BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 4501.21 and 4503.98 be amended 7 and section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as 8 follows: 9 Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state 10 treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 11 consist of all contributions paid by motor vehicle registrants 12 and collected by the registrar of motor vehicles pursuant to 13 sections 4503.491, 4503.492, 4503.493, 4503.494, 4503.495, 14 4503.496, 4503.497, 4503.498, 4503.499, <u>4503.4910,</u> 4503.50, 15 4503.501, 4503.502, 4503.505, 4503.51, 4503.514, 4503.521, 16

4503.522, 4503.523, 4503.524, 4503.525, 4503.526, 4503.528, 17 4503.529, 4503.531, 4503.534, 4503.545, 4503.55, 4503.551, 18 4503.552, 4503.553, 4503.554, 4503.555, 4503.556, 4503.561, 19 4503.562, 4503.564, 4503.565, 4503.576, 4503.577, 4503.591, 20 4503.592, 4503.67, 4503.68, 4503.69, 4503.701, 4503.702, 21 4503.71, 4503.711, 4503.712, 4503.713, 4503.715, 4503.72, 22 4503.722, 4503.73, 4503.732, 4503.733, 4503.74, 4503.75, 23 4503.751, 4503.752, 4503.763, 4503.85, 4503.86, 4503.87, 24 4503.871, 4503.874, 4503.877, 4503.89, 4503.90, 4503.901, 25 4503.902, 4503.903, 4503.904, 4503.92, 4503.94, 4503.97, and 26 4503.98 of the Revised Code. 27 (B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 28 29 registrar collects in the fund as follows: 30 The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 31 cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 32 programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 33 cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 34 quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 35 the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 36 other abortion-related activities. 37 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 38 receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 39 organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 40 deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 41 42 organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 43 manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 44 other money in that fund. 45

The registrar shall pay the contributions received

pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism47society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs48and autism awareness efforts throughout the state.49

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 50 receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 51 national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 52 amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 53 chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 54 chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 55 assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 56 57 directly to their clients.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with pancreatic cancer and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar72receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to73special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions74for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.75

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 76 receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the 77 children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the 78 contributions for its research and other programs. 79

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 85 receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 86 future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 87 contributions into its general account to be used for 88 educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 89 America foundation. 90

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 94 the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 96 pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 97 cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 98 scholarships and other educational activities. 99

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 100 pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 101 organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 102 contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 103 104 that organization.

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The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 105 receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 106 university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 107 collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 108 section. A university or college that receives contributions 109 from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 110 scholarship fund. 111

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 112 receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 113 university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 114 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 115 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 116 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 117 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 118 university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 119 funds as provided in this section. 120

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 121 receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 122 Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 123 for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 124 cyclists of all ages. 125

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 126 receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 127 "friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 128 incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 129 of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 130 expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 131 educational, and cultural events at the monument. 132

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar133receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the134

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fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for135the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the136lighthouses of fairport harbor.137

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar138receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the139Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the140contributions only to promote and support the football team of141Washington high school of the Massillon city school district.142

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 143 receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 144 United States power squadron districts seven, eleven, twenty- 145 four, and twenty-nine in equal amounts. Each power squadron 146 district shall use the money it receives under this section to 147 pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 148 sponsors within this state. 149

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 150 receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 151 Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 152 international, which shall use the money it receives under this 153 section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 154 activities. 155

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 156 receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 157 Ohio association of child caring agencies, which shall use the 158 money it receives under this section to pay the expenses it 159 incurs in advancing its mission of sustainably improving the 160 provision of services to children, young adults, and families in 161 this state. 162

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

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receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 164 Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 165 receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 166 to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 167 to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 168 their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 169 research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 170 the improvement of patient outcomes. 171

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 172 receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 173 thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 174 organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 175 organization in paying for the charitable activities and 176 programs it sponsors in support of United States military 177 personnel, veterans, and their families. 178

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for programs that serve disabled American veterans and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 184 receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 185 pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 186 into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 187 be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 188 hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 189 of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 190 destination. 191

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 192 the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 193

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to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use194the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and195programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state.196

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 197 contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 198 4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 199 source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 200 designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 201 Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 202 203 section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 204 veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 205 pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 206 maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 207

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 211 receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 212 Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 213 corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 214 the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 215 members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 216 charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 217 provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 218 Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 219 for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 220 promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 221 incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 222 under this section. 223

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 224 receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 225 Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 226 the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 227 programs. 228

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the western reserve historical society, which shall use the contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar233receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the234Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple235negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the236contributions for charitable and educational purposes.237

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 238 receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 239 state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 240 deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 241 establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 242 distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 243 ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 244 for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 245 managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 246 Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 247 registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 248 such payments are to be made. 249

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar250receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the251Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the252expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning253

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river watershed.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 255 receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to 256 Antioch college for the use of the Glen Helen ecology institute 257 to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve. 258

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 259 receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 260 conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use 261 the money in support of the park.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 263 receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 264 Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 265 contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 266 information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 267 local beekeeping programs. 268

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 269 receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the 270 national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 271 contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 272 legends to inspire future leaders. 273

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 274 pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 275 contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 276 applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 277 professional sports team located in the county of that sports 278 commission and that is participating in the license plate 279 program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 280 of the county of residence of an applicant. 281

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 282

contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of283the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates284that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is285participating in the license plate program pursuant to division286(G) of that section.287

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 288 receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 289 pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 290 which shall use the contributions for the protection and 291 preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 292 Ohio and for educational programs. 293

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 299 receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 300 great river council of the girl scouts of the United States of 301 America. The council shall distribute all contributions in an 302 equitable manner throughout the state to regional councils of 303 the girl scouts. 304

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar305receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the306Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council307shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner308throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.309

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar310receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the311

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Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio,312which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes.313

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 314 receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 315 Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 316 of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 317 charitable purposes. 318

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar319receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the320fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall321deposit the fees into its general account to be used for322purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated.323

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 324 receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 325 fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 326 deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 327 used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 328 enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 329 methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 330

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 331 pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 332 concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 333 contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 334 to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 335 in the line of duty. 336

The registrar shall pay the contributions received337pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater338Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those339contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in340

the line of duty and support its charitable purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 342 receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 343 fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 344 to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 345 families. 346

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 347 receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 348 organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 349 association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 350 Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 351 shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 352 administering a program to secure the proper representation in 353 the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 354 children, and for the training and supervision of persons 355 participating in that program. 356

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar361receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to362Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the363contributions into its general account to be used for purposes364of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated.365

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 366 receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the 367 Siegel & Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to 368 commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in 369

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Cleveland, Ohio.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar371receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the372central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research373foundation-, which shall distribute the contributions to the374chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose375geographic territory the person who paid the contribution376resides.377

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 378 receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the 379 Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the 380 moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section 381 4503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written 382 agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos. 383

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 384 receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the 385 rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston, 386 Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and 387 used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the 388 rotary foundation. 389

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 390 receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the 391 Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the 392 contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained 393 under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation. 394

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 395 receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to 396 buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the 397 contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs. 398

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 399 receives pursuant to section 4503.763 of the Revised Code to the 400 Ohio history connection to be used solely to build, support, and 401 maintain the Ohio battleflag collection within the Ohio history 402 connection. 403

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.85 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sea grant college program to be used for Lake Erie area research projects.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar408receives pursuant to section 4503.86 of the Revised Code to the409Ohio Lincoln highway historic byway, which shall use those410contributions solely to promote and support the historical411preservation and advertisement of the Lincoln highway in this412state.413

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 414 receives pursuant to section 4503.87 of the Revised Code to the 415 Grove City little league dream field fund, which shall use those 416 contributions solely to build, maintain, and improve youth 417 baseball fields within the municipal corporation of Grove City. 418

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 419 receives pursuant to section 4503.871 of the Revised Code to the 420 Solon city school district. The school district shall use the 421 422 contributions it receives to pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school district's students that assist 423 in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being 424 of the students. The services provided may include bereavement 425 counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, 426 sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 427 students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 428

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suicide prevention, and human trafficking. The school district 429 superintendent or, in the school district superintendent's 430 discretion, the appropriate school principal or appropriate 431 school counselors shall determine any charitable organizations 432 that the school district hires to provide those services. The 4.3.3 school district also may use the contributions it receives to 434 pay for members of the faculty of the school district to receive 435 training in providing such services to the students of the 436 school district. The school district shall ensure that any 437 charitable organization that is hired by the district is exempt 438 from federal income taxation under subsection 501(c)(3) of the 439 Internal Revenue Code. The school district shall not use the 440 contributions it receives for any other purpose. 441

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 442 receives pursuant to section 4503.874 of the Revised Code to St. 443 Edward high school located in the municipal corporation of 444 Lakewood. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 445 contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 446 students. The school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to 447 pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's 448 students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and 449 emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may 450 include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving 451 techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and 452 education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug 453 abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 454 providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 455 faculty of the school to receive training in providing those 456 services. The school principal or, in the school principal's 4.57 discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any 458 charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those 459

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services. The school shall ensure that any such charitable460organization is exempt from federal income taxation under461subsection 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school462shall not use the contributions it receives for any other463purpose.464

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 465 receives pursuant to section 4503.877 of the Revised Code to the 466 Independence local school district. The school district shall 467 use the contributions it receives to pay the expenses it incurs 468 in providing services to the school district's students that 469 assist in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional 470 well-being of the students. The services provided may include 471 472 bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and 473 education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug 474 abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. The school 475 district superintendent or, in the school district 476 superintendent's discretion, the appropriate school principal or 477 appropriate school counselors shall determine any charitable 478 organizations that the school district hires to provide those 479 services. The school district also may use the contributions it 480 receives to pay for members of the faculty of the school 481 district to receive training in providing such services to the 482 students of the school district. The school district shall 483 ensure that any charitable organization that is hired by the 484 district is exempt from federal income taxation under subsection 485 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school district 486 shall not use the contributions it receives for any other 487 488 purpose.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar489receives pursuant to section 4503.89 of the Revised Code to the490

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American red cross of greater Columbus on behalf of the Ohio 491 chapters of the American red cross, which shall use the 492 contributions for disaster readiness, preparedness, and response 493 494 programs on a statewide basis. The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 495 receives pursuant to section 4503.90 of the Revised Code to the 496 nationwide children's hospital foundation. 497 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 498 receives pursuant to section 4503.901 of the Revised Code to the 499 Ohio association for pupil transportation, which shall use the 500 money to support transportation programs, provide training to 501 school transportation professionals, and support other 502 initiatives for school transportation safety. 503 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 504 receives pursuant to section 4503.902 of the Revised Code to St. 505 Ignatius high school located in the municipal corporation of 506 Cleveland. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 507 contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 508 students. The school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to 509 pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's 510 students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and 511 emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may 512 include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving 513 techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and 514 education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug 515 abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 516 providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 517 faculty of the school to receive training in providing those 518 services. The school principal or, in the school principal's 519 discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any 520

charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those521services. The school shall ensure that any such charitable522organization is exempt from federal income taxation under523subsection 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school524shall not use the contributions it receives for any other525purpose.526

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

receives pursuant to section 4503.94 of the Revised Code to the 583 Michelle's leading star foundation, which shall use the money 584 solely to fund the rental, lease, or purchase of the simulated 585 driving curriculum of the Michelle's leading star foundation by 586 boards of education of city, exempted village, local, and joint 587 vocational school districts. 588

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 589 receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the 590 friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money 591 to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free 592 emergency medical first response throughout Israel. 593

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 594 receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the 595 Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and 596 activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the 597 city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park." 598

(C) All investment earnings of the license plate 599 contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than 600 the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall 601 distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this 602 section the investment income the fund earned the previous 603 calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an 604 entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity 605 received from the fund during the previous calendar year. 606
