Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Ohio:

WHEREAS, The members of the House of Representatives of the 128th General Assembly of Ohio take this opportunity to recognize the Governor's Thirtieth Annual Holocaust Commemoration, April 14, 2010; and

WHEREAS, Observed on April 14, 2010, the Governor's Thirtieth Annual Holocaust Commemoration coincides with the Days of Remembrance, to be held April 11-18. These events provide an opportunity for the residents of the State of Ohio to remember and honor the Jews and other minorities who were systematically persecuted in Nazi Germany between 1933 and 1945. The Holocaust, which resulted in the murder of more than six million people, will forever be a warning of the dangers of hatred, bigotry, racism, and prejudice; and

WHEREAS, As we join in these services, let us remember that countless individuals suffered the horrors of the Holocaust, yet somehow survived. This message about the triumph of the human spirit stands as a testament that tyranny shall never prevail; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That we, the members of the House of Representatives of the 128th General Assembly of Ohio, in adopting this Resolution, recognize the Governor's Thirtieth Annual Holocaust Commemoration, April 14, 2010, and urge all Ohioans to participate in this solemn observance; and be it further
