BE IT ENACTED	BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:	
Section 1.	That section 3796.031 of the Revised Code be	5
amended to read	as follows:	6

Sec. 3796.031. (A) As used in this section:	7
(1) "Authorized financial institution" means a state-	8
chartered bank or credit union authorized by the department of	9
commerce to participate in the closed-loop payment processing	10
system.	11
(2) "Closed-loop card" means a debit card authorized by	12
the department of commerce to facilitate transactions in the	
closed-loop payment processing system.	
(3) "Closed-loop payment processing system" means a	15
cashless system established by the department of commerce to	16
monitor and facilitate the financial transactions of medical	17
marijuana entities and registered patients and their caregivers	18

<u>and the financial transactions between medical marijuana</u>	19
entities and their employees, independent contractors, sellers	20
of goods and services, and other medical marijuana entities.	21
(4) "Medical marijuana entity" means a licensed medical	22
marijuana cultivator, processor, dispensary, or testing	23
laboratory.	24
(B) The director of commerce may shall, in accordance with	25
Chapter 119. of the Revised Code, adopt rules that establish a	26
closed-loop payment processing system under which the state	27
creates accounts to be used only by registered patients and	28
caregivers at licensed dispensaries as well as by all license	29
holders under this chapter. The system shall include the	30
<pre>following:</pre>	31
(1) Means for a medical marijuana entity and registered	32
patient and caregiver to activate and establish an account under	33
the system;	34
(2) A requirement that a medical marijuana entity deposit	35
money other than money directly generated from the sale of	36
marijuana either from this state or any other state into an	37
authorized financial institution and use the closed-loop card	38
for all financial transactions as described in division (B) (4)	39
of this section;	40
(3) A requirement that a registered patient and caregiver	41
deposit money into an authorized financial institution and use	42
the closed-loop card to purchase medical marijuana products at	43
licensed retail dispensaries;	44
(4) A requirement that all financial transactions of	45
medical marijuana entities and registered patients and their	46
caregivers and financial transactions between medical marijuana	47

entities and their employees, independent contractors, sellers	48	
of goods and services, and other medical marijuana entities are		
conducted via the closed-loop payment processing system and

(C) The department rules established under division (B) of	59	
this section shall ensure that medical marijuana entities and		
registered patients and caregivers have access to an authorized		
financial institution.		
(D) The system may include record-keeping and accounting	63	
functions that identify all parties involved in those		
transactions. The purpose of the system is to prevent all of the		
following:		
(1) Revenue from the sale of marijuana from going to	67	
criminal enterprises, gangs, and cartels;	68	
(2) The diversion of marijuana from a state where it is	69	
legal in some form under that state's law to another state;	70	
(3) The distribution of marijuana to minors;	71	
(4) The use of state-authorized marijuana activity as a	72	
cover or pretext for the trafficking of other illegal drugs or	73	
for other illegal activity.
