BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4765.16 be amended and section	5
4765.163 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	6
Sec. 4765.16. (A) All courses offered through an emergency	7
medical services training program or an emergency medical	8
services continuing education program, other than <u>an</u> ambulance	9
driving course and the human trafficking-related course	10
developed under section 4765.163 of the Revised Code, shall be	11
developed under the direction of a physician who specializes in	12
emergency medicine. Each course that deals with trauma care	13
shall be developed in consultation with a physician who	14

(C) The board shall adopt rules under section 4765.11 of	108
the Revised Code governing the human trafficking-related	109
training course developed under this section. The rules shall	110
require the training course to be not less than one hour of	111
