation with the	20
Director of Job and Family Services, to order the Ohio Cyber	21
Reserve to examine the computer network the Director uses to	22
administer the state's unemployment compensation system; and be	23
it further	24
RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the State of	25
Ohio strongly encourages the Governor to draft a written report	26
of the examination that does all of the following:	27
(A) Determines whether any entity has gained unauthorized	28
access to the unemployment compensation system;	29
(B) Assesses the risk that an entity will gain unauthorized	30
access to the system in the future;	31
(C) Provides an opinion as to whether current network	32
security measures are adequate to protect legitimate users'	33
personal information;	34
(D) Recommends any measures the Director of Job and Family	35
Services should take to maintain the network's security in	36
accordance with best practices; and be it further	37
RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the State of	38
Ohio advises the Governor to provide a copy of the report to the	39
Unemployment Compensation Modernization and Improvement Council	40
as soon as practical after the report's completion; and be it	41
further	42
RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the House of Representatives	43
transmit duly authenticated copies of this resolution to the	44
Governor and the Director of Job and Family Services and the	45
news media of Ohio.	46
