To amend section 3737.83 and to enact section	1
3781.062 of the Revised Code relating to the	2
State Fire Code and Building Code and to amend	3
the version of section 3737.83 of the Revised	4
Code that is scheduled to take effect December	5
29, 2023, to continue the provisions of this act	6
on and after that effective date.	7

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 3737.83 be amended and section	8
3781.062 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	9
Sec. 3737.83. The fire marshal shall, as part of the state	10
fire code, adopt rules to:	11
(A) Establish minimum standards of performance for fire	12
protection equipment and fire fighting equipment;	13
(B) Establish minimum standards of training, fix minimum	14
qualifications, and require certificates for all persons who	15
engage in the business for profit of installing, testing,	16
repairing, or maintaining fire protection equipment;	17
(C) Provide for the issuance of certificates required	18

under division (B) of this section and establish the fees to be charged for such certificates. A certificate shall be granted, renewed, or revoked according to rules the fire marshal shall adopt.

(D) Establish minimum standards of flammability for consumer goods in any case where the federal government or any department or agency thereof has established, or may from time to time establish standards of flammability for consumer goods. The standards established by the fire marshal shall be identical to the minimum federal standards.

In any case where the federal government or any department or agency thereof, establishes standards of flammability for consumer goods subsequent to the adoption of a flammability standard by the fire marshal, standards previously adopted by the fire marshal shall not continue in effect to the extent such standards are not identical to the minimum federal standards.

With respect to the adoption of minimum standards of flammability, this division shall supersede any authority granted a political subdivision by any other section of the Revised Code.

(E) Establish minimum standards pursuant to section
5104.05 of the Revised Code for fire prevention and fire safety
40 in child day-care centers and in type A family day-care homes,
41 as defined in section 5104.01 of the Revised Code.
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(F) Establish minimum standards for fire prevention and
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safety in a residential facility licensed under section 5119.34
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of the Revised Code that provides accommodations, supervision,
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and personal care services for three to sixteen unrelated
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adults. The fire marshal shall adopt the rules under this

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division in consultation with the director of mental health and 48 addiction services and interested parties designated by the 49 director of mental health and addiction services. 50 (G) (1) Establish that occupant load shall not include an 51 exterior patio that has a means of egress on at least three 52 sides and in which each means of eqress is compliant with the 53 "Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990," 42 U.S.C. 12102, et 54 55 sea. (2) Notwithstanding any provision of section 121.95 of the 56 Revised Code to the contrary, a regulatory restriction contained 57 in a rule adopted under division (G)(1) of this section is not 58 subject to sections 121.95 to 121.953 of the Revised Code. 59 Sec. 3781.062. The director of commerce, in collaboration 60 with the state fire marshal, the board of building standards, 61 and representatives of local building departments, shall develop 62 quidelines for the enforcement of the Ohio building code and 63 state fire code in a coordinated manner, including the 64 interaction of exemptions from one code with the requirements of 65 the other code. 66 Section 2. That existing section 3737.83 of the Revised 67 Code is hereby repealed. 68 Section 3. That the version of section 3737.83 of the 69 Revised Code that is scheduled to take effect December 29, 2023, 70 be amended to read as follows: 71 Sec. 3737.83. The state fire marshal shall, as part of the 72 state fire code, adopt rules to: 73 (A) Establish minimum standards of performance for fire 74 protection equipment and fire fighting equipment; 75

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(B) Establish minimum standards of training, fix minimum 76 qualifications, and require certificates for all persons who 77 engage in the business for profit of installing, testing, 78 repairing, or maintaining fire protection equipment; 79 (C) Provide for the issuance of certificates required 80 under division (B) of this section and establish the fees to be 81 charged for such certificates. A certificate shall be granted, 82 renewed, or revoked according to rules the state fire marshal 83 shall adopt, except that the state fire marshal shall grant a 84 certificate in accordance with Chapter 4796. of the Revised Code 85 to an applicant if either of the following applies: 86

(1) The applicant holds a license or certificate in87another state.88

(2) The applicant has satisfactory work experience, a
government certification, or a private certification as
government certification, or a private certification as
described in that chapter as a person engaged in the business of
installing, testing, repairing, or maintaining fire protection
government in a state that does not issue that certificate.

(D) Establish minimum standards of flammability for

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extent such standards are not identical to the minimum federal105standards.106With respect to the adoption of minimum standards of107

flammability, this division shall supersede any authority 108 granted a political subdivision by any other section of the 109 Revised Code. 110

as defined in section 5104.01 of the Revised Code.

(F) Establish minimum standards for fire prevention and 115 safety in a residential facility licensed under section 5119.34 116 of the Revised Code that provides accommodations, supervision, 117 and personal care services for three to sixteen unrelated 118 adults. The state fire marshal shall adopt the rules under this 119 division in consultation with the director of mental health and 120 addiction services and interested parties designated by the 121 director of mental health and addiction services. 122

(G) (1) Establish that occupant load shall not include an123exterior patio that has a means of egress on at least three124sides and in which each means of egress is compliant with the125"Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990," 42 U.S.C. 12102, et126seq.127

(2) Notwithstanding any provision of section 121.95 of the128Revised Code to the contrary, a regulatory restriction contained129in a rule adopted under division (G) (1) of this section is not130subject to sections 121.95 to 121.953 of the Revised Code.131

Section 4. That the existing version of section 3737.83 of132the Revised Code that is scheduled to take effect December 29,133

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2023, is hereby repealed.	134
Section 5. Sections 3 and 4 of this act shall take effect	135
