A BILL

To provide grants to bars and restaurants and the 1 lodging industry and to make an appropriation. 2

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 201.10. All items in the sections of this act 3 numbered in the 200s are hereby appropriated as designated out 4 of any moneys in the state treasury to the credit of the 5 designated fund. For all operating appropriations made in these 6 7 sections, those in the first column are for fiscal year 2020 and those in the second column are for fiscal year 2021. The 8 9 operating appropriations made in this act are in addition to any other operating appropriations made for the FY 2020-FY 2021 10 biennium. 11 Section 209.10. 12

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Upon the closing of the application period for grants under appropriation item 195561, Bar and Restaurant Assistance, or as soon as possible thereafter, the Director of the Development Services Agency shall determine the amount of grant funding that went unused under the appropriation item, and award grants to bars and restaurants in a manner to be determined by the Development Services Agency. Bars and restaurants that previously received grants under this appropriation item are eligible to receive grants under this appropriation item.

LODGING INDUSTRY GRANTS

The foregoing appropriation item 195562, Lodging Industry 43

Grants, shall be used by the Development Services Agency to 44

provide grants for lodging industry businesses impacted by the 45

COVID-19 pandemic. Grants shall be awarded in amounts of 46

\$10,000, \$20,000, and \$30,000 and shall be awarded based on 47

factors such as a demonstrated loss of revenue and occupancy 48

rates. 49

Section 250.10. Within the limits set forth in this act, 50 the Director of Budget and Management shall establish accounts 51 indicating the source and amount of funds for each appropriation 52 made in this act, and shall determine the form and manner in 53 which appropriation accounts shall be maintained. Expenditures 54 from operating appropriations contained in the sections of this 55 act numbered in the 200s shall be accounted for as though made 56 in H.B. 166 of the 133rd General Assembly. The operating 57 58 appropriations made in these sections are subject to all provisions of H.B. 166 of the 133rd General Assembly that are 59 generally applicable to such appropriations. 60

Section 812.10. Sections 201.10, 209.10, and 250.10 of 61 this act are exempt from the referendum under Ohio Constitution, 62

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Article II, section 1d and therefore take effect immediately	63	
when this act becomes law.	64
