A BILL

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section 1
4503.933 of the Revised Code to create the 2
"Creative Ohio" license plate. 3

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.21 be amended and section 4
4503.933 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows: 5

Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state 6
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 7
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid 8
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of 9
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced 10
in division (B) of this section. 11

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 12
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 13

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 14
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 15
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 16
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 17
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 18
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 19

the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 20
other abortion-related activities. 21

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 22
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 23
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 24
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 25
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 26
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 27
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 28
other money in that fund. 29

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 30
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 31
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 32
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 33

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 34
receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 35
national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 36
amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 37
chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 38
chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 39
assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 40
directly to their clients. 41

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 42
receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 43
national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 44
it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with 45
pancreatic cancer and their families. 46

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 47
receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the 48

Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the 49
contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social 50
support services for adults who have sickle cell disease. 51

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 52
receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the 53
St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for 54
its research and other programs. 55

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 56
receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to 57
special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions 58
for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities. 59

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 60
receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the 61
children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the 62
contributions for its research and other programs. 63

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 64
receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to 65
the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to 66
raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic 67
pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer. 68

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 69
receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 70
the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 71
children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 72
research for the cure of childhood cancers. 73

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 74
receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 75
future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 76
contributions into its general account to be used for 77

educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 78
America foundation. 79

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 80
receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 81
4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 82
extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 83
the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 84

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 85
pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 86
cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 87
scholarships and other educational activities. 88

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 89
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 90
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 91
contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 92
that organization. 93

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 94
receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 95
Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 96
scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or 97
events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 98

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 99
pursuant to section 4503.507 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 100
aerospace institute, which shall use those contributions to 101
facilitate student internships in aerospace and educational 102
programming. 103

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 104
pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the 105
organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that 106

organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in need. 107
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the Ohio chapters of a kid again. 109
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The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the university or college whose name or marking or design appears on collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that section. A university or college that receives contributions from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general scholarship fund. 113
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such funds as provided in this section. 120
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such 129
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funds as provided in this section. 137

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 138
receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the 139
university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of 140
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 141
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 142
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 143
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 144
university of Alabama to effectuate the distribution of such 145
funds as provided in this section. 146

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 147
receives pursuant to section 4503.518 of the Revised Code to the 148
Nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the 149
contributions for the "On Our Sleeves" campaign. 150

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 151
receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 152
Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 153
for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 154
cyclists of all ages. 155

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 156
receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 157
"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 158
incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 159
of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 160
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 161
educational, and cultural events at the monument. 162

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 163
receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 164
fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 165

the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 166
lighthouses of fairport harbor. 167

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 168
receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 169
Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 170
contributions only to promote and support the football team of 171
Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 172

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 173
receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 174
United States power squadron district seven which shall annually 175
distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United 176
States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron 177
district shall use the money it receives under this section to 178
pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 179
sponsors within this state. 180

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 181
receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 182
Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 183
international, which shall use the money it receives under this 184
section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 185
activities. 186

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 187
receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 188
Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 189
under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 190
its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 191
to children, young adults, and families in this state. 192

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 193
receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 194

Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 195
receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 196
to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 197
to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 198
their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 199
research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 200
the improvement of patient outcomes. 201

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 202
receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 203
thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 204
organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 205
organization in paying for the charitable activities and 206
programs it sponsors in support of United States military 207
personnel, veterans, and their families. 208

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 209
receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 210
disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 211
programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 212
families. 213

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 214
receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 215
pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 216
into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 217
be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 218
hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 219
of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 220
destination. 221

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 222
the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 223
to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 224

the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 225
programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 226

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 227
contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 228
4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 229
source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 230
designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 231
Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 232
section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 233
cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 234
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 235
pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 236
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 237

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 238
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 239
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 240

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 241
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 242
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 243
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 244
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 245
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 246
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 247
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 248
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 249
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 250
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 251
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 252
under this section. 253

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 254

receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 255
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 256
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 257
programs. 258

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 259
receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 260
western reserve historical society, which shall use the 261
contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 262

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 263
receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the 264
Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple 265
negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the 266
contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 267

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 268
receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the 269
central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, 270
which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the 271
Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory 272
the person who paid the contribution resides. 273

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 274
receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 275
state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 276
deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 277
establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 278
distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 279
ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 280
for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 281
managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 282
Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 283
registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 284

such payments are to be made. 285

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 286
receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 287
Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 288
expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 289
river watershed. 290

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 291
receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the 292
Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen 293
nature preserve. 294

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 295
receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 296
conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use 297
the money in support of the park. 298

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 299
receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the 300
Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the 301
contributions for wildlife preservation purposes. 302

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 303
receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the 304
girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the 305
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 306

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 307
receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 308
Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 309
contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 310
information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 311
local beekeeping programs. 312

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 313

receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the 314
national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 315
contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 316
legends to inspire future leaders. 317

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 318
receives pursuant to section 4503.578 of the Revised Code to 319
keep Ohio beautiful, incorporated, which shall use the 320
contributions towards its mission of empowering Ohio communities 321
to take greater responsibility for improving the local 322
environment through litter prevention, beautification, community 323
greening, waste reduction, and recycling. 324

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 325
receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 326
national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use 327
the contributions for educational purposes. 328

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 329
receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the 330
Ohio sons of the American legion, which shall use the 331
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 332

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 333
pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 334
contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 335
applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 336
professional sports team located in the county of that sports 337
commission and that is participating in the license plate 338
program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 339
of the county of residence of an applicant. 340

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 341
contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 342

the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 343
that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 344
participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 345
(G) of that section. 346

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 347
receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 348
pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 349
which shall use the contributions for the protection and 350
preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 351
Ohio and for educational programs. 352

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 353
receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 354
pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 355
supporting cancer research. 356

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 357
receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 358
Stan Hywet hall and gardens. 359

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 360
receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the 361
Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad. 362

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 363
receives pursuant to section 4503.597 of the Revised Code to the 364
Circleville pumpkin show, incorporated, which shall use the 365
contributions to promote good will surrounding the Circleville 366
pumpkin show as a nonprofit annual event. 367

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 368
receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 369
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 370
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 371

throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 372

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 373
receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 374
girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 375
heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 376
manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 377
scouts. 378

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 379
receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 380
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 381
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 382
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 383

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 384
receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the 385
charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., 386
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 387

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 388
receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the 389
Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, 390
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 391

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 392
receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 393
Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 394
of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 395
charitable purposes. 396

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 397
receives pursuant to section 4503.703 of the Revised Code to the 398
Ohio chapter of the loyal order of the moose. 399

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 400

receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the 401
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 402
deposit the fees into its general account to be used for 403
purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated. 404

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 405
receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 406
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 407
deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 408
used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 409
enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 410
methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 411

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 412
pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 413
concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 414
contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 415
to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 416
in the line of duty. 417

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 418
pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater 419
Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 420
contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 421
the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 422

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 423
pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 424
association of chiefs of police. 425

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 426
receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 427
fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 428
to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 429

families. 430

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 431
receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the 432
fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall 433
use the contributions to further the mission of the commission. 434

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 435
receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 436
organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 437
association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 438
Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 439
shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 440
administering a program to secure the proper representation in 441
the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 442
children, and for the training and supervision of persons 443
participating in that program. 444

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 445
receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the 446
Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the 447
contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state. 448

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 449
receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the 450
Ohio Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, 451
which shall use the contributions for programs, education, and 452
advocacy purposes throughout the state. 453

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 454
receives pursuant to section 4503.725 of the Revised Code to the 455
ALS association central & southern Ohio chapter, which shall 456
split the contributions between that chapter and the ALS 457
association northern Ohio chapter in accordance with any 458

agreement between the two associations. The contributions shall 459
be used to discover treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, 460
advocate for, and empower people affected by ALS to live their 461
lives to the fullest. 462

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 463
receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to 464
Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the 465
contributions into its general account to be used for purposes 466
of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated. 467

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 468
receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the 469
Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to 470
commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in 471
Cleveland, Ohio. 472

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 473
receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 474
central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research 475
foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the 476
chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose 477
geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 478
resides. 479

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 480
receives pursuant to section 4503.734 of the Revised Code to the 481
Ohio highway patrol auxiliary foundation, which shall use the 482
contributions to fulfill the foundation's mission of supporting 483
law enforcement education and assistance. 484

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 485
receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the 486
Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the 487

moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section 488
4503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written 489
agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos. 490

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 491
receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the 492
rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston, 493
Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and 494
used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the 495
rotary foundation. 496

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 497
receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the 498
Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the 499
contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained 500
under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation. 501

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 502
receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to 503
buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the 504
contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs. 505

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 506

counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, 1047
sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 1048
students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 1049
suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 1050
providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 1051
faculty of the school to receive training in providing those 1052
services. The school principal or, in the school principal's 1053
discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any 1054
charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those 1055
services. The school shall ensure that any such charitable 1056
organization is exempt from federal income taxation under 1057
subsection 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school 1058
shall not use the contributions it receives for any other 1059
purpose. 1060

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1061
receives pursuant to section 4503.956 of the Revised Code to the 1062
Liberty Center local school district, which shall use the 1063

contributions for its gifted programs and special education and 1064
related services. 1065

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1066
receives pursuant to section 4503.957 of the Revised Code to 1067
John F. Kennedy Catholic school located in Warren. The school 1068
shall not use the contributions it receives for any political 1069
purpose. 1070

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1071
receives pursuant to section 4503.958 of the Revised Code to 1072
Elder high school located in the municipal corporation of 1073
Cincinnati. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 1074
contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 1075
students, twenty-five per cent of the contributions to benefit 1076
arts and enrichment at the school, and twenty-five per cent of 1077
the contributions to benefit athletics at the school. 1078

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1079
receives pursuant to section 4503.961 of the Revised Code to 1080
Fairfield senior high school located in the municipal 1081
corporation of Fairfield. The high school shall not use the 1082
contributions for any political purpose. 1083

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1084
receives pursuant to section 4503.962 of the Revised Code to 1085
Hamilton high school located in the municipal corporation of 1086
Hamilton. The high school shall not use the contributions for 1087
any political purpose. 1088

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1089
receives pursuant to section 4503.963 of the Revised Code to 1090
Ross high school located in Ross township in Butler county. The 1091
high school shall not use the contributions for any political 1092

purpose. 1093

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1094
receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the 1095
friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money 1096
to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free 1097
emergency medical first response throughout Israel. 1098

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1099
receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the 1100
Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and 1101
activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the 1102
city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park." 1103

(C) All investment earnings of the license plate 1104
contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than 1105
the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall 1106
distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this 1107
section the investment income the fund earned the previous 1108
calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an 1109
entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity 1110
received from the fund during the previous calendar year. 1111

Sec. 4503.933. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger 1112
car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other 1113
vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles 1114
may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle 1115
and issuance of "Creative Ohio" license plates. The application 1116
may be combined with a request for a special reserved license 1117
plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code. Upon 1118
receipt of the completed application and compliance by the 1119
applicant with divisions (B) and (C) of this section, the 1120
registrar shall issue to the applicant the appropriate vehicle 1121
registration and a set of "Creative Ohio" license plates and a 1122

validation sticker, or a validation sticker alone when required 1123
by section 4503.191 of the Revised Code. 1124

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily 1125
inscribed on the license plates, "Creative Ohio" license plates 1126
shall display an appropriate logo and words that are selected by 1127
representatives of the Ohio citizens for the arts foundation and 1128
approved by the registrar. "Creative Ohio" license plates shall 1129
display county identification stickers that identify the county 1130
of registration as required under section 4503.19 of the Revised 1131
Code. 1132

(B) "Creative Ohio" license plates and a validation 1133
sticker, or validation sticker alone, shall be issued upon 1134
receipt of an application for registration of a motor vehicle 1135
under this section; payment of the regular license tax as 1136
prescribed under section 4503.04 of the Revised Code, any 1137
applicable motor vehicle license tax levied under Chapter 4504. 1138
of the Revised Code, any applicable additional fee prescribed by 1139
section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code, an additional 1140
administrative fee of ten dollars, and a contribution as 1141
provided in division (C) (1) of this section; and compliance with 1142
all other applicable laws relating to the registration of motor 1143
vehicles. 1144

(C) (1) For each application for registration and 1145
registration renewal notice the registrar receives under this 1146
section, the registrar shall collect a contribution of twenty- 1147
five dollars. The registrar shall deposit this contribution into 1148
the state treasury to the credit of the license plate 1149
contribution fund created in section 4501.21 of the Revised 1150
Code. 1151

(2) The registrar shall deposit the administrative fee of 1152

ten dollars, the purpose of which is to compensate the bureau of 1153
motor vehicles for additional services required in the issuing 1154
of "Creative Ohio" license plates, into the state treasury to 1155
the credit of the public safety - highway purposes fund created 1156
in section 4501.06 of the Revised Code. 1157

Section 2. That existing section 4501.21 of the Revised 1158
Code is hereby repealed. 1159
