A BILL

To amend section 3313.978 of the Revised Code to	1
increase the maximum amount that may be awarded	2
to students under the Pilot Project (Cleveland)	3
Scholarship Program.	4

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 3313.978 of the Revised Code be	5
amended to read as follows:	6
Sec. 3313.978. (A) Annually by the first day of November,	7
the superintendent of public instruction shall notify the pilot	8
project school district of the number of initial scholarships	9
that the state superintendent will be awarding in each of grades	10
kindergarten through twelve.	11
The state superintendent shall provide information about	12
the scholarship program to all students residing in the	13
district, shall accept applications from any such students until	14
such date as shall be established by the state superintendent as	15
a deadline for applications, and shall establish criteria for	16
the selection of students to receive scholarships from among all	17
those applying prior to the deadline, which criteria shall give	18

preference to students from low-income families. The state19superintendent shall notify students of their selection prior to20the fifteenth day of January.21

(1) A student receiving a pilot project scholarship may
utilize it at an alternative public school by notifying the
district superintendent, at any time before the beginning of the
school year, of the name of the public school in an adjacent
school district to which the student has been accepted pursuant
to section 3327.06 of the Revised Code.

(2) A student may decide to utilize a pilot project
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scholarship at a registered private school in the district if
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all of the following conditions are met:
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(a) By the fifteenth day of February of the preceding school year, or at any time prior to the start of the school year, the parent makes an application on behalf of the student to a registered private school.

(b) The registered private school notifies the parent and35the state superintendent as follows that the student has been36admitted:37

(i) By the fifteenth day of March of the preceding schoolyear if the student filed an application by the fifteenth day ofFebruary and was admitted by the school pursuant to division (A)of section 3313.977 of the Revised Code;

(ii) Within one week of the decision to admit the studentif the student is admitted pursuant to division (C) of section3313.977 of the Revised Code.

(c) The student actually enrolls in the registered private
school to which the student was first admitted or in another
registered private school in the district or in a public school
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in an adjacent school district.

(B) The state superintendent shall also award in any 49 school year tutorial assistance grants to a number of students 50 equal to the number of students who receive scholarships under 51 division (A) of this section. Tutorial assistance grants shall 52 be awarded solely to students who are enrolled in the public 53 schools of the district in a grade level covered by the pilot 54 project. Tutorial assistance grants may be used solely to obtain 55 tutorial assistance from a provider approved pursuant to 56 division (D) of section 3313.976 of the Revised Code. 57

All students wishing to obtain tutorial assistance grants shall make application to the state superintendent by the first day of the school year in which the assistance will be used. The state superintendent shall award assistance grants in accordance with criteria the superintendent shall establish.

(C)(1) In the case of basic scholarships for students in grades kindergarten through <u>eight twelve</u>, the scholarship amount shall not exceed the lesser of the net tuition charges of the alternative school the scholarship recipient attends or four <u>seven</u> thousand six hundred fifty dollars.

In the case of basic scholarships for students in gradesnine through twelve, the scholarship amount shall not exceed thelesser of the net tuition charges of the alternative school thescholarship recipient attends or six thousand dollars.

The net tuition and fees charged to a student shall be the 72 tuition amount specified by the alternative school minus all 73 other financial aid, discounts, and adjustments received for the 74 student. In cases where discounts are offered for multiple 75 students from the same family, and not all students in the same 76

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family are scholarship recipients, the net tuition amount 77 attributable to the scholarship recipient shall be the lowest 78 net tuition to which the family is entitled. 79

(2) The state superintendent shall provide for an increase
80 in the basic scholarship amount in the case of any student who
81 is a mainstreamed student with a disability and shall further
82 increase such amount in the case of any separately educated
83 student with a disability. Such increases shall take into
84 account the instruction, related services, and transportation
85 costs of educating such students.

(3) In the case of tutorial assistance grants, the grant
amount shall not exceed the lesser of the provider's actual
charges for such assistance or:

(a) Before fiscal year 2007, a percentage established by the state superintendent, not to exceed twenty per cent, of the amount of the pilot project school district's average basic scholarship amount;

(b) In fiscal year 2007 and thereafter, four hundred 94 dollars. 95

(D) (1) Annually by the first day of November, the state
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superintendent shall estimate the maximum per-pupil scholarship
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amounts for the ensuing school year. The state superintendent
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shall make this estimate available to the general public at the
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offices of the district board of education together with the
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forms required by division (D) (2) of this section.

(2) Annually by the fifteenth day of January, the chief
administrator of each registered private school located in the
pilot project district and the principal of each public school
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in such district shall complete a parental information form and

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forward it to the president of the board of education. The106parental information form shall be prescribed by the department107of education and shall provide information about the grade108levels offered, the numbers of students, tuition amounts,109achievement test results, and any sectarian or other110organizational affiliations.111

(E) (1) Only for the purpose of administering the pilot
project scholarship program, the department may request from any
of the following entities the data verification code assigned
under division (D) (2) of section 3301.0714 of the Revised Code
to any student who is seeking a scholarship under the program:

(a) The school district in which the student is entitled
to attend school under section 3313.64 or 3313.65 of the Revised
Code;

(b) If applicable, the community school in which the student is enrolled;

(c) The independent contractor engaged to create andmaintain data verification codes.123

(2) Upon a request by the department under division (E)(1) 124 of this section for the data verification code of a student 125 seeking a scholarship or a request by the student's parent for 126 that code, the school district or community school shall submit 127 that code to the department or parent in the manner specified by 128 the department. If the student has not been assigned a code, 129 because the student will be entering kindergarten during the 130 school year for which the scholarship is sought, the district 131 shall assign a code to that student and submit the code to the 132 department or parent by a date specified by the department. If 133 the district does not assign a code to the student by the 134

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specified date, the department shall assign a code to the student. 136 The department annually shall submit to each school 137 district the name and data verification code of each student 138 residing in the district who is entering kindergarten, who has 139 been awarded a scholarship under the program, and for whom the 140 department has assigned a code under this division. 141 (3) The department shall not release any data verification 142 code that it receives under division (E) of this section to any 143 person except as provided by law. 144 (F) Any document relative to the pilot project scholarship 145 program that the department holds in its files that contains 146 both a student's name or other personally identifiable 147 information and the student's data verification code shall not 148 be a public record under section 149.43 of the Revised Code. 149 (G)(1) The department annually shall compile the scores 150 attained by scholarship students enrolled in registered private 151 schools on the assessments administered to the students pursuant 152 to division (A)(11) of section 3313.976 of the Revised Code. The 153 154 scores shall be aggregated as follows:

(a) By school district, which shall include all 155 scholarship students residing in the pilot project school 156 district who are enrolled in a registered private school and 157 were required to take an assessment pursuant to division (A) (11) 158 of section 3313.976 of the Revised Code; 159

(b) By registered private school, which shall include all 160 scholarship students enrolled in that school who were required 161 to take an assessment pursuant to division (A)(11) of section 162 3313.976 of the Revised Code. 163

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(2) The department shall disaggregate the student	164
performance data described in division (G)(1) of this section	165
according to the following categories:	166
(a) Grade level;	167
(b) Race and ethnicity;	168
(c) Gender;	169
(d) Students who have participated in the scholarship	170
program for three or more years;	171
(e) Students who have participated in the scholarship	172
program for more than one year and less than three years;	173
(f) Students who have participated in the scholarship	174
program for one year or less;	175
(g) Economically disadvantaged students.	176
(3) The department shall post the student performance data	177
required under divisions (G)(1) and (2) of this section on its	178
web site and shall include that data in the information about	179
the scholarship program provided to students under division (A)	180
of this section. In reporting student performance data under	181
this division, the department shall not include any data that is	182
statistically unreliable or that could result in the	183
identification of individual students. For this purpose, the	184
department shall not report performance data for any group that	185
contains less than ten students.	186
(4) The department shall provide the parent of each	187
scholarship student enrolled in a registered private school with	188
information comparing the student's performance on the	189
assessments administered pursuant to division (A)(11) of section	190
3313.976 of the Revised Code with the average performance of	191

similar students enrolled in the building operated by the pilot	192
project school district that the scholarship student would	193
otherwise attend. In calculating the performance of similar	194
students, the department shall consider age, grade, race and	195
ethnicity, gender, and socioeconomic status.	196
Section 2. That existing section 3313.978 of the Revised	197
Code is hereby repealed.	198
