- WHEREAS, The members of the House of Representatives of the 129th General Assembly of Ohio are pleased to congratulate the United States Marine Corps on the auspicious occasion of its One Hundredth Anniversary in aviation; and
- WHEREAS, On May 8, 1911, Captain Washington Irving Chambers of the U.S. Navy requisitioned the first aircraft to be purchased for naval use, and on May 22, 1912, First Lieutenant Alfred A. Cunningham of the U.S. Marine Corps reported for flight training, marking the start of Marine aviation. The operation of aircraft from Navy ships was a revolutionary step that led to the inclusion of aviation in our nation's combined arms concept; and
